



Recorder's Message

N obles, we are starting into a new year and I want to thank you all for your past support of Rameses functions and I trust you will see fit to continue the work of actively supporting our Masonic Lodges, the Rites and of course the playground of Masonry, the Shrine.

One of my duties is By-law Chairman, so if at any time you have a question on this subject I'm only a phone call away. Let me be clear on the subject of By-laws. All Clubs in Rameses use the standard Club By-laws which were approved in 1999 and whereas they are not perfect and in some parts maybe a little gray, none the less, they have served us well these past 11 years. We have no plans at present to change them. Note our Temple By-laws out-rank Club By-laws and Imperial By-laws out-rank them both. Let me say for the record that our Temple By-laws leave much to be desired and I lean heavily on Imperial By-laws for all final rulings.

Let me recommend for your serious consideration that you first remind yourselves of the F.P.O.F. before you bring a problem to me for a ruling. I listen to all aspects of the problem both pro and con then a decision is made in accordance with the Club By-laws and not necessarily in favour of those that shout the longest and loudest.

As Masons we should be able to work out an amicable solution without going through the By-laws with a magnifying glass. I strongly recommend the principles of good old common sense, if it feels good, if it sounds good, if it looks good, it's probably good. Let's give this a try, but if this doesn't work for you, give me a call. I'm always available to help if needed. Be advised the current elected Club President is your C.E.O. All approvals for Club fundraisers and functions must be signed by him before it can be approved at the Temple level. If your Club has Units, they come under the direct control of the Club President and they must have his approval for anything they plan to do. He in turn gets approval from the Illustrious Potentate.

If your Units have bank accounts, that money belongs to the Club and the Club President is responsible, assisted by the Club elected Treasurer and secretary to see that Unit money is reflected in the Club's year end financial statements. It is expected that the Clubs and their Units work in harmony on this financial item however when push comes to shove, it's Club money and for the record Imperial By-laws state and I quote "Shrine Clubs have no independent right to govern their own funds contrary to the By-laws of the Imperil Council and the controlling Temple Potentate", page 170 annotations to Imperial By-laws (Iowa).

The Club President is automatically a member of all committees and he is Chairman of the Trustees. The President can appoint an Assistant Secretary and Treasurer for the duration of his term in office but his successor is not bound by this decision. The Club Ambassador is the Potentate's Representative to the Club. He does not run the Club but he does speak with the authority of the Potentate in his absence. His job is to make sure the By-laws are adhered to and keep the Club informed on what's happening at the Temple level.

As By-law Chairman, please allow me to give you a piece of good advice, run your Club with a big helping of common sense, with fun and fellowship always at the top of your agendas.

Note: if I'm asked to settle a dispute, I do not take sides. I use the By-laws because the complainants leave me no choice.

Let me say what a pleasure it was for me to serve as Recorder for Illustrious Sir Bryan Lawson in 2010. Illustrious Sir Bryan served with dignity, compassion, sincerity and dedication and I will remember him and his lovely Lady Ingrid as two wonderful people. He always put the needs of others at the forefront of his decisions and I know they will be remembered for their generosity and kindness.

I also wish to congratulate Illustrious Sir Jim McKinney on his elevation to C.E.O. of Rameses Shriners. Jim brings with him his professional experience as a Chartered Accountant and I'm sure Rameses will benefit from his business acumen and his easy going style but beware he is not a pussy cat.

I congratulate Nobles David Dunn, Terry Lamping, Terry Fulton, Robert Jones and Illustrious Sir Bob Young on their election to the Divan and I wish them all well for 2011.

I also wish to thank you for your vote of confidence in me and be assured that so long as I draw breath I'll give you my best effort, but I will not give in to the council of fools.

thoughts were well received. I also wish to thank everyone who offered kind thoughts and get well cards to my Nancy before and between her two surgeries. I appreciate your kind thoughts and best wishes for my sweetheart and I'm happy to say she appears to be on the mend.

I close as always by thanking our hardworking Nobles for all that they do for Rameses. Your support is noticed and appreciated and I thank you all for just being Shriners.

Thanks for your kind attention and consideration. I look forward to seeing you in Niagara Falls for the first Parade of 2011.



Normally, the beat of the heart begins by an electrical signal from a few cells in the right atrium: these are called the pacemaker cells. This signal moves into the right ventricle and left ventricle. Fibrillation occurs when many different cells in the ventricles begin to act as pacemaker cells. This means that many

thousands of cells tell the heart to beat, all at different times and with no rhythm. This causes the heart to become totally useless, and unable to move blood around the body. This causes death. A defibrillator sends a high-energy pulse from the top-right of the heart to the bottom-middle of the heart. This causes the whole heart to stop all activity. The heart's normal pacemaker then can try and restart normal beating.

We will have a few Nobles trained to operate the defibrillator. In addition, we propose to have the Renforth Temple Board expound to the Secretaries of all Lodges meeting at Renforth to invest in having a couple of members trained.





"We take one minute at a time and enjoy every minute of every day like it's our last," Jim Denny said. "This is the way we live, and it's a good life."

Over the years, the Denny family of Oklahoma City has created and maintained a positive approach to life. Shaping that perspective, in part, was an experience so devastating that it forever changed the lives of the Denny family, and left a lasting impact on the entire nation.

On April 19, 1995, Jim Denny went about his morning routine of dropping his wife, Claudia, off at work and his two youngest children – 3-year-old Brandon and 2-year-old Rebecca – off at America's Kids, a daycare center located in the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building.

At 9:02 that morning, more than 5,000 pounds of explosives were detonated near the Murrah building in what was, at the time, the worst terrorist attack on U.S. soil. The explosives were in a rental truck, which was parked just outside the second-story windows of America's Kids. Nineteen of the 25 children there were killed.

Rebecca and Brandon were the only child siblings to survive. Rebecca sustained extensive injuries to her left side; and Brandon had massive injuries, including lifethreatening ones to his head and brain. Rebecca recovered after spending 10 days in the hospital. Brandon's condition was far worse.

In the weeks and months following the attack, Brandon had four major brain surgeries, each posing lifethreatening risks. After 126 days of hospitalization, Brandon was released, but his prognosis was not favorable.

Within eight months, Brandon was walking and talking, which doctors did not expect he'd be able to do. Because of the necessary removal of brain tissue, he had no use of his right hand and his wrist was pointed downward. He also walked with a limp.

After years of therapy failed to produce tangible results, Brandon's Oklahoma City physician recommended the family seek treatment at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Shreveport. In the summer of 2007, Brandon, who was then 15, had several surgeries at the Shreveport Shriners Hospital to improve his gait (walking pattern), arm mobility and use of his fingers.

Brandon returned to the Shreveport hospital this past fall for a month-long session of intensive therapy, focusing primarily on eliminating the need for a walker. Upon completing his session, Brandon walked out of the hospital unassisted.

"We're at a place in Brandon's life where I couldn't be happier," Jim said. "This is a five-star facility without a doubt, from top to bottom. Everyone we've come in contact with has been super."

Having experienced firsthand one of the darkest days in American history, the Denny family savors each moment together and maintains a steadfast, positive focus on the future. While Brandon will always have orthopaedic issues related to his brain injuries, both he and Rebecca exude amazing perspective and determination. For Jim, it's the right view.

"It's a long road, and we've never asked for sympathy from anybody, but what we've received from people is understanding, a lot of prayers and a lot of help from good doctors," he said. "We feel we're in the best position at Shriners Hospital for Brandon to continue his efforts to walk better and use his fingers."

The family will continue their positive journey. One minute at a time.
