












## Recorder's Message

obles, the Imperial Session for 2009 was held in San Antonio Texas and your Divan spent a very active week attending meetings from early morning until supper time and beyond. It's the 13th of July as I write and I do remember that I promised to let you all know what happened at this session.

All the action at the Imperial Session is listed in a book referred to as "the call" and you may remember that at our Stated Meetings I advised you that this book is always in my office and any Rameses Noble is welcome to review this book at any time at 3100 Keele Street. Note, I cannot allow the call to leave our building for any reason unless I go with it.

This year in the call we had 17 articles in the lowa Corporation to discuss and vote on. Note, this is the Shrine Nobles side of our organization. There were also 19 resolutions to be discussed and voted on in the Colorado Corporation. Note, this is the hospital side of our organization and remember as Nobles of the Mystic Shrine, we have a big stake in both groups.

Many of the articles on the lowa side were of a fairly routine nature and of the 17 discussed, some at great length, one was withdrawn, five were defeated and eleven passed. Of interest to all of us is that two new Temples were created; one in the Philippines called Mabuhay and the other in Puerto Rico called Al Rai's Saleh. Of note, the request for a Temple in Germany was defeated. Bottom line, the Shrine is now referred to as International and we are 193 Temples strong and yes we are still using the word "Temple" where applicable.

You may remember that Rameses had an article change requested on the lowa side and it was listed as item 9 on the call. This was a motion made at our Stated Meeting by Noble Brian Denton and seconded by Noble Jim Rennie that ladies be allowed to be in civic parades in the company of their male partner. Be advised that our Illustrious Potentate presented this motion with passion and sincerity, however it did not pass and it will be two years before this can be brought up again by Rameses at an Imperial Session. Of note, a change in bylaws requires a two thirds majority to pass and the vote was as follows with 628 votes cast; 374 were in favour, 254 against however it needed 418 votes to pass, so we lost by 44 votes. "Ah, such is life". For the record Nobles, we are still bound by the current by-laws and I don't think this needs further explanation.

The Colorado Corporation (Hospital) was clearly divided on what should be done to move us on to a path for recovery and I believe most of you know that the Galveston Hospital was closed earlier this year due to severe damage by Hurricane Ike and further due to the recent economic downturn. The suggestion was put forward that we close another five hospitals that were deemed to be somewhat of a burden to the system. Make no mistake about it, when you talk about closing Shrine Hospitals it becomes a very, very emotional issue. The facts

tend to get lost or completely disregarded and regrettably in my opinion our representative of which we have approximately 1,000, tend to vote with their heart and not their head.

Be assured no Shriner; myself included wants to close a Shrine Hospital. The thought of such is repugnant to all of us however, as a businessman we must put our passion and emotions aside and cast our vote for what is best for the Shrine in the long run and not just go for a quick fix that is destined to fall apart five years down the road. Regrettably I believe that is what we've done however please believe me when I say I hope I'm wrong.

Let me give you some of the facts then you decide what you think our modus operandi should be.

We have 22 hospitals running at an average of 27 percent occupancy (head office figures). We have in those 22 hospitals approximately 1,100 patient rooms. That means that on any given date, 297 of these rooms are occupied by patients and the other 803 rooms are sitting empty. It was also stated that we must be at all times be prepared with a full staff "just in case". For the record I believe the "just in case" has never happened and it's rumored that some of our hospitals use the empty rooms for storage purposes. We have approximately 6,000 employees and if we divide that number by 22, it seems reasonable to assume that we have an average of 272 employees at each hospital, all of whom get paid.

As a businessman I have a great difficulty with these numbers and we must find a more efficient way to operate, if we are to survive, however despite the numbers, the representatives voted to keep all our hospitals open and we will in fact be re-opening the Galveston Hospital. Membership dropped another 20,000 last year and costs are spiraling out of control and to top this of our investment fund valued at in excess of (8) eight billion dollars early last year is now worth just a little over (5) five billion dollars. The picture is very clear to me and I don't like what I see. Can the Shrine as we know it be saved, "yes it can" but only by businessmen who are not afraid to do what must be done even if it means suffering the anger of the well intentioned and ill-informed masses, we cannot continue to spend in excess of two hundred million dollars a year more than we take in and to top this off it was stated from the stage that in recent years the Imperial has presented a negative budget to the representatives, and in all cases it passed.

