

This year, Rameses will have a number of Temple events which will require the Nobilities' Participation and Support. The first is the Spring Ceremonial in Collingwood which is going to be a first class event with all accommodations at the Blue Mountain Resort.

Rameses Shriners has also been honoured to be the host of the 136th Imperial Session in Toronto. Rameses Shriners will be staying at the Delta Chelsea Hotel and as is the case of all Imperial Sessions, your room is to be booked through the Temple or the Temple Housing Chairman. The cost of the rooms is \$169 + tax and the first night's deposit is required to book. Rameses has already paid the binder fee to Imperial Session 2010 on your behalf for 200 rooms.

It has been brought to my attention that there are Clubs and Units who, for one reason or another, are going out on their own and booking their own room. By doing this and not booking in with your Temple, the Temple will lose the binders fee for all rooms that are not rented which has been paid for on your behalf. Those Nobles who decide to stay on their own will also miss out on the many activities that are planned for the members who are supporting the Temple and will be staying at the Delta Chelsea. There are, of course, some exceptions such as an Oriental Band who is booking with their band association etc., these are expected and normal at all Imperial Sessions. Please be aware that Imperial Session 2010 will be collecting the Binder Fee from all those who book on their own outside of the rooms booked by the Temple.

I would hope that Rameses Clubs and Units will review their plans and make plans to stay with your Temple at the Delta Chelsea.

I congratulate all the new Presidents and Officers of all Clubs and Units and wish them a successful 2010. This should be a great year in Rameses Shriners and I look forward to the year ahead.







Remember Nobles, "attend your meetings and support your executive".





Bokhara Court makes decision to invest large amount in equipment

uesday, November 17, 2009, our High Priestess, Lady Barbara Pennock called a special meeting to see where we would like to donate the late Lady Dorothy Erma Rutherford's Investment. Our guest speaker was Ms. Celine Doray, Administrator of Shriners Hospital for Children, Montreal, Quebec.

This is our only hospital in Canada serving us and the east coast of Canada and the United States of America.

Ms. Doray presented three areas in which we could donate: One being at the cost of approximately \$1,000,000, a Gate Lab which conducts clinical assessments of children with walking disorders and would have to wait until the new hospital was built.

The second was a Family Focused Environment Room as the existing one is over-crowded and this too would have to wait for the new hospital.

The third option was a new radiology technology (EOS) at the cost of approximately \$500,000. The EOS is a 2D/3D ultra low dose x-ray imaging machine. For over a century, x-rays have provided clear and informative images but with a limited field of view and some exams delivered high doses of radiation to the patients. EOS is designed to quickly capture superior head-to-toe images of patients in a standing, weightbearing position while reducing up to 90% of the radiation dose compared to a conventional x-ray and up to 1,000 times less than a CT (Computed Tomography) scan. Physicians have long been concerned about the radiation doses being absorbed by young patients, even modern systems still expose children to the risks of thyroid, breast, ovary and other tissues susceptible to cancer.

Approximately 20-30 x-rays are done over the course of several years on scoliosis patients, so it becomes a big number in their total radiation exposure.

The EOS system is unique to conventional systems in several ways, it is a self-contained x-ray chamber that requires no external lead shielding in the walls. It quickly performs full digital paediatric workups without film

cassettes, or time-consuming positioning of the patients. The patient walks into the chamber and stands on a predetermined spot on the floor and multiple sharply focused beams quickly image the patient from head to toe in seconds. Aside from the low radiation doses and sharper images it does a 3D image in one shot, making the results more accurate from the comparison of one study to another, done months or years later. EOS technology at Shriners Hospitals for Children (Canada) would enable a large spectrum of applications. Patients affected with Osteongenesis Imperfecta, limb deformities or scoliosis would be the first to take advantage of this new technology. This piece of equipment can be purchased now and moved to the new hospital when it is built.

Our Ladies unanimously decided on the EOS with a plaque to be inscribed

Dear Nobles

As I am sure you are aware, Haiti received a devastating earthquake on Tuesday, 12 January. The next day, I had a request from our Philadelphia Hospital's Chairman of the Board of Governors, (which currently has a clinical presence in the Caribbean), for permission to help the children from Haiti, and of course, that was given.

We also had one of our Boston surgeons, Dr. Robert Sheridan, in Haiti doing humanitarian work when the quake occurred. Here is an excerpt from his message back to us via our Vice President of Medical Affairs, Dr. Peter Armstrong.

Dear Peter:

There is a huge opportunity for SHC to help young Haitians, especially over the long haul. There will be a large number of young amputees from this disaster. Most children with head and torso injuries have died. The survivors I'm seeing have devastating extremity injuries, usually isolated, that require amputation. No one in the world provides better care to young amputees than Shriners.

Perhaps by creating a program to train Haitians in prosthetic fabrication and amputee training, SHC could make a unique and durable difference. I'd love to be part of such an effort.

Don't we have great people taking care of our children! Our Shriners Hospitals will be helping the Children of Haiti by following the disaster management procedures as set forth by our Federal, State and local relief agencies, such as the Red Cross.

Our staff believes it is best that we participate in this relief effort as "Receiving Hospitals" for those children requiring "post acute" orthopedic pediatric care.

Very soon, we expect our hospitals will start to be asked to accept patients from Haiti. After their initial care, either in Haiti or some other primary trauma center, Shriners Hospitals is well prepared to participate in that next level of treatment. We expect these very needy children will come through the normal humanitarian channels, including via Haitian-American citizens.

I ask all of you to continue to keep the people of Haiti in your thoughts and prayers during this most difficult time. Yours in the Faith,




