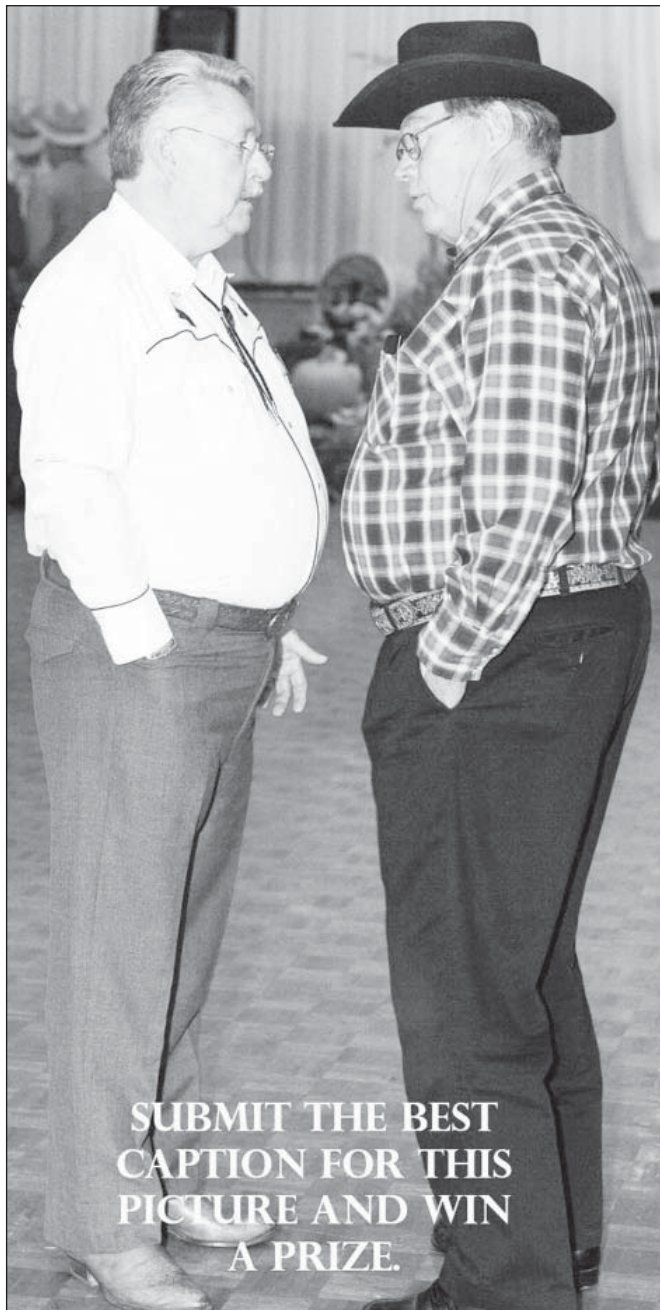

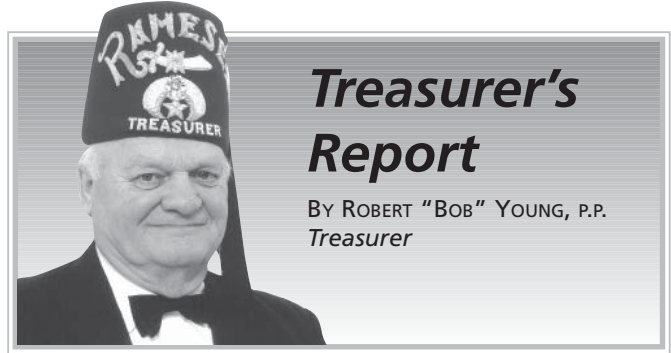

Now, back to reality, cold and the work at the Shrine Centre where everyone is welcome to view our beautiful building with its newly painted ceiling.

