This has bothered me for some time: WHY DO THEY LEAVE?





This is the second largest fund-raiser for your Temple







We also dumped some old furniture and made our basement rooms look more like the meeting rooms they are supposed to be.

We added two atomic clocks to the main floor. They are controlled from Colorado by radio beam and they are accurate to within one second so no need for any meeting now to have a late start.

We are also upgrading our sound system in Ram I and II. We are installing a remote antenna in the ceiling in this room which should allow us to use the tie clip microphones and hand held no cable mikes. This should be a great help to our Scottish Rite Brothers who I invite to tie into this system with their own mikes.

Of interest, I do hear rumors from time to time that the odd person is not happy with the way we run 3100 Keele Street and the bar seems to be the place where the disgruntled air their displeasure. My Brothers, if you have a problem or there is something that displeases you, it cannot possibly be fixed in the bar. You need to run it by me. I don't bite and I'm almost sure we can put things right in the twinkle of an eye. Reasonable requests we approve immediately and if the problem is of a more serious nature. I take it to our executive meeting and our Divan will decide what best to do. One way or another, your concern will be addressed and an answer given. I want everyone to be happy with what we do, so knock on my door, I'll listen.

Our Papyrus is now showing signs of acceptance and to date we are showing savings of almost \$12,000. Our Editor, Noble Mike Parkes has hired an ad sales lady on commission only and we hope to sell lots of advertising in future issues. Look out, you may be contacted.

The Fall season is now started and I'm sure your meetings are in full swing. I have one piece of advice for those of you that are running the meeting. Make it interesting, share a funny story now and again and make it fun. To those in the audience, show support, compliment a well run meeting and work as a team. As always gripers should stay at home.

Thank you all for your support this year. It is appreciated and never taken for granted. Most of all I thank every one of you for being Shriners.




obles, we are now into our fall sessions and everyone is very busy with Installations in our districts as well as getting ready to do our Club
