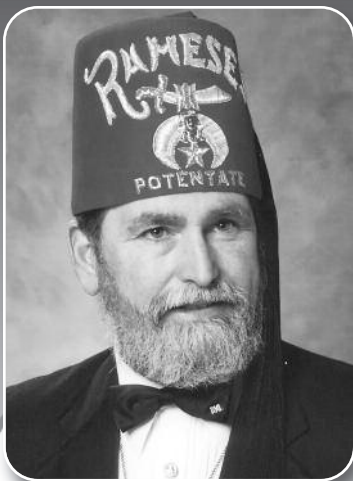

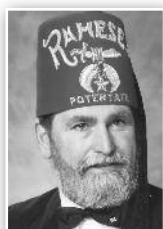

First Lady Charlene's Program Supports Emergency Transportation for Burn Patients

First Lady Charlene McGuire's fundraising program **"Giving the Gift of Hope, Life and Dreams,"** will benefit children who need emergency transportation to one of the Shriners Hospitals for Children specializing in expert burn care.

Proceeds from her yearlong initiative will be donated to Shriners Hospitals for Children's emergency patient transportation fund, which helps sponsoring Shriners International temples cover transportation costs for burn patients when needed.

Since the early 1960s, when Shriners Hospitals for Children first began offering pediatric burn treatment, thousands of patients have been given a second chance to lead productive lives, thanks to the expert medical care they received at these state-of-the-art hospitals.

When children experience burn injuries, receiving the kind of multidisciplinary pediatric burn care available at Shriners Hospitals for Children is paramount to their overall recovery. Since their injuries can be severe and even life-threatening, burn patients often require transportation to Shriners Hospitals for Children in medically equipped airplanes with medical professionals on board to monitor them.

In 2008 alone, the Shriners Hospitals for Children emergency patient transportation fund provided \$670,000 for medical air flights for 45 burn patients. And, the cost for these medical air flights is rising every year. Since 2005, the average cost for each of these flights has increased by approximately \$5,000.

"It's clear that the costs for these flights are escalating," said First Lady Charlene McGuire. "Often, temples have to make arrangements to transport a burned child to one of our hospitals immediately, so the funding has to be there. Many temples may not have funds to cover these emergency transportation costs. Proceeds from my program will help meet this important need."

As First Lady Charlene makes her visits throughout the Imperial Year, she asks that in lieu of personal gifts, nobles and ladies make a donation to **"Giving the Gift of Hope, Life and Dreams."** With each donation of \$25, they will receive their choice of a beautiful silver and gold lady's pin, or a handsome gentleman's tie featuring the "Editorial Without Words" image.

