Lessons from the Shriners

Those guys in the funny hats make possible free hospital care for children

You hear a lot from the cup-is-halfempty crowd these days about the U.S. healthcare system, and certainly there is a lot to be concerned about. The ranks of the uninsured continue to grow, malpractice is driving some good doctors out of medicine and patient safety continues to be a challenge in the nation's hospitals.

Personally, however, I find the negativity a little relentless, when there are so many positives about healthcare that merit attention.

One of these is the men in the funny hats. I refer to the Shriners, also known (though mostly among themselves) as the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine. Most people, including many health professionals, are only vaguely aware that the Shriners support medically-related charities, but they can teach us much about alternative methods of healthcare delivery.

Today's Shriners are not privy to the secrets of working in stone, as were their ancient ancestors, who were Freemasons. In fact, they are not tied to any particular profession,

denomination or even religion. A general belief in a supreme being is the only theological litmus test prospective members have to pass.

As for why Shriners wear strange hats or drive comically small cars in parades — let's just

say that every organization needs its symbols and pageantry. Despite their enigmatic rituals, Shriners are not members of a secret society, and contrary to rumor they do not sell Shrinerelated insurance products.

Here's what the Shriners really do — and what they deserve to be better known for: Shriners maintain 22 hospitals for children located throughout the U.S., Canada and Mexico. Eighteen of these hospitals specialize in orthopedics, three specialize in burn care and one specializes in burn, spinal and orthopedic care.

These hospitals provide state-of-the-art medical care to children with orthopedic deformities, diseases or injuries, such as clubfoot, scoliosis and the orthopedic problems caused by cerebral palsy. In addition, some of the hospitals treat patients with "healed" burns who need reconstructive surgery or rehabilitation.

In addition, Shriners Hospitals for Children is actively engaged in research, searching for the cures and improved treatments of childhood diseases and burn injuries. Major players in pediatric medical research, they have a combined annual research budget of \$28 million for 2005.

The 2005 research program includes 135 projects concentrated

at five of the orthopedic hospitals and the four burn hospitals. Projects include developing a model to test treatments for Legg-Perthes disease, a degenerative disorder of the hip joint, and an effort to determine the specific cause of a genetic form of dwarfism.

In addition, researchers at the Tampa Shriners Hospital have developed a new biomaterial for tendon and ligament reconstruction that may significantly reduce surgical recovery time. One of the most exciting projects is a burn treatment program to grow a cultured skin substitute that could increase the survival rate of those with severe burns — even patients with a 90 percent total body surface injury.

Shriners Hospitals are also major teaching centers and affiliated with some of the top medical colleges and universities in the country. The hospitals have cured or substantially helped more than 770,000 children over the past 80 years. This year, Shriners Hospitals will provide about \$600 million in medical care to children, or about \$1.7 million per day.

Besides state-of-the-art care, research and teaching, what characterizes Shriners Hospitals? Since 1922, when the first Shriners Hospital was founded in Louisiana, treatment has been provided free. That's right — free care for all who are admitted based on medical need. Children from infancy to their 18th birthday are eligible for admission if treatment would be beneficial. No insurance money or government funds are used for any medical care or services provided by Shriners Hospitals.

When it comes to indigent care today, health professionals are indoctrinated to think that government programs such as Medicaid or community-run indigent-care programs are the only options available to pay for services for those in need. Both physicians and hospitals often overlook alternatives like the Shriners because they are so conditioned to rely on government-funded programs for assistance. The Shriners


show that there is another way.

Their hospitals are funded by gifts, bequests and contributions; an annual hospital assessment paid by every Shriner; and charitable fundraising events such as the Shriners Circus. The Shriners show us that with a high degree of commitment, private citizens still can find solutions to

societal problems that don't depend on government largess.

Which brings me back to the funny hats. Shriners wear them proudly at events and certainly aren't above cramming themselves into miniature cars or dressing in flowing robes if it boosts participation or donations. But don't let the somewhat retro trappings of a fraternal organization fool you. The Shriners are cutting edge when it comes to providing healthcare with a conscience. As a healthcare professional (and non-Shriner) I honor what they do and hope to see their example both better known and better emulated.



