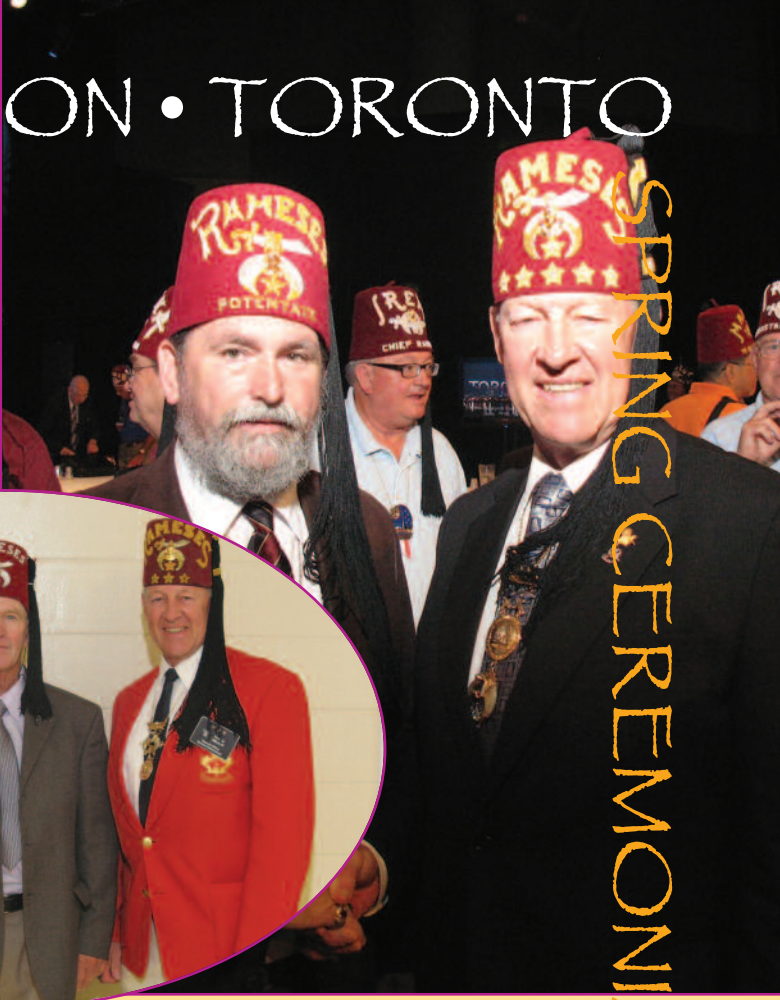

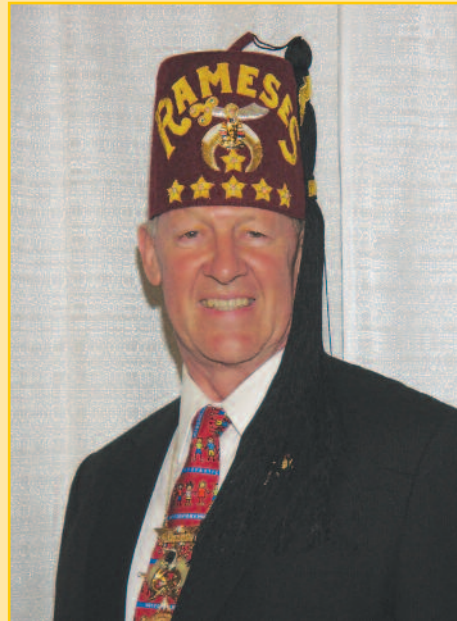

On November 20th 2010 there will be another important event coming up at 3100 Keele St. and that is the Family of Masonry Day. It is hoped that this will be an open house

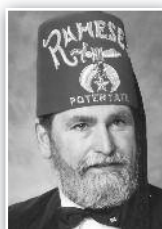

Recorder's Message

In the June issue of Papyrus, I urged all Rameses Nobles to support their Temple by attending our Spring Ceremonial in Collingwood and the Imperial Session in Toronto and to all Nobles and Ladies that showed up, I offer my sincere thanks.

The Spring Ceremonial in Collingwood was, in my opinion, well run and on time. We brought into the fold 58 new Shriners not the least of whom was Illustrious Sir Bryan's father. We now have three generations of Lawson's active in Rameses, son, father and grandfather.

Also present in Collingwood was Illustrious Sir Ben Hughes who also held his Spring Ceremonial in Collingwood in 1980. That was 30 years ago and I was parade marshal at that time. Boy how time flies. Noble David E. Rawn, the Director General for this Ceremonial did a great job and he and his committee are to be congratulated on a job well done.

The Imperial Session was also a well run affair and with Illustrious Sir Barry McQuillin as the Director General for this one, we were all in good hands, no one could even imagine how much work this really is with decisions made last month being either changed or adjusted to suit current conditions, frustration is not the word.

