For the record, our Marshal Noble Michael Webb had a major family problem on this weekend and he could not be with us. We do hope that all is well and we look forward to seeing his smiling face at our next meeting. I must add that Nobel Mark Smith of the Oshawa and District Shrine Club filled in as Marshal this weekend and he did a great job on such a short notice. Thank you Mark for your help. It was appreciated.

To all the other Nobles who worked on this Ceremonial in whatever capacity and yes I know you all, I do thank you. Please know that your help is always appreciated by me.

I know that many of you want to know what is happening with our headquarters at 3100 Keele Street and it is my intention to keep you all informed as we go forward. The meeting of November 17th was reasonably well attended and the motion to sell 3100 Keele Street was almost unanimous. We did not need to count the negative votes as it was clear to all that less than 20 Nobles voted against the sale and that the balance of the Nobles present voted to sell. There were approximately 470 Nobles present for the vote.

The closing date for the sale is January 18th, 2013 and there are a few details that need to be cleaned up between now and then but be assured our Broker, Noble Jeff Laceby is working hard to get all the pieces in place bearing in mind that we have a group of very important tenants to look after and we will not abandon their lease or well being under any circumstances.

We have a few locations to look at for our new home but nothing to report to you at this time. Be assured that I will keep you informed the minute we see a property that has potential for us and all options will be on the table. Please be advised that we are conscious of your concern and we will try to make the final move as simple as possible.

The Banner Exchange held on January 5th was very disappointing. I think half the Temple Units and many members of the new executives did not show up. Be advised Nobles, you do not have Unit status until your President, Captain or Director is installed and if such is your case, I would suggest you contact the office so that your installation can be scheduled within this month of January.

In the last issue of Papyrus, I expressed concern about our rapid drop in membership and I stated that we were down to 3,700 members. Let me revise that number. The final count at year end is 3,550 members and I read out 38 requests for demit at our January 5th meeting, so by the time you read this, the round figure will be 3,500 Nobles in Rameses Shrine. What is the problem? I'm sure every one has an opinion and they likely show a variety of reasons, so let me give you mine.

The tea service was presented to the Club at our regular meeting in October by John Sommerville and Judy Robertson in memory of their late uncle, Morley MacKenzie. Illustrious Sir M.E. Morley was a member of the Sudbury Shrine Club and married Florence Morrison while in Sudbury as manager of the Royal Bank.

During his travels as Imperial Potentate, he was presented with many gifts at different functions, but his wife was presented with the beautiful sterling silver tea service by the Potentate of Rameses Temple. The Sudbury Shrine Club was thrilled to receive the treasure and has provided a special cabinet to prominently display it.

Morley was elected as the Potentate of Rameses Temple in 1933, and again in 1934 and 1935. These have been referred to as "The Golden Age of Rameses Temple". Then in 1943 he was elected as Imperial Potentate - the second of only three Rameses Shriners to ever serve in this position. Illustrious Sir Morley had an outstanding and distinguished career in the banking sector and with Calvert Distilleries, where a superior brand of whiskey was named after him!

It was largely due to Noble MacKenzie's efforts during the Second World War that the Mystic Shrine contributed in excess of \$50,000 to the Evening Telegram's British War Victim's Fund. The charitable work of the Shrine on behalf of orthopaedic children was a major interest of Noble MacKenzie. During his first year as Potentate, Rameses held a golf tournament at the Royal York Golf Club where the entry fee of \$2.50 per person included your meal. In 1934, the Potentate's Ball cost \$3 per couple for a dinner and dance. That year Rameses also held a raffle on a new Deluxe Chevrolet sedan, valued at \$1,030. 2012 suspensions are down significantly

Thank you to all the Nobles that worked hard this year to help recruit new members as well as retain those who, for many reasons, were about to be removed from the roles. In particular thank you to the membership committee (Nobles Doug Foss, Dennis Hope, Mark Smith, Bill Sweet) who help support their regions with resources and encouragement.

Rameses Shriners did not receive a membership banner this year. A bronze had been awarded to us the last three years. That means we had a membership decline greater than last year. We lost 192 members or about 5%. Our 5-year loss has been about 20%. At this point in the article, many of you are cringing. Don't, there are many positives for future growth.

This year we reported 76 suspensions, last year 81 and a 5-year average of 90 per year. Suspensions as you see are down significantly with thanks to the efforts of the Divan and membership committee and a campaign by the Imperial Membership Committee. Demits unfortunately are up this year 98, last year 96, in the years previously the number was around 30. What changed - our dues structure. This number should return to its historic level in the coming years especially with your continued support.

The black camel saw 120 Nobles leave us this year. Many fine Shrine Masons who contributed to the order. That is close to our average of 105 per year. This number will not decline in the near future. Roughly 20% of the Nobility is over 80.