An open letter from the Chairman of the Board of Directors

Happy New Year to each of you, and congratulations to all the new Divan officers throughout Shrinedom.

Since "We are Family," I want to personally thank everyone for all the prayers you have offered for my wife, Helen, over these past six-and-a-half years. They were answered, and she did experience several miracles.

January started out with a bang... the West team beat the East again in the 83rd annual East-West Shrine Game, which was held in Houston on Jan. 19. We had a record number of Past Potentates and other dignitaries attend the Hall of Fame brunch the morning of the game. We hope you will help us increase that number even more next year.

The night before the Game, six new members were added to the East-West Shrine Game Hall of Fame: Dave Butz, Carl Eller, Forrest Gregg, E.J. Holub, Lenny Moore and Larry Wilson. Each of these athletes gave an inspiring speech to the players at the Hall of Fame Banquet. The message of each speech was essentially the same: one of the greatest experiences in their lives was being able to play in the East-West Shrine Game and to visit one of the Shriners Hospitals and interact with the children.

The speakers also reminded everyone in attendance that generalizations, including those about young people, can be unfair since they tend to lump people together indiscriminately. These young football players represent a new generation and are decent, respectable, hard-working men. After commending the younger players, the speakers then reminded them that while life is an experience to be enjoyed personally, it is also important to care for and have a concern for others. And, if fame should be part of one's life, fame comes with responsibilities - both personally and professionally.

Although the speakers' remarks were primarily directed to the young football players in the audience, I felt that they just as easily could have been talking to everyone in North America. We should all give back, respect one another and love our God and our country.

As I noted above, the Game was great if you were rooting for the West (it's the third year in a row they have won) and not so good if you were an Easterner. However, as Tommy Rousseau, chairman of the Imperial Photography Committee said, "Who won the game? The Shriners kids did!"

The East-West Shrine Game was followed by the SHC Leadership Conference at the Houston Marriott West Side, Sunday through Tuesday. All of the hospital Board chairmen and vice-chairmen, chiefs of staff, hospital administrators and the directors of patient care services, as well as leadership from headquarters, were in attendance. They worked to develop some action items for the SHC strategic plan. During the meeting, it was evident that everyone (Shriners, doctors, nurses and administrators) is beginning to realize change must come if Shriners Hospitals for Children is to thrive into the next millennium. The main focus is two-fold: the desire to continue treating the children who need our help, and the awareness that we may have to change our model of health care delivery in order to treat more children in the future.

There was a strong recognition that the field of medicine and medical care is undergoing great changes, and SHC had better keep up for the benefit of future generations. We are all going to have to justify our spending since the projected expenditures are above our long-term financial capabilities. The attendees stated they felt the new marketing and branding initiatives were working and need to be expanded (this is currently in the development stage at headquarters).

Upon reflection, some people may think that we are just "spinning our wheels;" however, I have seen a marked change in the interaction of this leadership group over my 11-year term on the board. Confrontation has disappeared. In its place is a spirit of cooperation and "how can we get this job done?" Everyone present felt this was a very good seminar and believe it should be held annually.

On the fraternal side, I am going to begin traveling again and hope to meet many of you in person. Once again, this year all our leadership is focusing on membership. If we are going to remain a viable organization, we must increase the overall membership. As our numbers decrease, more and more Temples are finding that they can no longer afford the center that was built years ago when their numbers were double or triple what they are today. Again, no one likes to hear reality, but leaders at those Temples are facing big change; for example, moving from that large facility to one they can afford. Motions were made by Nobles Al Poolton and Bob Gilbert to forward membership fees to the International Association of Legions of Honour. Yearly elections were held with new Commanders appointed as follows: 8 October 1998 - Noble Ernie Watthey; 19 January 1999 - Noble Robert Gilbert; 21 January 2000 - Noble Bill Gerhart; 10 January 2001 - Noble Bill Gerhart.