Note, the impressions expressed in this article are my own and do not necessarily reflect the opinion of the other Divan members.

For the record, Imperial Sir Ralph Semb who was Chairman of the Board of Trustees was defeated at the elections and that position is now held by Imperial Sir Doug Maxwell. The Imperial Potentate is Imperial Sir Jack Jones who was the Imperial Recorder for many years and of course our own Noble George A. Mitchell is now Deputy Imperial Potentate.

It was a busy session and your Divan worked hard on your behalf and were I might add, proud to do so. For myself, I just thank you all so much for just being Shriners and for the support you give to Rameses.



# Nobles of Fame, Distinction and Honour

FIFTH IN A SERIES

This time I'm going to depart a little from my regular format and knock off two birds with one stone. As both of these Nobles were Politicians I thought it would be acceptable. The first Noble I bring to your attention is John George Diefenbaker, the 13th Prime Minister of Canada who served from June 21, 1957 to April 22nd 1963. By profession, before entering politics he was a criminal defence lawyer. Noble John was born September 18th 1895, believe it or not in Neustatd, Ontario, (near Hanover) although served in the House for his entire political career as a representative from Saskatchewan. This was brought about when the family homesteaded in 1903 near Fort Carlton, which at that time was in the Northwest Territories and later incorporated into Saskatchewan.

Noble John, served in the First World War in the Canadian Expeditionary Force with the 105 Saskatoon Fusiliers from March 1916 to July 1917 reaching the rank of Lieutenant in the 29th Light Horse. Unfortunately he suffered an injury while in England on pre-deployment training and was invalided back to Canada where he was discharged as Medically Unfit for Service owing to heart irregularities.

His first attempt at running for Parliament in 1925 & 1926 was unsuccessful but in the 1940 election, after trying a further 5 times he was finally elected the to the House of Commons representing Lake Centre. In 1952 he became Canada's delegate to the United Nations. After 2 attempts in 1942 and 1948, John was successful in 1956 becoming the leader of the Progressive Conservative Party and in 1957 as previously stated, Prime Minister of Canada.

John George Diefenbaker was Initiated September 11th 1922 in Wakaw Lodge No. 166, Wakaw, Saskatchewan. Tunis Shriners I'm sure are so very proud that they have the unique distinction and honour of having had a former Prime Minister as their first Potentate.

The second Noble of Distinction is W.A.C. Bennett, former Premier of British Columbia. William Andrew Cecil Bennett, with just over 20 years in office remains the longest serving premier in British Columbia history. Like John Diefenbaker, W.A.C. was not originally from B.C. He was in fact born in Hastings, Albert County, New Brunswick, September 6th 1900, the son of Andrew Havelock Bennett and Mary Emma Burns.

His father was a third cousin of Canada's eleventh Prime Minister. At the age of 18 the family moved Edmonton, Alberta and then to Westlock, Alberta where his father operated a Hardware Store. W.A.C. opened his own store in 1927 in partnership and married soon afterwards. In 1929 just before the Stock Market Crass he left Alberta and moved to Kelowna, British Columbia. W.A.C. tried for the Conservative Party's nomination for 1937 Provincial Election but was unsuccessful.

His next try was successful and he became member of the British Columbia Legislative for South Okanagan. After a failed attempt to become leader of the P.C. Party in 1951, he left the party to sit as an independent member but in December of the same year took out a membership in the Social Credit League. In a complicated bit of political maneuvering the Social Credit with only 19 seats out of a total of 48 succeeded in convincing an independent labour member to support them and thus was able to form a minority government. The problem was the party had no leader, so in a vote of the newly elected caucus, W.A.C. won the position of party leader and Premier-Elect and on August 1st was sworn in as Premier. An office he was to hold for the next 20 years.

W.A.C. Bennett was Initiated in 1932, St. George Lodge No. 41, Kelowna, B.C. becoming Worshipful Master in 1944. He was a member of Gizeh Shriners of British Columbia and Yukon.


