



t's late July as I put pen to paper and as I look back I can hardly believe that another Imperial year is over. It seems like only yesterday that we were celebrating Jungle George's installation as Imperial Potentate and now he is a Past Imperial, with hopefully only happy memories to look back on.

Our Spring Ceremonial in Niagara Falls was well run and our Class of 98 new Shriners is the biggest we've had in the last several years and I thank everyone who signed up a new member for Rameses. Let us not rest.

We have a Fall Ceremonial to look forward to and another 98 Candidates would be something to celebrate, so let's keep the pressure on for quality membership.

On a personal note, I fell on the way back to the hotel after the parade and I broke two ribs. No, I wasn't tipsy. I don't drink and I'm glad to report it wasn't my neck (did I hear a too bad, ha-ha!).

The Imperial Session was in Denver and I have many happy memories of this city. This Imperial Session was most enjoyable and for the 100 plus Nobles and Ladies that participated in this session, I thank you all for your support of Rameses and I do hope you all enjoyed yourselves.

Regrettably, the Imperial Divan had some personal axes to grind and the first two days of this session would be best forgotten. I found the petty bickering an embarrassment to Masonry and I can't understand why these so called leaders of men couldn't have resolved their differences in private. It makes me wonder if any of them remember the Apron Charge in the 1st Degree. I think that we all have our likes and dislikes with respect to certain people, that's not necessarily a good quality, but it is human.

There were three items on the call to be voted on with respect to allowing Ladies to participate with their Nobles in civic parades, items 14-15 and 16 were basically the same with just a few minor differences. Numbers 14 and 15 were withdrawn and did not go to the vote. Number 16 was voted on by secret ballot and the result was as follows, bearing in mind that a change in by-laws requires a two thirds majority, 666 Nobles votes, 444 yes votes would be required to pass however the YES vote was 347 and the NO vote 319. The motion failed by 97 votes and if my memory serves me correct, that's a larger defeat than in 2009 for basically the same motion.

On May 28th, 2011 we held our Stated Meeting to discuss and vote on the proposed dues increase for Rameses. 106 Nobles showed up for this very, very important meeting which in itself was very disappointing. I had 500 ballots ready for distribution with more in reserve if required. Several Nobles spoke for and against the proposal which also required a two thirds majority to pass. After all had been heard the vote was taken by secret ballot. The result was as follows; 71 for the increase, 34 against the increase plus one spoiled ballot. As you can see Nobles, this motion just passed and whether you were

for or against the proposal, you surely now know the importance of your participation. Starting in 2012 your Shrine annual dues will be \$100 plus the \$15 per capita tax and \$5 hospital assessment for a total of \$120.

We have reduced our staff at 3100 Keele Street. Charlene is no longer with us and we have combined membership and hospital co-coordinator into one and these two items will be handled by Sonia. We have reconstructed other duties among Rina Veronica and Toni in order to make the office of Rameses Shrine work effectively and as efficiently as in the past. Yes, we will all be busier however we simply must make it work and we shall. Needless to say we will miss Charlene and we wish her well for the future.

The summer BBQs, picnics and golf games are in full swing during July and August and your Divan try very hard to support all our Clubs on this. However, every once in awhile we get a double invite for the same day, so we just do the best we can to support them. We are mindful of the cost of those outings and we will have two Nobles attend instead of four or even six. Every little bit helps so if only two Nobles or two couples show up to your function, you will know the reason why.

It will be September by the time you receive this edition of Papyrus and this will start our fall program of activities and elections. 



Rameses Shriners Legion of Honour

The Sponsor/Mentor His duties and obligations to his Candidate and ultimately, his Lodge

Il too often a newly made Mason, usually at the Entered Apprentice and Fellow Craft stages in his Masonic career, drops out and eventually demits or receives a non-payment of dues suspension.

Is it his fault? No, it is yours!

You, as his sponsor and mentor, began ignoring him the minute the ink from your signature had dried on his petition for initiation. You were not there for his initiation, passing or raising. You failed to assist him with his memory work. You failed to introduce him throughout your jurisdiction by not inviting him out to visit other Lodges with you.

You failed to phone him on a regular basis or visit him, to ensure he is not having any difficulties with his memory work.

You failed to invite him and his wife out to a Ladies night, to ensure his wife felt part of the Masonic community. He probably does not know the protocol for these types of social functions as of yet and never assume he does. Basically, you left him standing alone, thus leaving him with the feeling he is not part of the Masonic fraternity, subsequently losing interest in his Lodge and never returning.

This, my brethren, is OUR fault, not the members who lose interest. They lose interest because they are not stimulated in Lodge, their sponsors forget their obligations and most of all, they are being ignored and disregarded amongst the Lodge members who should be taking these new members under their wing and making him feel welcomed and part of the circle.

It is estimated that there is an alarming rate of approximately 20% of new members, usually EA or FC, who have lost interest in the Lodge and have demitted, or not returned.

It is your duty as a sponsor/mentor to ensure, once you petition someone, that you strive to stay with him throughout the entire process. You should be ensuring that the new member is cared for, support and directed throughout the process. This must continue until such time he is either accepted into the circle, which should be automatic,

considering our purpose, or until they are comfortable enough on their own to build their own friendships amongst the brethren.

Don't just assume that because he receives his monthly summons he should feel welcome to attend the stated meetings. Ensure you remind him of the meetings and offer to drive him there for the first few. Be there from his entering the Lodge, signing the porch book, introducing him to members he has not yet met and sit with him. After the close of the Lodge, sit with him at the festive board until it is time to leave.

I have heard of an incident. A friend of mine moved from one province to another. When he visited a Lodge in that jurisdiction, he was surprised to see one of his sponsors from his mother Lodge, who also moved away. His sponsor did not recognize him at first and asked him if he would have a problem with a board of trial. Another friend of mine was sponsored a few years ago and one of his sponsors lived across the street from him. Not once did his sponsor visit or phone him to see how his memory work was or if he required assistance. Luckily, this newly made Mason was a fast learner, a keen member and went though all the degrees by himself, without any assistance from his sponsors at all.

In closing Brethren, if you are going to sponsor someone, be there for him after the ink on his petition dries, from start to finish. I realize that many of us, due to family and work commitments, cannot be there all of the time. But there is always that second person who affixed his signature on that petition and has the same obligation as you do.

Just remember that every new member we lose, we are also losing the possibility of the ten people he may of sponsored throughout his Masonic career and so on. If we, as a fraternity, are to survive, we must remember the duties and obligations owed to our new members. Just remember before you sponsor someone - will you be there for him?

My Brethren, the bottom line is . . .

If we can't keep him interested in Craft Lodge, how do you expect him to join the Shrine?






At the Family Shrine Circus on July 24, the Grand Master and Terry McLean, PR Director, were approached by a lady coming out of the Circus.