An Emergency Meeting was held on 7 February 2002 where it was announced that the Legion of Honour Unit must be a Unit of Rameses Temple vice a unit of the Waubuno Shrine Club. Noble William Gerhart was elected as the new Commander of the Rameses Legion of Honour Unit. During the following years new Commanders were elected as follows: November 2002 - Noble Ernie Watthey; November 2003 - Noble Stephen D. Shirk; November 2004 - Noble Gordon Culbert; November 2005 - Noble Russell McFarland; November 2006 - Noble Ernie Watthey; October 2007 - Noble Peter Penner.

The purpose of the Rameses Legion of Honour Unit is to bind all eligible servicemen, past and present, of Rameses Temple into a single Unit of comradeship and service. It holds sacred and perpetuates the memory of those who made the supreme sacrifice in the service of their country. The Unit has cultivated a spirit of comradeship with and among all Masonic and Shrine organizations, both domestic and international. Our primary aim is to support and assist the Illustrious Potentate and Divan of Rameses Temple in advancing the best interests of the Temple. We intend to encourage Nobles of Rameses Temple, if eligible, to join the Rameses Temple Legion of Honour Unit.

This Unit is a uniformed body of Rameses Temple, and as a marching Unit, guards the Colours and acts as official escort to the Illustrious Potentate when requested.

The objectives of this Unit are: To foster a Spirit of Patriotism, Love of Country and Flag; To perpetuate the memory of our Comrades in Arms who made the Supreme Sacrifice by giving their lives for their country while members of the Armed Forces; To devote our efforts as individuals, and Legion of Honour Units to strive for an increase in Friendship and Cooperation between our Legion of Honour Unit and other Units of the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine (A.A.O.N.M.S.).

For membership in this Unit all members of the Temple Unit must have received an Honourable Discharge, released from active duty under honourable conditions or satisfactory Certificate of Honourable Service from his last service from the Armed Forces of his country, or produce evidence that he is presently serving honourably in the Armed Forces of his country at the time of his application. The phrase Armed Forces of his country shall be interpreted to include only those military forces as defined by the government of that country, and which would be considered veterans upon completion of their tour of duty.

An Honourary Membership may be granted for a Noble who may not be eligible for regular membership but the Unit would like to honour or pay tribute to i.e. Potentate, Past Potentate, Director of Units, Club Presidents or Nobles who have achieved a high honour within the Temple. These Nobles may be presented certificates, time-limited dues cards, etc. However, Honourary Members may not wear the Legion of Honour medallion, pay dues or hold any Legion office.

Nobles who are members of Policing Services such as the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Ontario Provincial Police, City Police, etc. may be considered for membership in the Legion of Honour Unit if they can prove that they were performing policing duties in a theatre of action as employed by the Canadian Government Department of National Defense

Platoons have been established in locations throughout the region of responsibility governed by Rameses Temple. A Platoon must consist of a minimum of seven (7) Unit members. Unit members elect a Platoon Lieutenant that must be approved by the Unit Executive. Platoon Lieutenants are active voting members of the Unit Executive. Currently we have Platoons in Parry Sound (Waubuno), Orillia, Collingwood (Manito), Belleville, and most recently Kingston.

The Rameses Shriners Legion of Honour Unit is actively looking for new members to join our ranks. Membership fees are \$15 per year or a lifetime membership is \$100.

Two general meetings will be held annually as a Unit at the Spring Ceremonial and election at our fall ceremonial of each year at a location as designated by the Commander. Platoons will hold their meetings throughout the remainder of the year at the direction of the Platoon Lieutenants. LOH Nobles are encouraged to attend the Banner exchanges in January, Wreath Laying ceremonies in Ottawa in May, participate as a Unit at the Spring Ceremonials, and attend other official Unit functions at the request of the Commander. Please contact the Commander or any member of the LOH if you would be interested in becoming a member or if you would like to form a Platoon in your area.


