



The recent criticism of the Shrine by the newspapers makes the above modus operandi an absolute must and I'm sorry if you feel we are being picky, but sincerely Nobles, we don't have a choice.

Finally, if your fundraising ticket, flyer or promotional paperwork uses the words Hospital or Kids, it's a Charitable Fundraiser. NO EXCEPTIONS.

I thank you for your support and understanding. Let's all just keep doing it right, that way we can all sleep soundly each night.

The Spring Ceremonial for 2007 is only just a happy memory now but from our point of view it was a very successful venture with 87 candidates on Rameses books now as full fledged Shriners. We welcome every one of you and trust that by now you are having fun as a Shrine Mason.

The Kingston District Shrine Club did a superb job of hosting this event and my thanks to every one of you for your dedicated support of Rameses. I hesitate to use names for fear I should forget someone, however I will mention Noble Ambassador Emeritus Eric Welbanks who served as Director General and is directly responsible for the success of this project. A great job Noble Eric and a big thank you to you and your team of dedicated Nobles and Ladies.

It won't be long before we start into the elections for 2008 and I wish to remind you all of an offer we made to all Units and Clubs in 2006, that if you wished we

would do both the election and installation of your Unit or Club at the same time. The advantages are only one trip for everyone. Usually in very bad weather, obviously a substantial cost saving for both Temple and Club, officers elect automatically take office the minute the new Illustrious Potentate is installed on January 5th, 2008. The first time we did this, only two Clubs opted for this idea; however, we presently have quite a few Units and Clubs requesting this for the coming election night. If your Club or Unit wishes to do it this way, please call me as soon as possible so I can set up a working schedule. This is not a must. It's an option and it's your choice, however it does make a lot of sense and we will still make that extra visit to you, but in the good weather.

The Imperial Session in Anaheim California was reasonably well attended and I thank everyone who showed support for Rameses. The Legislation was fairly routine and no one was surprised by the end result. One section that was of interest to us was Resolution 11 on the call. This was, of course, another try at getting the Canadian Shrine Hospital moved to London, Ontario after which the Montreal Hospital would be closed.

Let me say for the record that I would like to see this happen and I supported this move in 2005 in Baltimore with passion and due diligence, regrettably it failed and I decided then that the kids in our care were much more important than the location of the hospital and I made a conscious decision to put the loss behind me and concentrate on repairing broken bodies.

The decision reached in Anaheim was so predictable that I was surprised that so much time was wasted on it and it should be pointed out that Rameses was not included in the drive to relocate, this was solely a Mocha Shrine resolution and like all other Canadian Temples, we were privy only to the rumors until one week before we went to Anaheim.

The motion was presented and with 1095 voting members present, the result was as follows; 265 for the move, 830 against and if that's not bad enough, the motion required a two thirds majority to pass. As you can see, this is not going to happen anytime soon so let's put it behind us and move on. I think it's fair to say that the Potentate of Philae Temple in Nova Scotia who spoke against the move, carried the day. He was dynamic in his presentation and had the representatives in the palm of his hand from the first statement out of his mouth.

By the time you read this, it will be September and the fall activities will be well underway and as we bend to the task of our Shrine duties, let us all keep a few simple resolutions in mind.

- 1. Meetings must be businesslike but enjoyable. Fun and good fellowship should be at the top of your list.
  - 2. Membership is the lifeblood of our organization

On the bus trip to Springfield everyone was entertained with a selection of great movies and challenging quizzes to pass the time. There was no trouble crossing the border either going or on the return trip Sunday afternoon, as nobody over-spent his or her travel allowance. The Oasis did a steady business both ways, as well as the hospitality room on the Friday and Saturday nights.

On Saturday morning we boarded the bus for the short trip to the Springfield Shrine Hospital. The members of the Melha Shrine Director's Staff greeted us with great enthusiasm and they did a magnificent job being our hospital tour guides.

Firstly, Mr. Mark Niederpruem, the Hospital Administrator, gave a brief overview of the Springfield Hospital in the Conference Room and showed a short film about the Hospital's history, the building of the current facility and the procedures and treatments that are administered to our children.