Imperial Sir George Mitchell is now our Imperial Potentate and no one can deny that he has worked hard to get to the position and with First Lady Deana at his side; I know they will do justice to this high position and it is important for us to give our unconditional support especially during the next 12 months.

If you did not attend the Imperial Session in Toronto you missed a good show. The pageant and hospital presentation were well done and watching this really does give you a sense of what the Shrine is all about and it helps to charge us up for the next good deed.

The legislation was pretty mundane and most of it sailed through without much challenge. The two new Temples that were under dispensation were awarded their charter so we are now officially 193 Temples. The new Temples are from the Philippines MA-BU-HAY and from Puerto Rico AL-RAY-SALAY. We also have another Temple now under dispensation from Germany named EM-IR-AT and if this passes muster and gets its charter in July of 2011, we will then be 194 Temples.

That all sounds like we are moving forward however, the bad news is that our membership is still in decline and we are still putting out a negative budget. It looks like we will be spending 128 million dollars more than we are taking in and of course this money will come from the interest on our endowment fund. It's clear to see that the two items we all have to address is membership and financial responsibility. Frankly if we could solve our membership problem, that's clearly the one that is dragging us down and we need to vigorously attack this one until we turn it around.

How about this formula? Rameses has 4,000 members. If

we were to divide this up into groups of 10 Nobles and each group of 10 brought in just one new Noble that would give us an increase of 400 new Nobles a year. That would do it. We would offset the deaths, demits and suspensions. Think how easy this could be. Ten Nobles to bring in one Candidate per year. That's 3,650 man days to get one new Noble. This can't possibly be hard to do if we just put our minds to it. Put a note on your refrigerator. (I need to get a candidate)

3100 Keele Street office is still open 5 days a week during July and August; however we only open in the evening if we know a group wants in for a purpose, your questions are always welcome. Please remember that the first and most important duty of the Recorder is to the membership as a whole, not just to small splinter groups although everyone gets equal consideration. "No" I can't please everyone and if you are under the impression that I won't give in to those that try to circumvent the rules, you are correct. For those of you that wonder how this works, it's simple. You send in your question, complaint or suggestion to headquarters to my attention. I make a copy of your letter for the other six members of the divan and I put it on the agenda for the next Divan meeting. Your letter is discussed sometimes at great length and a Divan decision is made and the Illustrious Potentate instructs me to respond to you with that Divan decision. Needless to say, I am the messenger and we all know what happens to them ha-ha.

Seriously Nobles, believe it or not I'm here to help you and if you are in doubt about anything relating to the Shrine, please call me at the office between 5:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon or from 1:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. at home. It's not a bother for me to talk to you and I'm always glad to help if I can. Last but not least if you hear a rumour on any subject relating to the Shrine Fraternally, call me. I'll give you the correct answer and if I don't have it on hand, I'll get it for you, that's a promise.

By the time you read this, we will be back to the Shrine work and it won't be long before we are conducting Club and Unit elections you will see in this issue of Papyrus (which incidentally is looking good thanks to Noble Joe Johnson). Two lists, one for Election dates and the other for Installation. If the date given to you is not suitable, please call me immediately and I will change it for you. Please don't leave this to the last minute as it may be hard to change if several groups want the same date (first come, first served).

Also we recommend that especially for the out of town Clubs that you consider doing the Installation on the same night as the Election. This works great when we have to brave 100 plus miles in ice and snow. Nobles, please give this idea consideration but it's not a must. The current executive stays in office until the new Potentate is installed on January 8th, 2011 at which time the new executive automatically takes over and if you want the ladies present for the Installation only, we can usually work that out.

I hope you have all had a great summer and that you and your loved ones are all happy and well. Thank you all for what you do for Rameses and thank you all for just being Shriners.

Let's start off with a few important questions: How many civilian Shrine Hospital ambassadors did you make today? Say what? When is the last time you explained to a member of the public what Shriners do?

This is easily done with the aid of a business card available from the Rameses Shrine office. The card has on the face the telephone numbers (both Canadian and U.S.) to reach a Shrine office.

On the backside are a large number of ailments that are treated absolutely free at one of twenty-two Shrine operated hospitals. These treatments are available to children up to the age of eighteen regardless of colour, creed or religion. Children have been transported from other countries for treatment. Of course, all transportation to and from the hospital is cost free.

Imagine - 22 hospitals with NO BILLING DEPARTMENT!

Once these points are explained to a non-Shriner, they are given one of the business cards and advised that, should they see a child in such need, they should advise the parent/guardian to call a Shrine office to start the journey of treatment for their child.

Another point worthy of explanation is the low 3 percent rate of business expense of the Shrine charity. Almost everyone is a volunteer, save a few dedicated people hired to look after the business end of things.