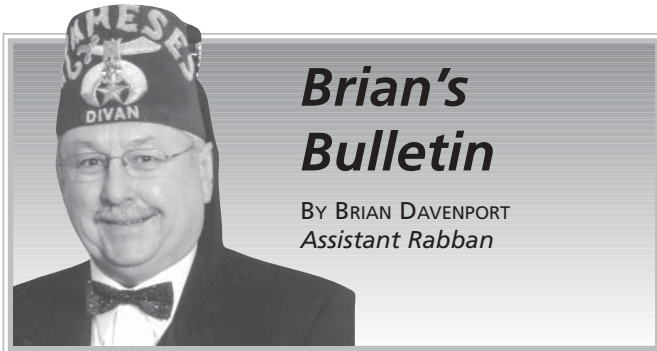

I want to say thanks to my counterparts on the Divan for helping me in so many ways on my Oriental Guide adventure this year. What a learning experience, and I thank you all so very much.

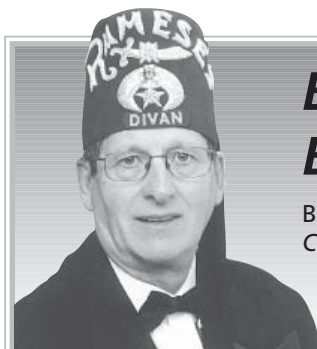
I enjoyed a great year Nobles and I am so proud and honoured to serve you. Thank you for the opportunity.

