Recorder's Message

t's April 8th, as I write my report to you and I'll start by briefly commenting on some of the things we are dealing with at the present time.

First and probably most important, is that our Petro-Canada project is underway and all we need to do to make this the success it can easily be, is to pick up our free Shrine Petro-Card then start buying Petro-Canada Fuel.

Let me give you some simple arithmetic. We have been given 70,000 cards. Each card will generate \$40 for the Shrine. Now all you have to do is multiply 70,000 times \$40 and we have \$2,800.000 of which we keep 75 percent. The good part is you don't have to invest one cent in the project. OK Nobles, what are you waiting for? Note, I personally took 50 cards on April 2nd and as of April 7th; I had given out 33 of those cards to family and friends. By the time you read this, I hope to have given out at least 100 cards. You can do the same, just contact our Assistant Rabban Jim McKinney who is the Chairman of this event.

Some of you may have heard that the Shrine of North America is having problems maintaining our 22 hospitals and it's no secret to us that we are spending more money than we take in. Sadly, I can confirm that this is correct and to cut a long story short, the representatives for all 191 Shrine Temples will be voting on a motion to close a total of six hospitals. The statement from Shrine Headquarters in Tampa is, "close six hospitals now or we will be forced to shut down our philanthropy completely in five or six years time".

I do not at this time wish to speculate on this bad news but after our visit to San Antonia in July, I will give you a complete report on the outcome of this serious business. In the meantime let us all do our bit for the children in our care and at the same time keep our fingers crossed that the serious businessmen in our Shrine make the right decisions for not only our survival but in fact, a resurgence in the economy and our membership.

Twice in the past couple of years I have gone back in time to bring you some items that may be of interest and this time we will start at 1930 and the 56th Imperial Session in Toronto. That's the year the Peace Monument was dedicated in the Exhibition Grounds as a symbol of the friendship between Canada and the United States. This is the bronze figure of an angel with outstretched arms holding two palm branches and standing on a globe of the world and facing south towards the American Shoreline.

A souvenir gift was produced for this occasion by E & S Curry. It was a sterling silver belt buckle with the peace emblem and the Union Jack and old glory in colour on the front. As a point of interest, I happen to have three of these buckles, one of which is still in the original cardboard box. Noble "Big Bill" Moffatt, an official of Canadian National Railways was instrumental in having many Pullman cars parked on the rails bordering Fleet Street between Bathurst and Strachan Avenue which the Shriners used as sleeping accommodation during this

Session and this area was affectionately known as Fez City. By the way, Noble "Big Bill" was subsequently elected Mayor of Toronto. Also of note, was that our Illustrious Potentate of the day was the Honorable George S. Henry, Premier of Ontario. The 1930 Imperial was not without its problems largely caused by the October 1929 stock market crash generally referred to as Black Friday.

The number of visitors was down dramatically and many home owners who had opened up their spare room to visitors were left without compensation for their outlay and preparation. Stoodleighs Restaurant at the Exhibition had prepared dinner for 1,000 guests starting at 6:30 p.m. and by 7:15 p.m. not one person had showed up. In desperation he scoured the Exhibition grounds inviting any Shriner he saw to come in for a free meal. Approximately 150 were rounded up but this was not enough and a lot of food went to waste.

The Potentate's Ball held on December 4th, 1930 was held in the Royal York Hotel. A Noble and his Lady would be admitted free, providing he presented his 1930 Shrine dues card otherwise a single ticket was \$3 or \$5 for a couple (not bad eh?) Our membership in 1930 was 3,168 Nobles. The revenue for that year was \$100,000 with an expenditure of some \$54,000. We gave \$40,000 to be invested, leaving the Temple with \$6,000 to cover day-to-day expenses. One of our auditors of that time was Harry C. Tugwell who was the father of Charles A. Tugwell, Captain of our Patrol in the 1960s and I remember him well.

Let me close by reminding you that membership is still our number one problem and I ask every one of you to bring in just one Candidate this year. If you don't get one for the Shrine, then get one for Masonry. We will get him later.

I thank every Rameses Noble for your hard work and often thankless work during the year, but know that I appreciate all that you do for Rameses and most of all thank you for just being Shriners.

closing the hospitals, but would rather explore other options as to try and close the gap of 200 million dollars.

One option is to perhaps convert some of the hospitals into ambulatory care facilities, whereby no patients would have any overnight stays.

On the revenue side, the hospitals should look at going to third party pay. This is where the Shrine would bill the patient's insurance company and/or the government.

He also stated that there are over 200 full-time employees in Tampa who work on the hospital. I asked him what are the costs of salaries for all these people. He said \$57,000,000 vs \$19,000,000 ten years ago.

The IT department costs are huge. It is very clear that changes must be made. Hopefully all of the hospitals can be saved and operated in some sort of fashion.





Nobles of Fame, Distinction and Honour

FOURTH IN A SERIES

hat can you say about a Noble that has been in, at last count, 197 movies, is 92 years old and still going strong. One word comes to my mind, hurrah!

Ermes Effron Borgnino was born January 24th, 1917 in Hamden, Connecticut to Charles and Anna (an Italian Countess, née Boselli) who had emigrated from Ottiglio, Italy.

Borgnine joined the United States Navy in 1935 after high school. He was discharged in 1941, but he re-enlisted when the United States entered World War and served until 1945 (a total of ten years), reaching the rank of Gunners Mate 1st Class.

