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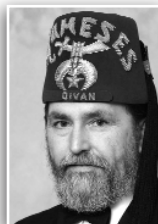

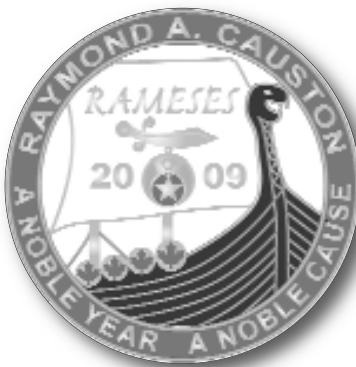

Recorder's Message

Nobles, your Elected Divan has been very busy during the summer and while our Clubs and Units have been, for the most part, on a siesta during July and August, we have been burning the midnight oil, so to speak, making changes to our method of doing business all of which we will bring to your attention as we move into the new year.

First and probably most important is the fact that Shriners in general have not supported the Petro-Canada Project and your Divan is at a loss to understand why. This was clearly the best moneymaker to come along in many years. There is no cost to any individual and the Shrine stands to make up to 2 cents a litre for every litre of fuel we collectively buy, less the finder's fee.

The majority of the twelve Canadian Temples did not support this all-Canadian project and we, your Divan, are naturally disappointed, however let me be quick to add that a few of our Units and Clubs did jump into this fundraiser full bore and we are of course very grateful for their support.

Nobles, it's still not too late to get on board with the Petro-Canada Fundraiser. We have until year end to make it work and if it does, Petro-Canada will extend the program for a considerable time so if you haven't started buying your fuel at a Petro-Canada station you're not too late to jump in and show support for this great and easy way to make some money for Rameses.

Membership is still a major problem for us as Shriners and we all need to become involved in the solution to this problem and again it's so simple. Every Shriner just brings in one new member each year. Think about this. Every one of us has 365 days to get just one Mason to join the Shrine. (Yes, I got one for the Spring Ceremonial and yes, I've got one for the Fall Ceremonial as well.) Nobles, please do your best on this item. It's just too important to leave it to someone else and it certainly wouldn't hurt to bring in some new members to our Masonic Lodge either.

I just came back from the Fall Session of the New York/Ontario and it was estimated by the senior Imperial Officer present that if the present rate of decline persists, our membership in 2017 (that's just 8 years from now) will be 175,000 members. How then can we possibly keep 22 hospitals running with an annual budget in excess of \$800,000.000

At this same meeting there was a very clear hint of a dues and per capita tax increase to all Shrine members in the very near future.

On a personal note, I don't have a problem with the increased costs so long as we have good business heads running the show, but if we continue to allow the emotional masses to make the decisions, I won't support any increase because in my opinion, it's throwing good money after bad.

Please allow me to explain as briefly as possible, but first let me state without reservation that I consider the vast majority of Shriners good and honest men who want only the best for our kids; however we have in the International Shrine over 1,000 Nobles who all have a vote on all major changes to our bylaws.

Of this group, Rameses has 5 active representatives. When a major motion is made, such as closing a hospital etc, all 1,000 plus of these Nobles have a vote and that's where the problem starts. No Shriner wants to vote to close a hospital and that's where emotion takes over from good business sense. I believe we should allow our top executives to make the major decisions and that we hold them accountable for the faux pas if they make them, but at least give them a chance to show us what

they can do without dragging 1,000 others along with them who for the most part have no idea how serious the problem really is.

Nobles, can you imagine what would happen if companies like General Electric, Wal-Mart and Coca-Cola had to include every branch manager and their assistants in company decisions.

It wouldn't work in big business where billions of dollars are

at stake. The Board would hold the President responsible for any grievous errors and he would likely be removed from office and I believe we should give our top executive (The Imperial Officers) that option. Again, I say the opinions expressed here are my own and your comments are always appreciated, both pro and con.

Rameses Fall Stated Meeting is on Friday, November 20th, 2009 at 3100 Keele Street starting at 7:30 p.m. The normal business will be dealt with, then we discuss and hopefully approve the 2010 budget. We will also give out the 25 and 50 year pins also the Samsar Awards so we hope to have a good turn-out for this very important evening.

On Saturday, November 21st, we will hold our Fall Ceremonial starting at 8:00 a.m. so please make sure your Candidate is on time and ready for the busy day ahead.

I look forward to your letters, emails and phone calls. Don't forget that my job is to help you not put obstacles in your path, but as always it's much easier to keep you out of trouble than get you out of trouble.

Thank you Nobles for your support of Rameses and as always thank you for just being Shriners.