The Nobles and Ladies were then broken into smaller groups and given a guided tour by the Nobles from Melha Shrine, followed by a delicious lunch in the cafeteria. After lunch, the group presented a cheque for US\$500 to the Hospital on behalf of the Nobles and Ladies from Rameses.

After Lunch, Noble Al "Poppie" Surpenant and his lovely wife gave us a bus tour of Springfield, Massachusetts. The tour ended at the Melha Shrine Temple where a fundraising auction sale had just finished. 














## Spring Ceremonial 2007-Kingston



Even though our Club is large in terms of membership, the morale is excellent and many of our Shriners and their ladies consider it as another happy family.





In closing, come celebrate 2008 Rameses Spring Ceremonial in Brampton, Ontario on June 5-8.


osh, as the summer moves along I'm always so pleased to see you Nobles at all the different functions I attend.

#### Canada's "Mister Rowing"

oble Claude Saunders passed away during the first week of May 2007, in his 96th year. A dedicated Shriner and member of our Oriental Band, Claude continued to participate fully in all our activities, up until his 93rd year. At that time, unfortunately, he was forced to seek assisted living accommodations due to poor health.

A giant of a man, his accomplishments were legendary, having been awarded Canada's highest honour, The Order of Canada and obtaining a berth in Canada's Sports Hall of Fame. He was recognized as a progressive and omnipotent presence in Canadian rowing, and represented Canada in the men's heavy eights during both the 1936 and 1948 Olympics. During the 1936 games in Berlin, the German Chancellor, Adolph Hitler, shook his hand as he stepped out of the Canadian boat.

He brought that same kind of attention and passion to his job at Stelco, where he made important improvements in workplace safety. Indeed, their company slogan could well be, "Our product is steel but our strength is Shriners", based on dedicated employees like Claude and

the amount of Steel workers that are proud members of the Hamilton Shrine Club.

In spite of his accomplishments, Claude was a very humble and dedicated man. Predeceased by his wife, Florence, he is survived by children Claude, Lois, and Janice as well as several grandchildren.



# Elephant rides not only for our kids


#### RAMOCA SHRINE CLUB





#### Erie Hospital Report

#### BY NOBLE KEN STAFFORD

In my February report, I talked about physician shortages and I have to report the situation has not improved.

Dr. Peter Armstrong our Chief Medical Officer in Tampa has reported that as at the end of the 1st quarter our current vacancy list for full and part time positions is as follows:

Erie -2 Pediatric Orthopaedic Surgeons Tampa -2 Pediatric Orthopaedic Surgeons

-1 Anesthesiologist

Houston -1 Pediatric Orthopaedic Surgeon Philadelphia -2.5 Pediatric Orthopaedic Surgeons N. California -2 Pediatric Orthopaedic Surgeons Shreveport -1 Pediatric Orthopaedic Surgeon

Dr. Armstrong is aware of another 3-5 of our physicians that are currently being actively recruited.

Imp. Sir Ralph Semb Chairman of the Board of Trustees reported last month: "The Joint Boards adopted the Strategic Plan that the committee was working on for the past year. It was a giant task and we will now ask that the hospitals develop their own strategic plan based upon the new system strategies, vision and values.

We have also adopted a "Vision Statement" and two new core values:

Shriners Hospitals for Children will be the unquestioned leader, nationally and internationally, in caring for children and advancing the field in its specialty areas. (The vision states SHC's aspirations for the future and sets high-level direction for the organization)

The following two core values, Innovation and Stewardship, were incorporated to better support the emerging vision.

**Innovation:** Continuously seek to improve the services we provide and be a leader in specialty pediatric health care.

**Stewardship:** Responsibly manage and apply our resources to maximize the benefit to our patients, their families, employees, fraternity members, and donors."

So what does all of this mean to SHC Erie?