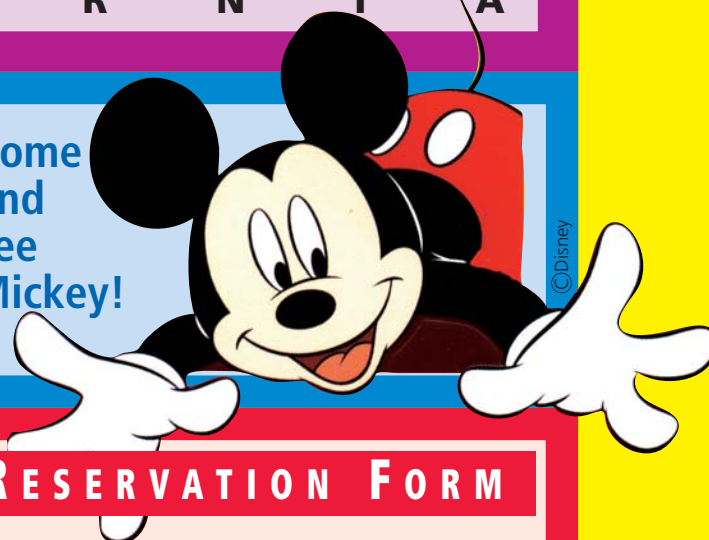

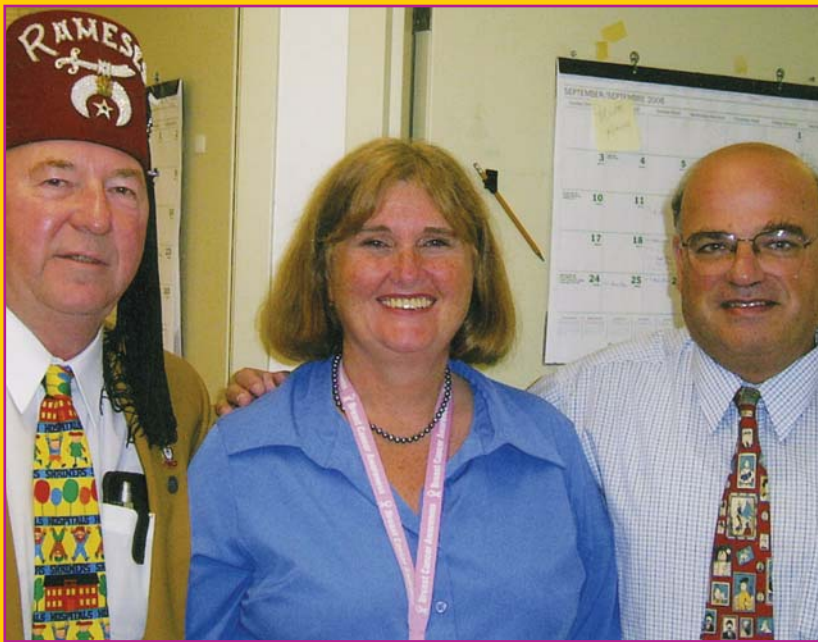

For almost 10 years, the Children's Treatment Centre has been grateful for the regular visits by Dr. Reggie Hamdy and a nurse colleague from the Shriners Hospital in Montreal. Currently Sudbury does not have an orthopedic surgeon with pediatric specialization. Sudbury and its Children's Treatment Centre has therefore been extremely grateful for this valuable visiting service within our community. Working in close collaboration with the physiotherapists of the Children's Treatment Centre, Dr. Hamdy provides specialized assessments of children with bone abnormalities associated with diagnoses such as cerebral palsy, spina bifida, muscular dystrophy, etc.

Should surgery be required, Sudbury children can receive this surgery at the Shriners Hospital in Montreal. Those families who have had the experience of being treated at this Hospital, comment on the skill of the staff and the warm and comfortable facilities within this special pediatric hospital.

The local Sudbury Shrine Club staffs all of the clinics at the Children's Treatment Centre. The Shriners greet the families and ensure that the appropriate client information is obtained. They are staunch supporters of this service and were extremely instrumental in its ongoing success.

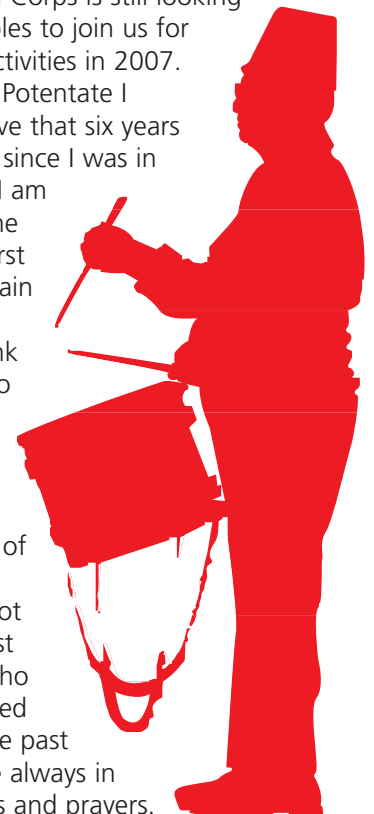
Our recent performances were at the Annual Children's Halloween Party and the Fall Ceremonial.

Patient's birthday wishes benefit Shriners Hospitals

Osteogenesis imperfecta are big words, especially for a 6-year-old. But the words are a medical term that kindergartener Leigh Dittman is not only able to easily say; she knows exactly what it means. Leigh was registered as a patient at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Tampa before she was even born. Her parents realized their baby would need orthopaedic care when technicians noticed Leigh's legs were shorter than normal during one of Ellen Dittman's sonograms. Doctors were unable to diagnose the problem before Leigh's birth but knew it was orthopaedic-related. Ellen and her husband, David, contacted the Tampa Shriners Hospital. When Leigh was born, she measured only 15.5 inches long, and doctors discovered she had broken five ribs and fractured a femur in utero. A few hours after her birth, Leigh was diagnosed with osteogenesis imperfecta (OI). The condition is commonly known as "brittle bone disease" and is characterized by bones that break easily, often from little or no apparent cause. Leigh received her first treatment at the Tampa Shriners Hospital when she was three weeks old. She now goes in every few months to receive intravenous medicine meant to increase bone density, but Leigh usually stops by the hospital at least once a month to visit her doctors and the many friends she's made there. "We love it," said Ellen. "That hospital is like our second home." In appreciation of the loving care Leigh receives at the Tampa hospital, the Dittman family began raising money for Shriners Hospitals.