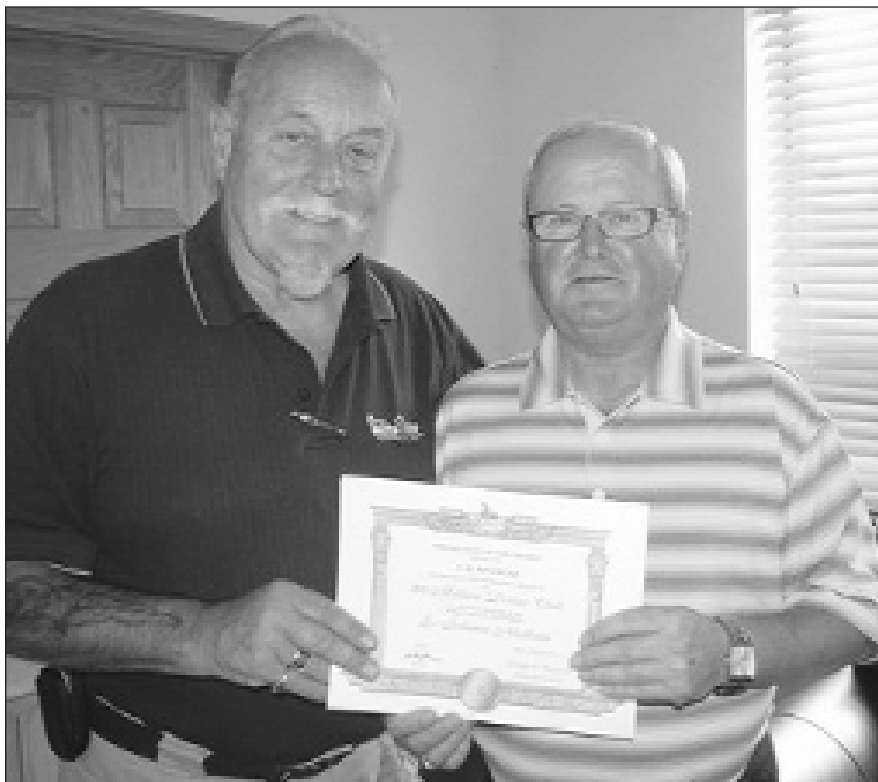

A history of the Canadian/Mexican wheelchair initiative

The following is the story about how we got involved in the Mexico City Shrine Children's Hospital Wheelchair Project.

It all began with a visit to the Shriners Children's Hospital in Mexico City this past April by Noble Gerald (Jerry) Phillips of the Sheba Shrine Club located in Barrie. He, along with a number of Shriners from Calgary, were taken on a tour of the hospital. It was

difficult to imagine that this three-year-old, 84-bed facility saw an estimated 44,000 children last year.

Children with broken bones, burns, cuts and bruises and various medical conditions too numerous to mention, were cared for by a dedicated staff.

When the goodbyes were being exchanged, a staff member was asked if there was anything that they desperately needed. The answer was, "send me a wheelchair".

Upon his return to Canada, Jerry sat chatting to John Simpson, also a Shriner, telling him of his trip. When he mentioned that they required a wheelchair, John's response was "why one, let's send them as many as we can".

So it began, the letters to other Shrine Clubs, local hospitals and nursing homes, asking for donations of wheelchairs, walkers, crutches or canes. New or used, the Shrine Club members would make sure that they were all in good condition for shipment.

Soon, calls were received from all over Southern Ontario and arrangements made to pick up donated equipment for the Mexico Shrine Hospital. They quickly had enough donations to fill three pallets. Jerry's garage looked like a warehouse!

Noble Don Thorne arranged transportation with The Master's Group in Kitchener, Ontario, who looked after transportation as well as the bonds required by all customs agencies and three pallets were shipped off to

Mexico City. These pallets

contained: 13 wheelchairs; 12 pair of crutches; 5 canes; 4 folding walkers; 2 hand walkers; 4 seating pads and 1 clear plastic feeding tray.

It must be noted that Clubs within the Shrine organization such as Sheba Shrine Club of Barrie, The Order of Quetzalcoatl (Teocalli #383) and The Color Party of

Sheba Shrine Club were very generous with funds to cover the initial shipping costs.

But wait! It doesn't stop there. The calls are still coming in requesting equipment to be picked up. So as long as the donations keep coming, Jerry and John will find a way to get them to the needy kids at the Shrine Children's Hospital in Mexico City.

Any Shrine Unit or Teocalli that wishes to help, we desperately need money to pay for additional shipments. If you have access to equipment or your Unit would like to donate money to assist with transportation, please call John Simpson at 705-361-2893.

