

(approximately 1,000 Nobles will vote). If it passes, the rules will be changed and if it doesn't then the motion is defeated and the rules of General Order Number 1 will still stand. No Ladies with Shriners in parades.




Nobles of Fame, Distinction and Honour

Second in a Series

ike a great many of you, some of the earliest, if not the first movies I saw as a child were films of the American West. Foremost in my memory were the cavalry pictures of John Ford. Films like Rio Grande, Fort Apache and She Wore a Yellow Ribbon. All of which now form part of the 1,500

DVDs in my collection. The star of those movies was none other than John Wayne, an actor that needs no introduction or explanation to anyone worldwide. He was born Marion Robert Morrison, in Winterset Iowa, May 26th, 1907. The middle name was soon changed to Michael after his parents decided to name their second child Robert. His grandfather, Marion Mitchell Morrison was an American Civil War Veteran. John Wayne's heritage was Irish, Scottish and English. The family moved to California in 1911 where his father worked as a pharmacist in Glendale, California. It was during his time in Glendale that the name "Duke" became forever attached to this American icon. It appears that on his was to school each day he had to pass the fire house. A local fireman at the firehouse started calling him "little duke" because Wayne always was accompanied by his huge Airedale Terrier Duke. The name stuck.

As a teen Wayne worked in an ice cream parlour for a man who shod horses for some of the Hollywood Studios. He also joined the Order of DeMolay, a youth organization associated with the Freemasons. Wayne applied to the US Naval Academy but was not accepted. Instead he attended the

University of Southern California majoring in pre-law. Wayne played football for USC but was derailed by an accident which lost him his athletic scholarship. He then began working for local film studios as Western Star Tom Mix had found him a summer job in the prop department in exchange for football


tickets. He managed to get a few bit parts in movies and established a long friendship with Director, John Ford.

Contrary to popular opinion, John Wayne's first big role in the movies was not Stagecoach. It was in fact a movie made in 1930 called "The Big Trail" the first big production film using sound. I have it in my collection. Listing John Wayne's movie credits would take too long and I'm sure we are aware of most of them anyway, needless to say it is extensive. Two expressions used by John Wayne which are easily recognizable to most of us are "That'll be the day" and "Pilgrim". I've been known to use the first one myself on the odd occasion.

John Wayne was a member of Glendale DeMolay Chapter during his school Days. He received his Craft degrees in 1970 in Marion McDaniel Lodge No. 56, Tucson Arizona. A senior DeMolay he was awarded the DeMolay Legion of Honour in 1970. In December of that year, he joined the York Rite

Bodies in California and became a Shriner al Al Malaikah Shrine Temple.

The internet is full of additional information concerning this Mason and Noble. I urge you to do some surfing yourself. You will find it most interesting.