While volunteering at the Shrine Circus, one hears the Circus Chairman ask the audience if they know what Shriners do. Seldom does anyone put up a hand.

Nobles, we all need to get out there and explain ourselves. We don't just attend parades and drive around in funny little cars and motorcycles.

Ask the Rameses office for a few business cards and make yourself known. The general public really does not know about the great charity that we support or how we support it.

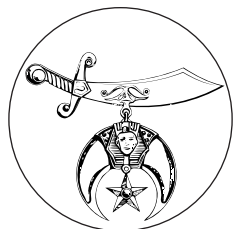
Wow! Have you seen the two new sites that have that the Imperial Membership Committee launched last October. They continue to grow and expand. Have a look at them you won't be disappointed.

The Nobles of the Kawartha Firemen's Unit and their Ladies enjoyed every moment they spent at the 2010 Imperial Session in Toronto.

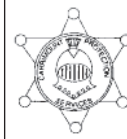
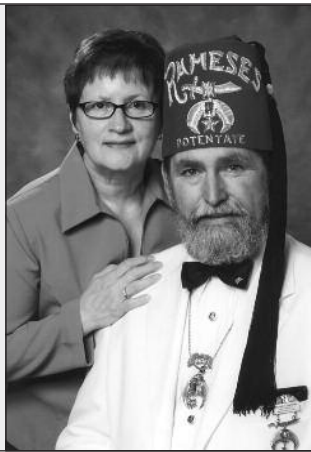

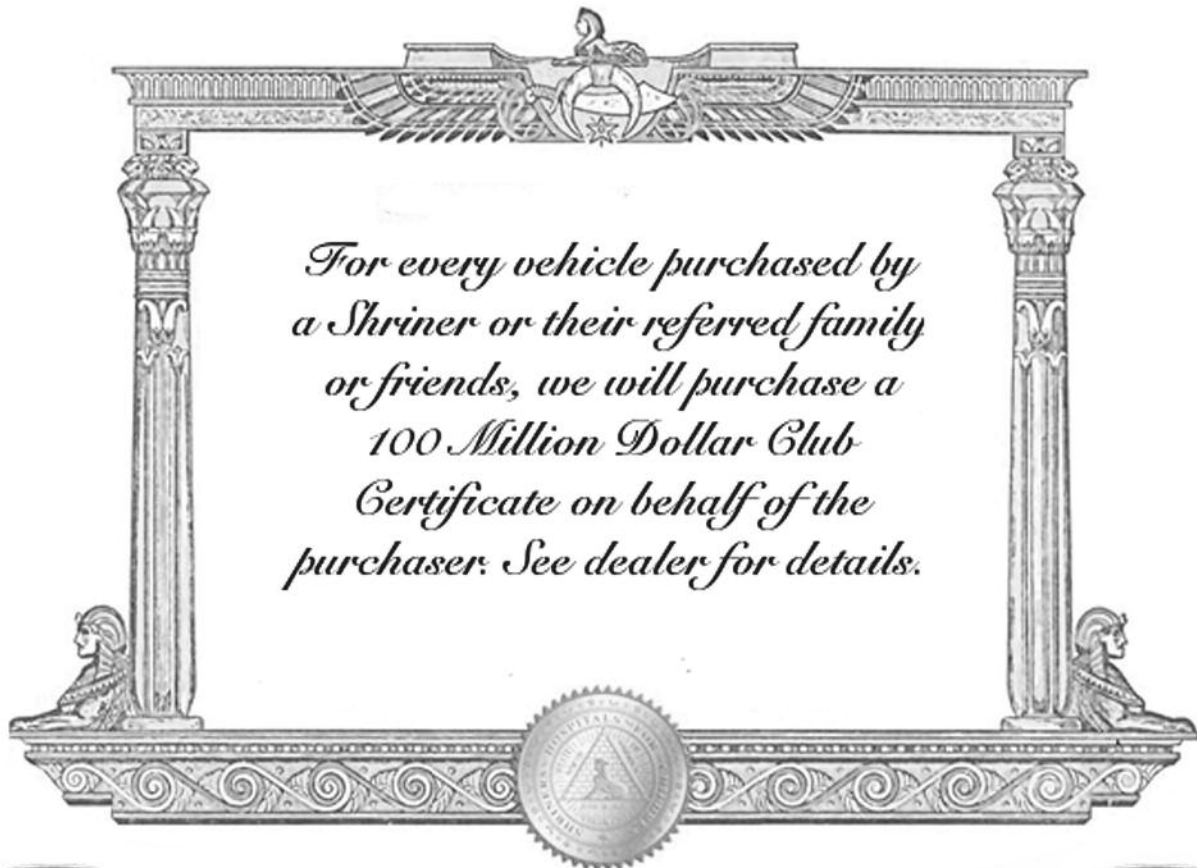