After the war he returned to his parent's home with no job and no prospects. It was his mother who suggested that with his forceful personality he would be perfect for a stage career. To his mother's surprise he took her suggestion to heart. In 1947 he landed his first stage role in "State of the Union". During 1949 he debuted on Broadway in the role of a nurse in the play "Harvey".

In 1951 he moved to Los Angeles where he received his big break in the blockbuster movie "From Here to Eternity" alongside Burt Lancaster. I remember him giving an interview many years back. Apparently a friend of his suggested that he drop the front of his pant down slightly so that his stomach protruded to give the impression of an overweight slob. He attributed that move to his getting the part.

I guess we have all seen Ernie, in many movies over the years, and like you I have some that are my favourites. I guess the big one for me is the Sam Peckinpaw movie The Wild Bunch. I confess that I watch that movie at least 5 or 6 times a year and have owned it in VHS and now DVD. If you have never seen this movie, shame on you. In my books it is the best Western ever made, bar none.

Not mentioning McHale's Navy would be an omission many people would not forgive. Although a fan of that show, I don't think it gave Ernie the depth of acting that he is more than capable of even though he received an Emmy Award nomination for Outstanding Lead Actor in a Comedy Series. The

series ran for four years and was cancelled at the end of the fourth season in 1966.

Ernie holds the 33rd degree of the Scottish Rite of Masonry and has long been active in the craft as well as being a Shriner. He also is recipient of the Grand Cross, which is the highest honour for service to the Scottish Rite.

I know that all Masons and Shriners worldwide join me in wishing Brother and Noble Ernie, good health and longer life. If anyone deserves to celebrate a 100th birthday, it is Ernest Borgnine.





Shriners Hospitals to develop

national cleft lip palate treatment



Before Surgery

A bout 5,000 children are born each year with deformities of the upper lip and mouth. The condition is uncommon but devastating to those affected. Care for cleft lip and palate is often difficult to obtain and is, at best, fragmented and incomplete.

No matter how many children are affected, they deserve the best medical attention available. Shriners Hospitals for Children, long known for its care of children with orthopaedic, burn and spinal cord problems, is responding to this unmet medical need by adding it to our official disciplines.

At the November board meetings, the Joint Boards approved development of a National Shriners Cleft Lip and

Palate Program. A detailed proposal, including a plan for a systematically organized network of locations, staffing recommendations and costs, will be presented to the boards in April 2006.

In addition, the boards provided adequate funding for the cleft lip and palate program already in place at the Chicago Shriners Hospital, which will serve as a model for the future effort. "Step one was to ensure that the Chicago hospital, which has achieved a national level of prominence in this field,

has the resources to provide all necessary services," said Donald Lighter, M.D., associate director of medical affairs for Shriners Hospitals. Step two will be to closely study the Chicago model and then determine how best to proceed with expanding the program to other Shriners hospitals, Lighter said.

A comprehensive program

The Chicago hospital has about 1,300 active patients in its program. These patients account for at least 250 operative

procedures and a minimum of 5,300 patient visits annually. Ancillary medical needs are provided through agreements with three major universities in the area.

Treating cleft and palate problems is a longterm commitment; children require care from birth to adolescence, which fits well in the Shriners mission of providing family-centered care until the patient's 18th birthday. Several types of surgeries, including lip and palate repair, nasal reconstruction, facial work and dental procedures, can be required when treating these disorders. Even so, much of the work can be done on an outpatient basis and hospitalizations are typically short. Still, the children will need additional care and attention, such as speech therapy, psychosocial evaluations and orthodontic treatments. These children will also need the expertise of several different medical specialists, including surgeons, several types of dental specialists, speech and language pathologists, audiologists and psychologists. The designated Shriners Cleft Lip and Palate Centers of Excellence will provide all necessary care, often through collaborating and coordinating with local medical centers and universities.

It is hoped that the new program will fill the need for coordinated, comprehensive multidisciplinary care for these children, as well as provide medical research on cleft lip and palate problems. Of course, Shriners Hospitals intends to offer the same state-of-



the-art, high quality care in this effort as it does in its established programs for pediatric orthopaedic and burn care.

Presentation made to Children's Treatment Centre





n Thursday, April 2, 2009 the Executive Director of the Children's Treatment Centre, Sally Spence was presented with a cheque for \$51,000 on behalf of Rameses Temple and the Sudbury Shrine Club. These monies are earmarked for the purchase of Medicinal Botulinum Neurotoxin (Botox) which is administered as part of the medical therapy. Certain medical conditions result in the tightening of



muscles or spasms which are uncontrollable, and these are often painful. Treatment with Botox can manage these symptoms. The signals causing muscle spasms and pain are sent to the muscles through the nerves. Botox blocks these signals at the site of the affected muscles, thus relaxing them, and easing or eliminating the pain. Rehabilitative therapy can then be initiated.

In attendance was our Illustrious Potentate, Raymond A. Causton (who made the presentation), as well as David Dunn, Terry Lamping, and Robert McGregor, representing the Rameses Temple Divan (Toronto). There were thirty plus Shriners and wives, as well as Wah Chung, President, representing the Sudbury Shrine Club. Mr. Richard Schwar, the Charitable

At that time as many as eighty children are evaluated over a two day period, and this saves them taking a trip to Montreal, as well as optimizing our resources. 



The history of the Little Red Caboose


