



would like to congratulate Noble Brian Davenport for organizing the seminars this year. I was able to attend all but one and do agree that with expertise and help of the Elected Divan the format seems to be working. I thank everyone who attended for giving of their time to make the seminars happen.

Nobles, I have just received the 2006 facts and figures and thought you might be interested. Shriners Hospitals approved 38,984 new patient applications and cared for 128,578 patients.

In 2006 Shriners Hospitals for Children provided the following:

- 251,461 radiology procedures
- 296,859 outpatient, outreach and telemedicine visits
- 61,103 orthotic and prosthetic devices
- 24,609 surgical procedures
- 412,387 physical therapy treatments
- 181,174 occupational therapy treatments

Shriners Hospital budget for 2007 is \$721 million, of which \$655 million is designated for operating expenses (including \$37 million for research) and \$66 million is earmarked for building and equipment expenditures. It has cost approximately \$8.2 billion to operate Shriners Hospitals during its 85 year history.

Your Divan traveled to Sudbury April 11th to present a \$39,000 cheque to the Botox Clinic. Our Shrine Hospital in Montreal treats patients coming from this clinic. A special thanks to the Elected Divan and the 38 Nobles from the Sudbury Shrine Club who graciously gave their time to be at the cheque presentation. This was an excellent way to put our Fez in the public as the newspaper and television reporters were present. I will also be traveling to the Erie and Boston Hospitals the week of April 16th.

On behalf of Rameses Nobility I will be presenting a cheque for \$20,000 American to each of these hospitals.

Also, earlier in March you, the Nobility, donated a cheque for \$25,000 to the Emergency Transportation Fund. This fund aids the transportation of children from Shrine Centres having difficulties raising funds for such use.

Doreen and I wish all who are under the weather a speedy and successful recovery.

We look forward to seeing you as we "Travel for Kids" during the year.

n my last report I advised you of several quite large donations we have made to our hospitals since January 6, 2007. I'm happy to report that in addition to this we gave a further \$25,000 U.S. to Imperial Sir Ralph Semb for his special projects, which by and large helps other Temples with their Hospital costs. For, believe it or not, some Shrine Temples are strapped for cash. They are not all as lucky or as financially strong as Rameses. Nobles this is your hard work, at work and I do very much appreciate your continued dedication to charitable fundraising.

Nobles I must assume that you are all aware that in March of this year the Shrine of North America came under severe criticism in the newspapers and in particular the New York Times and The Toronto Star. As is nearly always the case, they printed a distorted story and painted all Shrine Temples with a broad brush, thereby giving the general public the impression that we are less than honest.

Let me try to give you a simple explanation on how they (the newspaper) see it. I'll use round figures and stay within the rules governing fundraising. Club ABC asks permission to run a Charitable fundraiser and follows all the rules required. They make a profit of \$100 and the \$100 goes to the hospital, no if ands or buts. Club ABC next month asks permission to run a Fraternal fundraiser; again they follow all the rules and make sure the disclaimer is printed on all tickets and flyers etc. They state that this fundraiser is not tax deductible and that the profit is for Club use i.e. rent, heat, light supplies etc. Again they make \$100 profit and that goes to their general account and there is nothing wrong with this.

However what the newspaper reporter claims is that Club ABC made a \$200 profit and only gave 50% to the Hospital and that they bought liquor with their 50%. This is not an accurate assessment of what we do and more important it's just not fair.

Let me respectfully remind you that helping an old lady by cutting her grass and repairing her porch will not get in the papers, but try stealing her purse and see how fast you make the front page. Life ain't fair, but that's the way it is.

Hold your head high Nobles. Rameses gave well over one million dollars to the Shrine Hospitals last year and so far to date this year as I write April 13, 2007 we have given well over \$350,000 to our one and only charity Shriners Hospital for Children. My books are open to anyone who wishes to check us out, so don't let anyone put you down.

I sent a three page report on this subject to every Club President and Secretary, so I trust all Club and Unit members are by now aware of this subject, as all correspondence must be read out at your meetings.

I believe that if in fact any Shriner is convicted of the misappropriation of Temple funds he should be dealt with under the law of the land.

Our guidelines clearly state that charitable money belongs to the Shrine Hospital and we in Rameses comply, not one dime of charitable money is used for anything other than that which is required for the children in our care.

We use fraternally raised money to pay building expenses, i.e. heat, light, power, maintenance, staff wages, insurance and a host of other items just too many to list. However if you want

more give me a call and I'll read them out to you, no warning necessary.