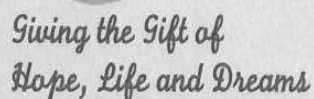

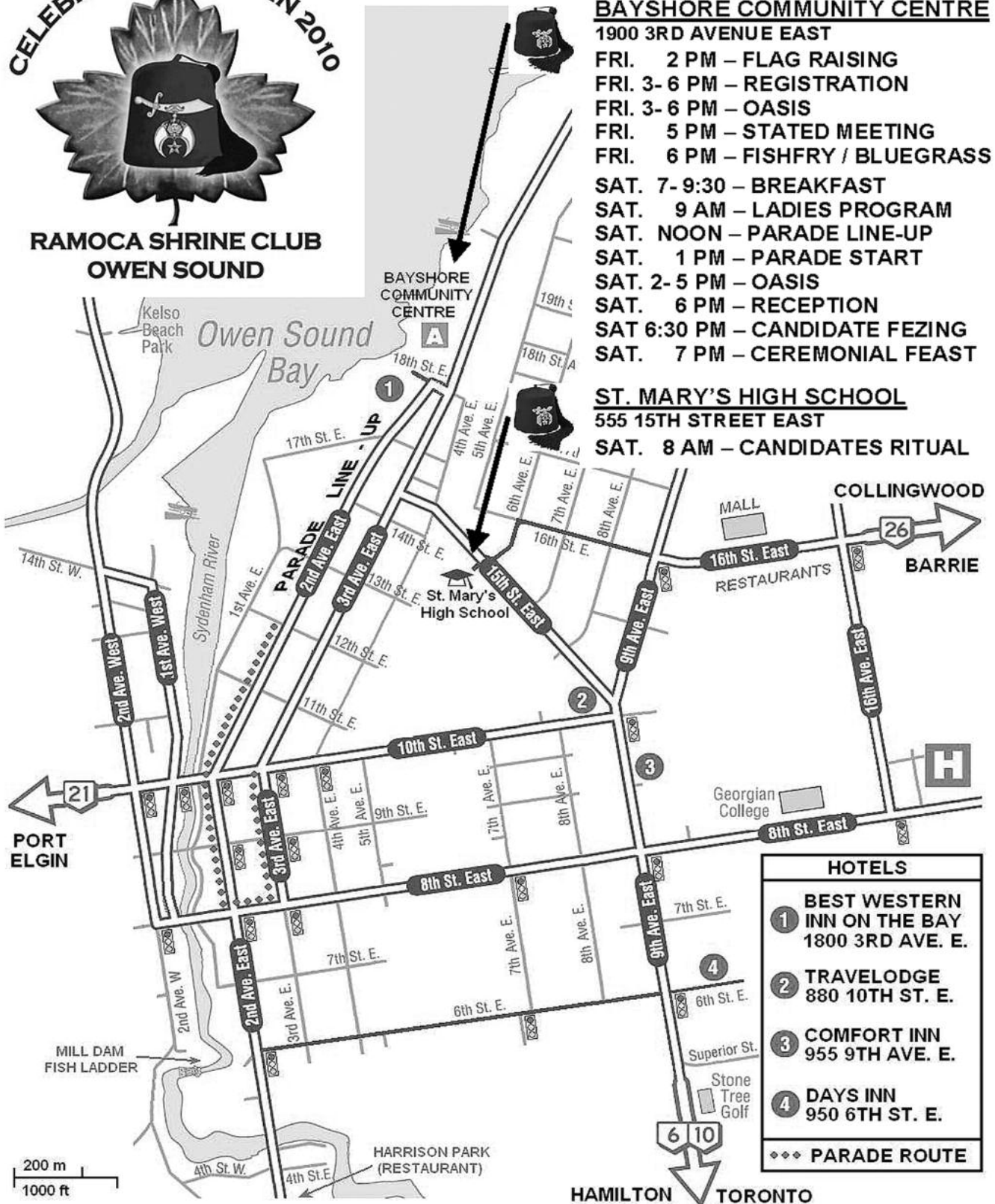

Recorder's Message

It's mid April as I write and this coming weekend is a special one. It's the Potentate's Ball which gives us all a chance to show support for the current Illustrious Sir. Looking back on my 45 years as a Shriner, I have only missed one Potentate's Ball, not all together a bad record.

We are putting the final touches on the paper work for the Spring Ceremonial in Collingwood and I do believe the Manito Shrine Club is going all out to make this a great Ceremonial and frankly Nobles, it deserves your support. I look forward to being with you all on this occasion and if we all put out our best effort, it will be a happy memory for all of us for years to come.

The Imperial Session for 2010 will see the third installation of a Rameses Potentate to the high position of Imperial Potentate for the Shrine of North America. The first was Noble Harry A. Collins in 1905 and for the record Illustrious Sir Bob Whitmarsh has his Past Potentate's jewel. The second Rameses Noble to hold this position was M.E. Mackenzie from 1933-1935 and now Noble George Mitchell. Yes, we did have two other Imperial Sessions in Toronto but they were not Rameses Nobles. In 1975 Noble Jack Streight from Gizeh Temple held his Imperial Session in Toronto and it was held again in 1989 by a Noble again from the west.

We all need to get behind Illustrious Sir Barry McQuillin on this one. It's not a secret that he has several problems to resolve. The balanced dollar is not helping from the visitor's point of view and the current need for United States Nobles to have a passport is not helping either, so Nobles it's up to us to pick up the slack. Let's show Illustrious Sir Barry that we appreciate his effort by putting 2,000 Rameses Nobles in the parade, complete with the four national flags. In short, let's make this a gold medal performance.

In the March issue of Papyrus, I requested the Nobles, Ladies and fellow travelers who had signed up for the 2008 trip to Spain and had not seen fit to seek restitution to contact me so that we could now compensate them for their loss. I'm happy to say that I have been in touch with most of them and your Divan has refunded 100 percent of their loss which was of course our intention from day one. Regrettably we had to put this on hold while the case was before the court but thankfully that is behind us now and we are in a position to respond.

