Regrettably our conditions were not officially met within our time period and with the economy in turmoil as I write, your Divan decided to withdraw this offer and our deposit has been returned. Be advised that this proposal is dead and we are not interested in this property at the present time, we do however wish to thank Noble Jeff Laceby for his good council and assistance on this project.

All members of your Divan are working hard on the Petro Canada project and I trust by the time you read this, you will all be buying your fuel at the Petro Canada service station of convenience and that you have placed your order for the Shrine Fuel Card. The Chairman of this project is our Assistant Rabban Noble Jim McKinney and therefore I will leave the details and the dos and don'ts up to him and our illustrious Potentate.

However, Nobles please get on board with this project as it's you and you alone that can make this the biggest fundraising project to come our way in many years and it's just so simple. When you need fuel, make sure it's Petro Canada you use. Have them swipe your Shrine card then pay for your fill-up with cash, debit or credit card (your choice) then watch our Shrine bank account grow.

The February financial stated meeting was not well attended. A total of 43 Nobles including the Divan showed up and all items on the agenda were subsequently discussed and approved of which the main item was the 2008 financial report. There were no questions asked and all present appeared to be happy with the financial statement which is now part of the record and history of Rameses Shrine.

On April 2nd of this year, your Illustrious Potentate accompanied by his Divan will travel to Sudbury to present the Sudbury Botox Clinic with a cheque for \$51,000 from our Transportation Fund. This amount was raised by your generous donations to it in the amount of \$30,000 and with an additional amount of \$21,000 raised by the Sudbury Shrine Club. It just goes to show what we as Shriners can do when we work together as a team. There is a misconception that Botox injections are for cosmetic purposes only but that's not what we use it for. The Botox is injected into our young patients who among other things have Spina Bifida and Neuromuscular disorders. The Botox loosens up the muscles and allows the children much better use of their limbs. For example, children who tend to walk on their toes with jerky movements prior to injections, walk on the soles of their feet and in a somewhat more normal fashion after the injection. I'm told that this treatment works for in some cases several months but it does eventually have to be repeated.

One day we will cure this terrible malady but until then we

all strive to make our kids as normal as possible and from the bottom of my heart I thank every Noble that makes a donation to our Transportation Fund and if you could see the result of your effort for yourself, you would be suitably impressed. It may even bring a tear to your eye.

While we're on the subject of money and our Transportation Fund, be advised that your Illustrious Potentate Noble Ray Causton will be going to our Canadian Shrine Hospital in May of this year at which time he will present them with a cheque for \$100,000 and again this is money that you the Nobles of Rameses raised and it will go to help our kids which is we feel, exactly what you would want us to do with your hard earned cash.

Nancy and I are going to be on a well earned vacation for three weeks in March so if you can hold off on your questions until I come back, I would appreciate your indulgence. It's not

Fuelling Shriners...Litre by Litre: A Unique Fundraising Effort from Shriners and Petro-Canada

Starting April 1st, Shriners and Petro-Canada launched a unique and powerful fundraising opportunity. The Fuelling Shriners program requires no additional effort on your behalf, other than ensuring that you purchase your fuel for the next year at Petro-Canada gas stations. Simply filling up your gas tank can help to contribute over \$500,000 to the Shriners fundraising efforts over the next 12 months!

The Program Details

70,000 Fuelling Shriners Cards were distributed to participating members and supporters at 11 Shrine Centers across Canada. Volunteers required for Rameses First Aid Unit

he installation of the Rameses Shriners First Aid Unit mission is to fundraise, provide basic first aid to members, support events and maintain medical equipment. The first aid members will be wearing orange berets to be easily visible to all members. The benefits of having a First Aid Unit is to educate members and provide basic CPR/first aid to Shrine members until emergency medical personal are on scene. In developing this Unit, it is important that we recruit members to maintain the Unit so we are able to meet the first aid needs of the Shrine and fundraising goals.

As a Unit to raise funds we will be selling first aid kits; small one for \$28 dollars (Individual use); larger one for \$50 dollars (office use). These can be purchased through any first aid member.







Nobles of Fame, Distinction and Honour

THIRD IN A SERIES

ctor, Mason, Shriner, born Gwyllyn Samuel Newton "Glenn" Ford May 1st 1916 at Jeffrey Hale Hospital in Quebec City, Quebec, Canada. Believe it or not he was a great nephew of Canada's first Prime Minister, Sir John A. MacDonald.

The Fords moved to Santa Monica, California in 1924 and Glenn became a naturalized American Citizen in 1939. He acted in West Coast stage companies, before joining Columbia Pictures in 1939.

His stage name came from his father's hometown of Glenford, Canada and his first major movie part came in 1939 in the firm "Heaven with a Barbed Wire Fence".

I guess the first picture I remember Glenn Ford in was "Blackboard Jungle" but I remember him more for the original "3:10 to Yuma". Probably, because it's been playing a lot on television over the past couple of years.

Glenn saw service with the US Marine Corps during WWII as a photographic specialist with the rank of sergeant, spending most of his time in Quantico, Virginia. He was honorably discharged from service in December of 1944. In 1958 he joined the Naval Reserve and was commissioned a lieutenant commander. In 1967 he went to Vietnam for a month tour of duty as a location scout for combat scenes for a training film. He retired from the Navy in the 1970s with the rank of Captain.

Glenn was initiated into Palisades Lodge No. 637, which is now Santa Monica Palisades No. 307, and a Charter Member Riviera Lodge No. 780 Pacific Palisades California. Although I have not been able to find the year, at some point he was Mason of the Year. Glenn was also a member of Al Malaikah Shrine.

The last time I remember seeing Glenn Ford was several years ago during an interview on Canadian television. He was being questioned during a visit back to Canada. After answering several questions, Glenn, turned to the interviewer and said "How come you haven't asked me how I feel about being home". To me this said a lot.

Even though he had spent a lot of his life in the US he was, I believe, still proudly Canadian.

Following exhaustive treatment at Sick Kids, the normal process for children like Nicolas is to be sent to the Bloorview Hospital for rehabilitation. After receiving the best rehabilitation possible at Bloorview, they are then discharged and hopefully, will find assistance to help them fully recover.

In most instances help is not readily available unless a family can afford further treatment. Fortunately Nicolas was able to get help from the Lyndhurst Centre. Mrs. Shoenoff now volunteers her time to help other children with spinal injuries find the therapists who can help. Following her excellent talk, it was suggested that perhaps the Shrine could assist many of these children as our forte is Spinal Cord Injuries and our Club will follow-up in this regard with our headquarters.

Following our dinner, our Oriental Guide Noble Terry Lamping explained the upcoming agreement with Petro-Canada and our Shrine and hoped everyone would not only participate but encourage friends and family members to participate as well.






