#### Potentate's Message

hope everyone had a great Easter with family and friends. Spring has sprung and we are preparing for the Imperial Sir's visit, the Potentate's Ball, and the Erie Hospital Drivers' visit.

Mentioning Hospital Drivers, I have assigned our Oriental Guide, with the help of Mike Parkes, to design an identification badge for the Drivers. This will help the Drivers be recognized while at either the Shrine Centre or the Hospitals. I have just been informed by the Chairman of the Canadian Unit that Maureen Brennan, our Hospital Administrator, has decided to retire this summer to be with her family. We at Rameses wish her the best in the future.

You may have noticed changes in the most recent issue of the Papyrus, I assure you that while some aspects of the appearance have changed, the content and number of pages has remained the same. We have returned to the style used by the Temple in the 1990s although we have added coloured pictures in the new Papyrus. Nobles, our Papyrus cost are a loss of over \$60,000 each year and by going to this new format we can save \$25,000 to \$30,000 a year. Grand Lodge now has one issue a year and may also be looking at other ways of paying for their magazine. Please watch as we are also planning to make each issue available on our Web Page. Even now, many of you are getting summons for lodge via e-mail. Adding the Papyrus to the internet may help in the future to save on mailing costs, and would allow a whole new aspect possible future members and supporters of Rameses Shriners could surf our Web site for membership information as well as get an idea of important events. If worked properly this could allow those members that maybe, house bound to be active within the Shrine via the internet. I have talked to Mike Parkes, the editor of the Papyrus, and Ross Moffat our Chairman of our website; both are willing and ready to start the process of working together on this project by using PDF files. If you think this is out in left field, you are wrong, some Lodges and Shrine Clubs are sending out as much as 75% of their summons this way. Let's move into the future and be pro-active.

Just to remind you the Rameses Special Ladies dinner is June 4th at the Rameses Centre and we expect a full house for this event.

Added to the Rameses Spring Ceremonial week is the visit of our Grand Master of Ontario, M.W. Bro. Gary L. Atkinson on Friday June 9th, 2006 for the laying of the Cornerstone at the City of Belleville's new library at 2pm in the downtown area.

Take note that as of mid-April it would appear that due to construction, the parade at the CNE Kids' day will not take place, however, we are continuing with the rides etc., for the children.



#### Erie Hospital Report from Noble Ken Satfford

was privileged to attend the Shriners Hospital for Children Chairmen and Vice Chairmen Seminar March 23-26 at Headquarters in Tampa. It was a very uplifting experience for me, and I am even more enthused about our (that is yours and mine) Hospital system.

During the two action packed days, we had 19 PowerPoint Presentations, from 9 different areas. Without a doubt my Erie, PA counterpart, Art Smaltz and I suffered from a good deal of information overload. Let me just share a couple of the highlights with you.

Dr. Peter Armstrong, Director of Medical affairs advised that the "Cleft Lip and Palate Program" is now part of the Shrine "Core Mission". The newly developed cultured skin substitute "PermaDerm" was developed and is now available at Shriners Hospital Cincinnati Lab. At present they can produce 32 grafts per week. Cambrex Corporation will further develop and market the product commercially, while Shriners will share in the royalties.

Bill Fawcett, Controller gave a very candid and interesting overview of the "Endowment Fund". There is much confusion and misinformation concerning the endowment fund. The fund was entirely restructured May 2004. The 22 account managers were dismissed, and all of the securities were either sold or transferred. 11 new managers were hired who are "Style Specific". The joint Board of Trustees drew up a formal "Policy Statement" complete with asset allocation guidelines. The Money Managers are monitored on a quarterly basis and results compared to S&P and similar indexes.

The fund has \$7.4 billion in marketable securities (Equities 65% - Bonds 35%). As an example of diversity, the Fund has 28,000 acres of farm land producing annual income of \$3.1 million. 2,916 oil and gas wells plus 1 coal mine producing revenue of \$4.7 million. Included in the fund are literally hundreds of pieces of real estate, beneficial trusts and 740 income trusts.

These assets came down the pipeline from past bequeaths and estates, but we are told the pipeline has pretty much dried up.

With such large numbers, one could well ask, "what could we possibly have to worry about"? Well in 2005, the Endowment Fund produced \$435 million. The hospital budget for 2006 is \$645 million. Where does the shortfall of \$210 million come from? Well my friends, it comes from donations.

What I find interesting is it's wonderful to have the 8 billion dollar fund, but when we talk about it, people generally think we are a bunch of rich folk, who do not require donations, which could not be further from the truth. St Judes, a single hospital, started in 1962 by Danny Thomas raised \$250 million in donations last year, simply by demonstrating a need and not having or certainly not talking about a large Endowment Fund.

The official position is that Shriners Hospitals need to grow the Endowment Fund to \$12 billion by year 2014. I believe this could be possible with the support of: Shrine and Hospital Board Leadership, Imperial Donor Relations and Temple Donor Relations, Professional Grant Writers (7), be active in Local Donors Relations effort, participate in Community Advisory Councils and help to educate Nobles and Other supporters

Nobles and Ladies, we are part of a great organization and we can all be very proud. We have strong and capable leadership, and with your continued support we can look forward to a bright future for Shriners Hospitals for Children.