"It was actually Leigh's idea," said Ellen. "She says Shriners helps her, so she wanted to help them." Beginning with Leigh's fourth birthday party in 2004, the Dittmans asked that in lieu of bringing gifts, guests donate money to Shriners Hospitals. Due to the overwhelming response from loved ones and the community, Leigh and her family decided to make it an annual fundraising event. Approximately 450 people attended Leigh's sixth birthday party on August 19, 2006. The event, which included dinner, a special video about the Tampa Shriners Hospital, a chance drawing, a silent auction and dancing, raised more than \$35,000. In total, Leigh's birthday party extravaganzas have resulted in nearly \$63,000 in donations to the Tampa Shriners Hospital. As a non-profit organization, Shriners Hospitals for Children relies on the generous donations of Shriners and the general public to carry out our mission and improve the lives of children every day. 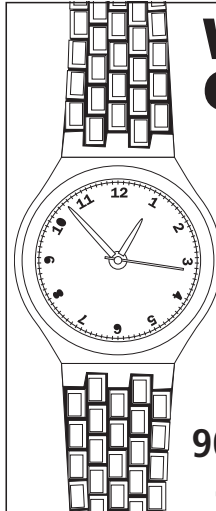

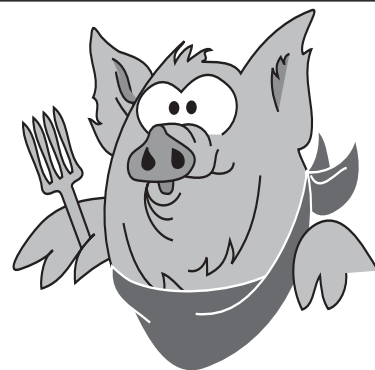

At that time he was Administrative Clerk with Metropolitan Toronto and had heard of the upcoming sale of a Fire Truck by the then Borough of Etobicoke.

Noble Zlot purchased the truck with his own funds and then he worked diligently to form the Unit.

Each new member contributed \$50 to offset the cost of the truck, licensing, paint job and other expenses. The first meeting was held in Ben's home in August 1969. Our first parade was October 3rd, 1969.

Originally the truck was built in 1937 by Bickel Seagrave Company in Woodstock, Ontario for the Forest Hill Fire Department. It had a straight 12 cylinder engine and a 60 foot hydraulic aerial ladder, one of the largest of its time.

Later the truck was sold to the Mimico Fire Dept. and then to the Etobicoke Fire Dept. In 1969 the truck was purchased by Rameses Shrine Firefighters Unit for \$500. We have since replaced the engine with a gas powered

6 cylinder RD 450 International engine and we have also refurbished the truck at least twice since then.

The Firefighter Unit attends as many Shrine Events, Parades and Community functions as possible. We have participated in events in the U.S.A. and taken our famous Fire Truck as far away as New Orleans.

In 1975 and 1989 we participated in the Shrine Imperial Session parades that were held in our home town, Toronto. As a matter of fact, we had so many members show up to ride on "Big Red" at these events that we had to make a call to the Toronto Fire Department to borrow an active Fire Truck so that all or our members could be in the parades.

In the 1980s and early 1990s the Firefighters Unit had a self controlled maximum membership of 55 proud members, plus honorary members, and we had a waiting list of Nobles anxious to become part of our esteemed Unit.

Today we have fourteen active members, two of them Honorary and Charter Members. They are our Director & Chief, Noble Fred G. Lock and Noble Alf Shenfield.