Rameses has at present 37 Clubs, 21 Temple Units and a total of 4,600 members. Thankfully most of the groups are happy and solvent with the Nobles working in harmony with each other. Regrettably a very few of our Clubs and Units are dealing with discord and in some cases egos that are way out of control. Don't ever ask me what group I'm referring to because that I will not divulge. It deeply distresses your Divan that such problems exist



and the last thing we want to do is wind up in the middle of the verbal confrontation, regrettably sometimes we do and usually to our detriment.

Noble President you are in charge of your Club and you are responsible for making sure it runs smoothly. At the first sign of trouble you must nip it in the bud. You should bring the confrontational Nobles together and insist on a resolution, failure to do so will weigh heavily on your members and before you know it your Club will be split down the middle. Everyone has an ego, keeping it in check is the result we all must try for. Let us never forget that we are Masons first, then Shriners, let us not lose sight of our many obligations.

As always I'm here to help you if I can. Your questions are important to me so don't hesitate to call. Most important if you hear a rumor and you are not sure about it, call me and I'll give you the straight goods every time.

Thanks for your support and thank you for being a Rameses Shriner. God Bless one and all.


s I sit down to write this message the weather is finally starting to get warm and the grass is starting to get green. It made me remember that many things change continually.



A ghost town with a Shriner presence

ave you ever visited Las Vegas on one of those 3 night, 4 day excursions offered by the various travel companies? Well, if you plan on going some time in the future, for the more adventurous among us, you might want to make a day trip to Ryolite, the Ghost Town.

Located about 125 miles north of Las Vegas, on the edge of Death Valley, Ryolite, has not only an interesting past, but as the picture shows, a past with a Shriner presence, a Shriner parade held in the early 1900s.


If you have Internet connection, you can find out more about Ryolite by visiting some of the many sites dedicated to this interesting town, including http://www.nps.gov/archive/deva/rhyolite.htm and http://www.rhyolitesite.com/ which apart from listing the movies made there, goes into a great deal of history about the town, including many old pictures. For those of you that do not have Internet, please read on.

My first visit to Ryolite was back in 1998 which, coincidentally was my first full year as a Shriner. You can imagine my surprise when I came across the plaque prominently displayed across the street from the bank building which is shown in the picture. There was no

date on the picture but it most probably was taken around 1910. There are

are several buildings which survive in

some form, including the Schoolhouse, Bank, Dry Goods Store, Railway Station, Jail, and Whorehouse, which I do not believe was the "best" in Nevada. There is also an old mine, which until a few years ago you could enter. Unfortunately now there is a chain link fence preventing that adventure. The main surviving attraction, which has been recently restored is the Bottle House. Why is it called the Bottle House, well, believe it or not, it's made out of bottles, used ones, of course. I guess back in the early 1900's with a population close to 8,000 Ryolite had, among other things, need of a great deal of liquid refreshment and with all those empty bottles laying around an enterprising person put them to good use. Located just out of town, which you pass on the way in, is a small artists colony which is also worth a visit. Instead of returning to Las Vegas back down 95, return through Death Valley, it's slower but well worth it. Enjoy!

ith wide, curious eyes, Jenna Fournier looks around at all the people gathered in the gymnasium at St. Jerome School. The cameras in particular seem to grab her attention.

Jenna, 5, is an example of what Botox can do for children with spastic cerebral palsy. "Botox, for us, is a miracle drug," says her mom, Jennifer Collin. "So, we're hoping it lasts a long, long time." The little girl turns her head toward her mother and leans in. Her forehead rests on her mom's and their noses touch.

A slight smile appears on Jenna's face. "If it wasn't for the Botox, she'd probably be in a wheelchair right now," says Collin. "She would

not be independent the way she is. And she's walking with canes now, too. In the past two years, she went from not walking with a walker, to running with a walker, to walking."

"Children's Treatment Centre clinic manager Sally Spence says that when she was a practicing physiotherapist, a child like Jenna would have already had at least one surgery to lengthen her tendons. Spence says Botox helps relax the muscle fibres, which reduces spasticity. After the injections, Jenna goes through casting to get the range of motion back, and then her parents and physiotherapists do exercises with her.

"She may only need one operation in her lifetime now instead of four," says Spence. "It's not a cure - cerebral palsy is not curable per se - but it is another approach.

It's a less invasive approach and less scary for the families."

Jenna is not the only child in the Sudbury area to benefit from the Botox treatments. Spence says 90 local children received the injections last year and hundreds have received treatment since the clinic launched four years ago.

The Rameses Shriners have paid for the Botox Clinic and this year is no exception. Robert Whitmarsh, the Potentate of the Rameses Shriners in Toronto, presented a cheque for \$39,210.36 to Spence.

"Being afforded the opportunity to actually see how the children improve with the care that we help provide is truly the most rewarding part of being a Shriner," says Whitmarsh.

"They're great guys," gushes Spence.