The facts are that the two young surgeons we lost in the past year went to University of Alabama Medical Center and to Loma Linda Medical Center in California. These are children's hospitals with all of the infrastructure like Pediatric Intensive Care Units, subspecialties like pediatric anesthesiologists, neurologists, urologists etc. in house and all of the latest digital imaging and diagnostic equipment.

Lack of advanced pediatric care in Erie is by far the most crucial issue facing our hospital.

Following our discussions with the local hospitals, it is clear that our Erie hospital must partner with one or more of the regional children's hospitals to provide the necessary infrastructure.

The Erie Board of Governors approved this initiative and discussion will commence immediately with the following hospitals:

- a. Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh of UPMC
- b. Rainbow Babies & Children's Hospital
- c. Cleveland Clinic
- d. Women and Children's Hospital of Buffalo

Of course, all of the activities require the approval of the Joint Boards and must be consistent with the current Strategic Plan.

We would expect the Erie hospital to continue as an excellent rehabilitation centre doing clinics and minor outpatient surgeries.

Certainly all of your support and encouragement is appreciated in these somewhat difficult times.





#### Shrine Parade Regulations

Nobles, be advised that due to a misunderstanding of instructions, some ladies took part in the parade in Lindsay, Ontario on July 28th, 2007. This is contrary to General Order No. 1 and Imperial Bylaws and will not be allowed in any future parade, civic or otherwise.

Please note the following.

#### SHRINE PARADE REGULATIONS

- 1. **Non-Shriners.** Other than the police escort, dignitaries and distinguished guests, only Shriners are permitted in Shrine parades.
- 12. **Enforcement.** Parade marshals shall enforce all Shrine parade regulations and they shall report any violators to the Potentate of his Temple. Failure on the part of a Temple Potentate to cooperate with parade marshals shall be reported in writing.
- 13. **Potentate Responsibility.** Each Potentate is personally responsible and accountable for knowingly permitting any violation of parade regulations. Temple Potentates are required to review parade regulations with their marshal, the Parade Marshal, and their Unit head.

#### **CIVIC PARADES**

Units and/or Clubs that participate in non-Shrine parades may do so only with approval from their Potentate. Should they be requested to participate in the jurisdiction of another temple, they will also need the permission of the Potentate of that Temple. Practice good Shrine etiquette when parading in non-Shrine parades and follow the protocol set up by the host sponsor of the parade.

Non-Shriners are not permitted to participate in Shrine Units and/or Clubs in civic parades.

#### **TEMPLE GOVERNANCE**

1. **Potentate:** The Potentate of each temple is reminded of his individual official responsibility for the operation of the Temple in accordance with the law of the land, Shrine law and the Temple bylaws. He is admonished to carefully review all provision of Shrine law including all provision of this General Order.

#### **ARTICLE 36**

Temple Units

#### § 336.1 Control by Potentate.

The Units are a part of the working corps of the Temple and are under the control of the Potentate and must be composed wholly of Nobles.

#### § 336.2 Public Exhibitions.

- (a) **Shriners Only.** In parades at Temples at annual sessions of The Imperial Council or in parades or public exhibitions under the auspices of Temples or Shrine associations, only Nobles shall participate.
- (b) **Potentate Approval.** No Temple Unit is permitted to participate in a parade or public exhibition without the express approval of the Potentate.
- (c) **Outside of Jurisdiction Approval.** Public appearances by Units are under the auspices of the Temple with which they are identified and are not permitted in any place outside the Temple's jurisdiction except with the consent of the Potentate of the Temple having jurisdiction.
- (d) **No Compensation.** Units and their members are prohibited from accepting any reward or compensation for participating in parades and exhibitions.

#### § 335.10 Female Organizations.

- (a) **Prohibition.** A Temple may not organize, or sponsor, a female unit or any uniformed body of women.
- (b) § 336.2. A Temple may not organize, or sponsor, any body of women, or men and women, purporting to be an organization connected with the Order composed of Nobles and female relatives or requiring such relationship as the prerequisite for membership in the organization.
- § 335.14 Compliance with Shrine Law. A temple or Noble may not violate Shrine Law.
