Nobles of Fame, Distinction and Honour

t has taken me some time to come up with a Noble to present as my final story. I had thought that I would write about such notable Nobles as Roy Rogers, Gene Autry, Red Skelton, General Douglas MacArthur, Clark Gable or Buffalo Bill, aka William Cody. Then I looked up from my computer and noticed the two statues sitting on my desk, statues, which I believe to be of the greatest comedy team of all times, Laurel and Hardy. Stan Laurel was a Mason and Oliver Hardy took the extra step in becoming a Shriner.

Oliver Hardy was born, Norvell Hardy, January 18, 1892 in Harlem, Georgia. When he started working in the new medium of motion pictures and to honour his dad, he took his father's first name and became Oliver Norvell Hardy. His father fought for the Confederacy during the Civil war and was wounded at the Battle of Antietam, September 17, 1862 the bloodiest day in American history. He died when his son was less than a year old.

His first movie was "Outwitting Dad" and was billed as O. N.

Hardy and by 1915 had made 50 one reel films in the Jacksonville, Florida area. In

1917 he moved to Los Angeles and worked freelance for several Hollywood studios. Later that year

fate brought him to star in a movie called "The Lucky Dog" also starring a young British comedian named Stan Laurel. Oliver Hardy played the part of robber, trying to stick up Laurels character. Although the meeting had taken place they did not come together for another project for several years.

Between 1918 and 1923 Oliver made more than 40 films, mostly playing the heavy, due to his 6 foot 1 inch frame and weighing 300 lbs. In 1924 Hardy began working at Hal Roach Studios with the "Our Gang" films. Stan Laurel was also at the same studio and in 1927 Laurel and Hardy began

sharing screen time together in "Slipping Wives", "Duck Soup" and "With Love and Hisses". Roach Studio's supervising director, Leo McCarey, realized the audience reaction to the two and began intentionally teaming them together, leading to the start of the Laurel and Hardy series late that year.

One of their films, "The Music Box" in 1932 won them an Academy Award for best short film. It was to be their only such award.



In 1941 their films began to decline in quality. They left Roach Studios and began making films for 20th Century Fox and later MGM. Although financially better off, they had very little artistic control at the large studios and the films lacked the very qualities that had made Laurel and Hardy worldwide names.

In 1947 they went on a six week tour of Great Britain and were mobbed wherever they went. The tour was lengthened to include engagements in Scandinavia, Belgium, France and a Royal Command Performance for King George VI and Queen Elizabeth.

In 1949, Hardy's friend, John Wayne, asked him to play a supporting role in "The Fighting Kentuckian". At first hesitant, thinking that the public might think that the team had broken up, he finally accepted the role at the insistence of Laurel.

In 1950/1 Laurel and Hardy made their final film, "Atol K" aka "Utopia". Both suffered serious physical illness during the filming. In 1955 the pair had contracted with Hal Roach Jr to produce a series of TV shows based on the Mother Goose fables. Unfortunately this was not to be. Laurel suffered a stroke requiring a lengthy convalescence and Hardy had a heart attack and stroke later that year, from which he never physically recovered.

If you get a chance try to see the movie "Sons of the Desert" made in 1933 which is takeoff on the Shriners. I must admit my favourite is "The March of the Wooden Soldiers" which sometimes is shown around Christmas. I try never to miss a showing.

Oliver Hardy died August 7, 1957 aged 65 and is buried in the Masonic Garden of Valhalla Memorial Park Cemetery in North Hollywood.

Stan Laurel died February 23, 1965, several days after suffering a heart attack. Just minutes before death, Laurel told his nurse he would not mind going skiing. Somewhat taken back the nurse replied that she was not aware that he was a skier. "I'm not" he said "I'd rather be doing that than have all these needles stuck in me". Laurel wrote his own epitaph; "If anyone at my funeral has a long face. I'll never speak to him again". A comic to the end. Stan Laurel is buried at Forest Lawn, Hollywood Hills Cemetery, Los Angeles.

During a trip to Los Angeles several years ago, I bought one of those maps to the stars homes. My first stop was the former home of Stan Laurel.
