



Recorder's Message

Two weeks ago I attended the Recorder's Seminar in Savanna, Georgia. As always there is something new to learn and this year there was an excellent lecture on insurance with the do's and don'ts highlighted and all of which I will check out on my return to Toronto. It's not enough that our circus promoter tells us he has insurance, we need the details. Many of the acts are self-employed and are hired by the promoter for the season or a part of it. This is very often the case with animal acts and it's very possible that when he puts his circus together, that he will hire several sub-contractors, one with an elephant act, one with a horse act and another with lions and tigers etc. and it may be that one of them does not have insurance. Now let me say that Xentel D.M. does a great job for us but I'm still going to check it out for our own peace of mind.

Third party coverage has never been considered in the past, however our current financial position with respect to our hospitals, leaves us with no choice but to consider this plan of action. Simply put, many of our patients have medical insurance either through mom or dad's work or perhaps they pay for it through private coverage, in any event Shriners have never, in the past, considered tapping into this for patient care, however the reality now is that we must consider this as a source of income. However, this is a huge item that will require many adjustments and much fine tuning as we move forward. One major problem is if we take this money, how much interference will we encounter from the insurance company and will they try to decide what the child should get, instead of us? I don't think I need to go into great details on this. You are all intelligent people and this will not be resolved overnight. It's a good start and hopefully we will resolve the issues on a needs must basis. I'll keep my fingers crossed in the meantime. Another issue that will be on the agenda for the Imperial Session in Toronto is flags, and specifically how many do we fly? We, in Rameses,

always comply with protocol and fly the four National Flags, regrettably many U.S. Temples do not and I've lost count of how many meetings I've attended in the States where they don't know what the Canadian Flag looks like let alone have one. For this reason I always carry with me a set of miniature flags and I never flinch from making my displeasure known to the offending group and I know my companions on the Divan have dealt with this lack of courtesy as well; not just once, but often.

It would appear now that we have a Temple in the Philippines and Porto Rico and several more countries under consideration that the new policy will be that we only need to fly the flag of the country we're in or where the session is being held. Everyone gets the same answer to a specific question and frankly that's why I prefer to get the questions in written form, this way my response can be read by anybody who is interested.