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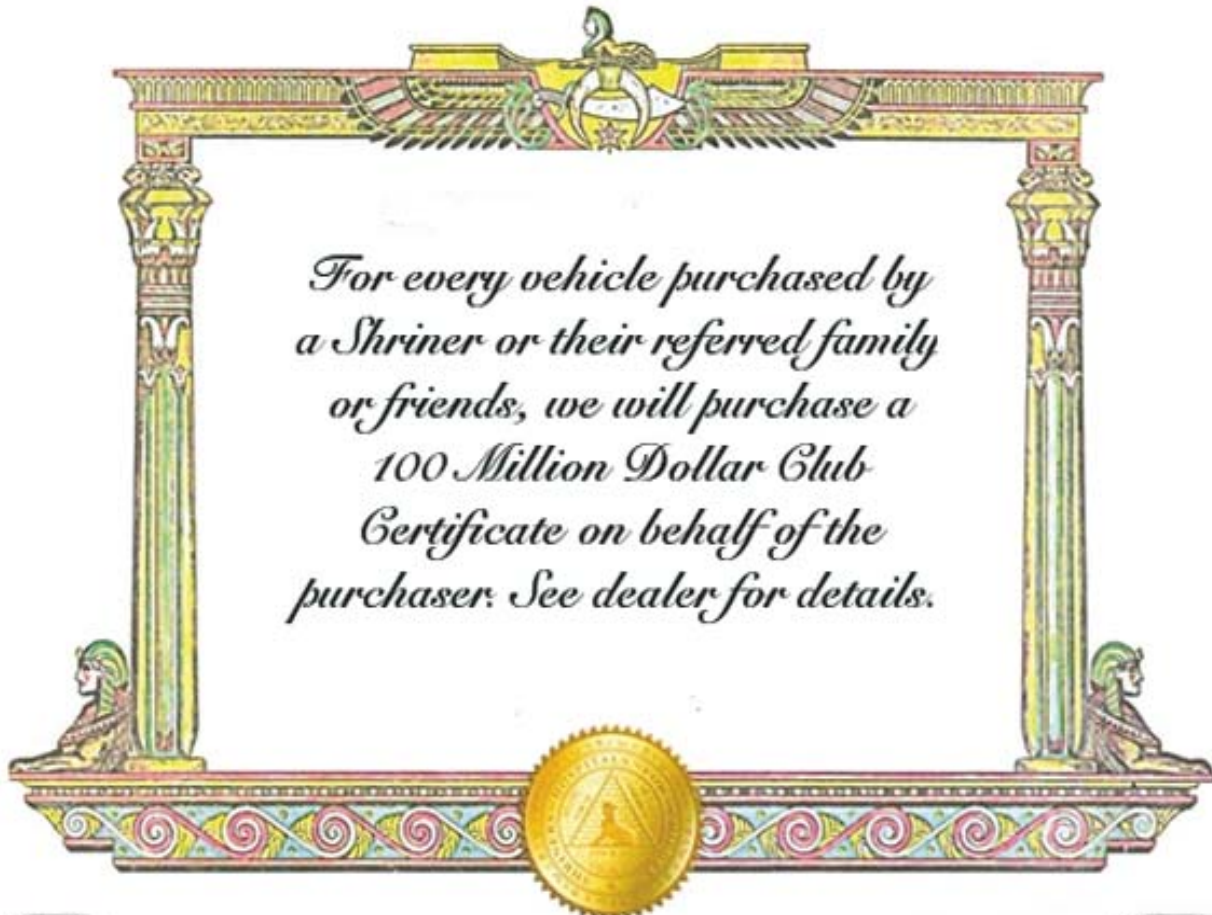
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LADIES ORIENTAL SHRINE

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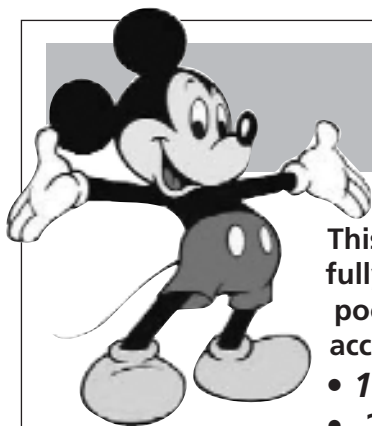
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Sheba Shrine celebrates 50th anniversary

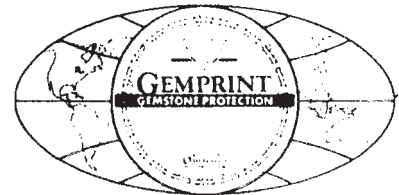

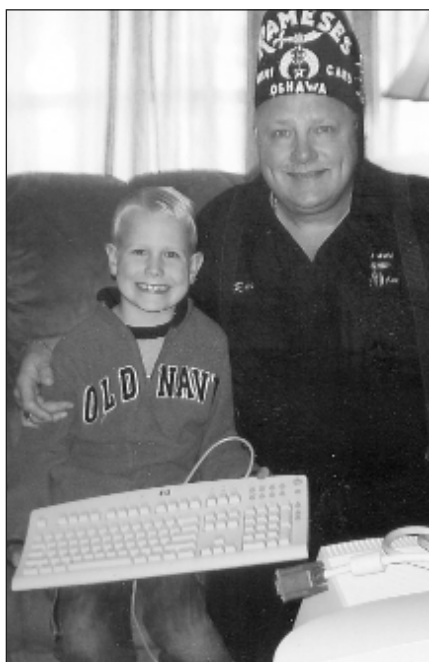