Be assured that if any one of you should give consideration to a future Potentate's Trip and we hope you will, we now follow the rules and regulations to the letter and our future Potentates will not sign on unless your money is held in trust or covered by T.I.C.O.

Regarding the Imperial Session here in Toronto this July, it's open to all Shriners and if you have the opportunity, feel free to drop in and listen to the verbiage both pro and con. As I have pointed out to you before, this is the time when we vote on all the issues listed in General Order No. 2. Many of the items we vote on are from both the Iowa and the Colorado Corporations

and as a reminder, the Iowa Corp applies to us as Shriners and the Colorado Corp is all about the children in our care and of course the hospitals.

Each Temple has either 4 or 5 representatives (we in Rameses have 5) and it is their responsibility to vote on a host of issues that affect us as Shriners. Some of the issues are changes to bylaws, opening or closing our hospitals and changes to our operating manual. Now you can sit in on all of this if you wish and it certainly is an educational experience. There are one or two items you should not miss and that is the pageantry for the new Imperial Officer especially this year because you are paying for it and of course it's our George that's taking over.

Another item not to miss is the public installation and hospital presentation. This is the part that recharges all of us because the work that we do for the children is showcased and I guarantee there won't be a dry eye in the auditorium when it's finished. Nobles and Ladies, I strongly recommend you attend and be early because almost always seats are at a premium especially if you want to sit as a group. Be assured this is a busy time for your Divan. We start early in the morning and go at it all day.

Nobles, I regret to report that the current Petro-Canada Project is cancelled as of April 30th, 2010 and in spite of all the hard work we put into this, we lost money. Not a fortune but a loss none the less. Let me say that some Nobles and one or two of our Clubs gave it a good shot but the thousands of Shriners across Canada by and large did not use the cards and the support was only around 2 percent of the potential. This was, or could have been, one of the best fundraisers to come our way in recent years but apathy took over and it's dead.

We are currently entering into another Petro-Canada Fundraiser but on a much smaller scale. We will receive only 2,500 cards from Petro-Canada at no cost to us. We will attempt to sell these cards to anyone who will buy them for \$20. You will get a 5 cent discount per litre on your gas purchase so that after you have purchased approximately 400 litres of gas, you will have your \$20 back. Noble High Priest & Prophet Terry Lamping will be chairing this fundraiser and I'm sure he will provide you with the final details as they become available. In any event Nobles, we hope you will support this project.

The "Do Not Call" legislation is starting to hurt us and again this year we are anticipating a shortfall on our Circus, Fantasy, Football and Direct Appeal fundraisers. The number put on the table was a drop of 20-25 percent however we can reduce this with changes to our modus operandi and I do believe we will go this route.

I can't finish this message without a plug for membership. It's just so important. Remember what I said before. Every one of us has 365 days just to get one Candidate, that can't be too hard. I've got one already for this year and if I can do it, so can you. Remember the ten most powerful two letter words in the English language. It-Is-Up-To-Me-If-It-Is-To-Be.

Thank you all for your support of Rameses projects but most of all thank you for just being Shriners.

My garden is beginning to renew itself, the flowers are budding, some even blooming and the seedlings are sprouting.

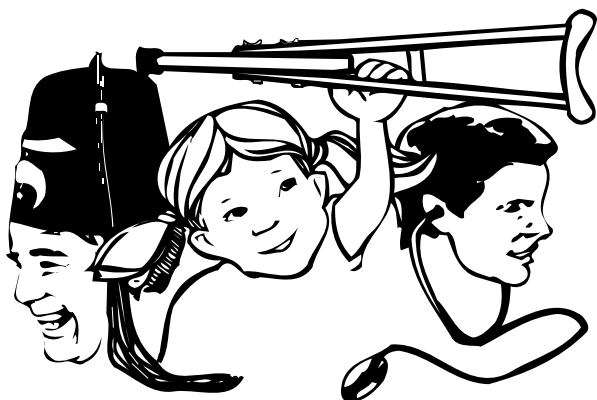
In our great fraternities, both The Masonic Order and the Shrine are all concerned with our membership and the declining numbers due in large part to the changing society in which we live.
