## Recorder's Message

irst, let me bring you all up to date on our financial situation. Let me start by assuring you that we are solvent with respect to our General, Transportation, Lottery, U.S. and Club accounts and we do not owe a dime to anyone.

We will, however, experience a cash flow problem due to the fact that income will be down this year because we do not have a Fantasy Show or Football game in the 2013 program. Our Circus is not the same as in the past and we have been told to expect an income of only \$60,000 for 2013 which is a long way short of the total income from the 2012 Circus which generated for Rameses approximately \$190,000 which, believe it or not, was the least we have ever raised on our Circus in the last 20 years.

As I'm sure most of you are aware, Xentel, our telemarketing group, sold out to a company called I-Mark and they are different (enough said at this time). This year's Circus is run by a different partnership and there will not be telemarketing as was done in the past, it will be done by computer and frankly it's a bit deep for me, but they seem to think it will work, we shall see

Now, to the current investment portfolio. In my last report to you in the May issue of Papyrus, I informed you on February 13th, 2013 that the total value of your financial investment was \$8,598,741.70. Be advised that as of March 14th the total value of our investment is \$8,673,313.00. That's an increase of \$74,572.00 in one month. It won't necessarily follow this pattern every month but I sure hope the Noble that hinted at the first sale meeting that we would likely fritter this money away, is reading this.

We have looked at several properties but only two have captured our attention and we have put forward a conditional offer on one of them. It is within the boundaries we advised you of at the November 2012 meeting and the asking price is also within the amount we indicated we would have to spend on our new digs. Be advised that if (and I repeat if) it goes through, the property will require major renovations, but again the amount in question should keep us well within the amount we feel is justified. Zoning is a major problem with this property and if we can't get it changed we will have to move on and get our deposit returned, however we have not given up looking at other properties in the meantime.

The Potentate's Ball is now past and our next important function is our Special Ladies Luncheon on May 26th, 2013 at 3100 Keele Street and we hope that all our Special Ladies can be here so that we can entertain them once again. Please let the office know if you plan to be here so that we can prepare for your annual visit. You are all very special to us so please try to attend. I must admit that where as I do recognize most of you, there are some that I just can't place and if it looks like I'm ignoring you, I'm not. Just give me an elbow in the ribs to

remind me and be assured I'm looking forward to seeing you all.

Please remember that the west side of 3100 Keele Street is a mess and I suggest once again that you don't park there because you will be up to your ankles in mud. The new owners have not yet replaced the missing asphalt.

On April 29th I have a meeting with the new owners of 3100 Keele Street and I will bring the parking repairs to their attention once again. They have verbally indicated to me that they are not in a rush to have us all leave Keele Street and they have stated that they would like us to stay on as tenants. We, the Shrine, would much rather have our own place by year end, however it's an offer that may have to be looked at if we can't get the new home we are looking for and our Lodges and Scottish Rite may wish to look into this offer as a stop gap situation.

Don't forget our Stated Meeting in Kingston, Ontario on Thursday, June 6th, starting at 7:00 p.m. in the Club Rooms after which we can settle in for a fun weekend. We are, of course, hoping that we will have at least 100 Candidates for this session so it's up to all of us to get cracking and line up a few new Shriners.

The Imperial Session also needs your support. Indianapolis is only a good days drive from Toronto, approximately 450 miles I'm told, so let's all try to support this most important meeting of the year. Not only do we elect a new Imperial Potentate but also we very often make changes to the Imperial By-laws. It's rumoured that, due to the conflict with the Grand Masters of Arkansas and South Carolina that, a motion may be presented for a vote to go to the street in those two states for Shrine members. Now whether you are for that or against it, it represents the thin edge of the wedge in the relationship between their Grand Lodge and the Shrine. Fortunately we have in Canada, Grand Masters and Potentate's who have a good working relationship and frankly we are all just too busy to get into this petty one-upmanship. I know and respect that our Grand Master is the head of Masonry in Ontario and I support his position as such and I do believe he respects the Shrine as well. Is it any wonder that countries go to war when we Masons can't agree on simple common sense issues? It makes me wonder about the 5.P.O.F. A trip to the woodshed may be the answer for these "Masons".

Note, all this money comes from our Transportation Fund.

I wish to thank every Noble for your support of Rameses Shrine and I do appreciate your hard work on behalf of each other and the nearly 500 kids that are in our care.


































## Little Camren presents the big cheque







# Beloved Shriner Red Skelton to be honoured in 2013

2013 marks the 100th birthday of fellow Mason and Shriner Red Skelton

The year 2013 will mark the 100th birthday of fellow Mason and Shriner of 58 years, Richard "Red" Skelton. Red was a member of both the Vincennes Blue Lodge in Vincennes, IN. and Al Malaikah Shriners in Los Angeles, CA.

A tribute to Red - who was often celebrated as the "world's greatest clown" - will be held at the Red Skelton Museum Clown School, on the campus of Vincennes University in Vincennes, IN on June 4-9, 2013.

All Shrine clowns and fraternity members are invited to take part in the commemoration of the life and legacy of Red Skelton. #### The Legacy of Red Skelton

Born the son of a circus clown in 1913, Richard "Red" Skelton was destined to entertain the world. By age 15, Red was employed as a full-time entertainer, with assignments ranging from vaudeville to circus performances. It was not long until Red's slapstick comedic parodies captured the American public's attention. In 1941, Red premiered his own radio show, The Raleigh Cigarette Program. Ten years later, CBS adapted the popular program for television, with Red as their first host televised in colour.

By the 1950s, Red had expanded his performances and appeared in more than 30 MGM films, which included Having a Wonderful Time and Bathing Beauty. In addition to being a television and radio entertainer, Red was also a famed interpretive clown and, in 1989, was inducted into the International Clown Hall of Fame in Baraboo, WI.

Near the end of his life, Red enjoyed the fine arts of writing, music and painting. Some of his best work is displayed at the Red Skelton Museum, including scrapbooks and photos of his eclectic life. Brother Red is buried at the Forest Lawn Memorial Park Cemetery in Glendale, California.