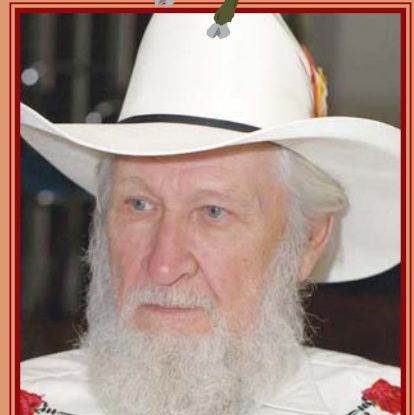


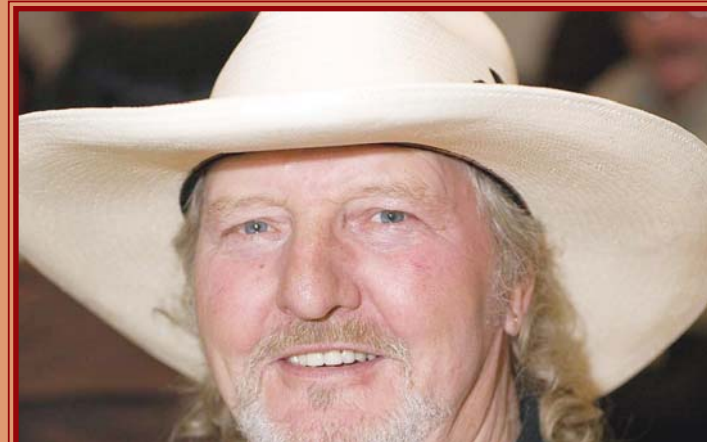
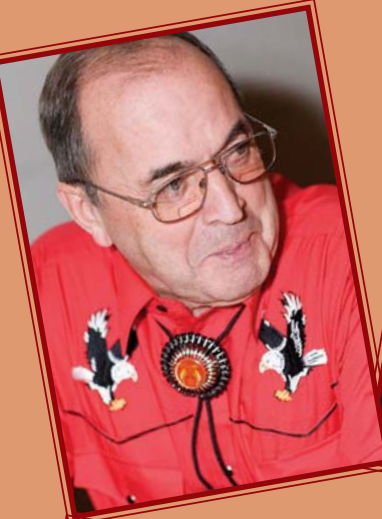
Rameses Western Dance 2006

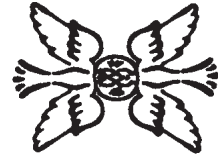

Election of Officers the Imperial Law reads:

Section 325.9 - Representatives

- (a) Single Ballot. Where a temple elects more than one Representative.
All candidates must be balloted for one written ballot.
- (b) Complete Ballot. Each member voting must vote only for the total number of representatives to be elected otherwise his ballot cannot be counted as a vote.
- (c) Majority Vote. A majority vote of those present and voting is necessary to elect each Representative.
- (d) Election. Only those candidates who receive a majority vote shall be declared elected.
- (e) Successive Ballots. Successive written ballots must then be taken in the same manner on other candidates until all Representatives are elected.
- (f) Highest Vote. If more candidates receive a majority vote than the number of Representatives to be elected, then those receiving the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected.
- (g) Void Ballot. Blank ballots are not votes.

Section 325.10 - Election Regulation

- (a) Electioneering. The printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets or other devices, by a Noble, suggesting, recommending, opposing or containing the names of the proposed candidates in the temple is prohibited.
- (b) Violation. For any violation of (a), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.
- (c) Notice. At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

Profile of an Oriental Guide

When the annual meeting takes place in January 2007, Nobles will be called upon to determine who will be chosen Oriental Guide to begin the long move through the Divan to the highest post within the Temple.

When the members of the Shrine Temple elect a Noble to the office of Oriental Guide, they are virtually starting that Noble through the Divan line on the assumption that he will prove qualified for any merit advancement to the high office of Illustrious Potentate.

Hence it is quite evident that the nominations for Oriental Guide should be based upon thorough and accurate evaluation of character, ability and interest.

A Noble can be a fellow, a hard worker and a loyal Shriner, and yet lack the basic qualifications, which make a good Potentate. Unless a Noble is fully qualified for the job, he is unfair both to himself and to this Temple in seeking the office or in permitting his fellow Nobles to support and promote his candidacy.

The normal starting point of Shrine leadership is the office of Oriental Guide. The following checklist may prove helpful in evaluating potential candidates for the Office of Oriental Guide. However, no thinking man would be so naive or presumptuous as to believe that any one Noble could possibly embody all of the virtues, talents and qualifications which are set forth in this check list for eventual evaluation of potential candidates by the voting members.

- Leadership
- Executive ability
- Business sense
- Community standing and influence
- Financially secure
- Energy and vitality
- Free to devote ample time
- Capable of building good public relations
- Good habits and moral character
- Interest in Shrinedom
- Ability to give and get cooperation

So, let's be fair, honest and wise in the all-important matter of electing to office only men who are eminently qualified for the job.

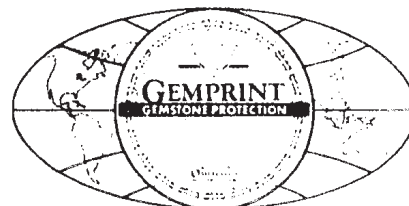