Rameses Shriners create about 75 new Nobles a year. As our Recorder has often mentioned we have a low percentage of Masons as Shriners. There are, according to the 2012 Grand Lodge Proceedings, just over 43,000 Masons in Ontario. An educated guess would put the Shrine population in Ontario at 6,000 Nobles or 14%. The Temples who have gains consistently are 70% or greater.

Please let me state the obvious; there are 86% or 37,000 Masons who are not Shriners. Have they been asked? Nobles it is up to all of us to actively recruit our Masonic friends.

The best way to promote our fraternity is to attend Lodge, be a role model of an active Shrine Mason. In the banquet hour quietly speak to the new members (casual chat is better than standing up in Lodge and speaking for 5 minutes) about the advantages of being a Shriner, and what happens at a meeting.

Many of the Clubs and Units have discovered over the years that Master Mason nights have limited success. We need to go to them. "If you build it they will come" works well in the movies but maybe we need to let the brethren know we have built it.

Take a few minutes to think about how being a Shriner has helped you become a better Mason or how it has enhanced your Masonic experience. That is what you want to relate to the prospective member. Tell the Brother why you and I are Shriners. The "what we do" and "how we do it" can be left for another conversation. Send me an email or note on how the Shrine has enhanced your Masonic life.

Nobles, with the exception of one statistic above, we can create a change, stop the bleeding and experience growth. It just takes a little extra effort from many to achieve our goal.




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
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


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Noble Barry Leslie Jones - March 9, 1942 to January 11, 2013

Noble Harry Korman - a life of extreme joys and profound sorrows

Reprinted by kind permission of The Hamilton Spectator oble Harry was an avid Shriner and long-standing member of the Hamilton Motor Patrol who recently passed away on October 22, 2012. He was your normal, hard working dedicated Shriner that blended in quite well with our Shrine family however, shortly before illness locked his memories away forever, he told his story for the benefit of his children, grandchildren and history. Thanks to a recent article published in our local newspaper, The Hamilton Spectator, and with their permission, edited, we pass it along.

It was Harry Korman's smile that struck you first, an ear-to-

ear grin that immediately gave you that warm and fuzzy feeling. He had every reason to smile; a successful business career, a 47 year marriage, two children, four grandchildren and a wide circle of friends in the Shriners, the Masonic Lodge and his synagogue. That was the life that he left behind on his passing.

Before those happy years, there was another life in another world, under other names. A life where a nineyear-old boy named Chaskel

Bernstein saw his father shot down in the street and his neighbours herded into a ghetto to die of hunger or shipped off to a death factory.

Harry Korman was born Chaskel Bernstein in 1932 in Stanislawow, Poland. He lived a normal kids' life filled with school, soccer, friends, parents Sam and Sally and sister Natasha. That all changed in 1939 when first Russian, then the Germans swept over Stanislawow. It was during that 2nd invasion that Sam was killed and Sally and Natasha fled deep into Russia.

For 18 months, the young boy lived in the forest with a group of other refugees, emerging at night to seek food and, "to do whatever damage they could" to the Germans. Much of the sabotage was planned around information attained by 10-year-old Chaskel brazenly walking the streets protected only by the disregard German guards paid to a child. It was still a game to him, where were soldiers sleeping, how large a force they had and how many tanks, just anything that would be of interest to their enemy.

A year and a half later the tide of war changed and the Germans retreated in the face of an avenging Red army. Chaskel and his sister, Natasha, by then a nurse in the Czech army unit attached to the Russians, were reunited. Young Chaskel joined them to be near his sister and was taken under the wing of a Czech officer named Rupp. He took the name Julius Rupp and gained a reputation of being a fierce warrior. In one incident, as the Soviets waged bitter street by street, house by house, battles through Prague, a 13 year old Rupp, ducked into an apartment building and while groping in the dark, grabbed a live wire that knocked him unconscious. When he awoke there was no more street fighting, however, as he opened the door quietly, he spotted nine German soldiers resting, thinking the war had passed them by.

"I took my machine gun and just started spraying bullets at them, I felt okay about that", he said. "I did not feel anything bad as we were sent there to shoot Germans, so what the hell".

From one of the deceased soldiers, he took an accordion and taught himself how to play it.

As he had for the Polish partisans, young Rupp served as a

front line spy, gathering information that would be used to plan future attacks. It was on one of those missions that he was captured.

He told that story to the Canadian Jewish Chronicle in 1948. Tortured by the SS into giving up the location of his unit, he instead led 120 Germans into an ambush.

In 1948 at the age of 15, Chaskel Bernstein, still with his accordion, his sister Natasha and her husband immigrated to Canada.

Chaskel was adopted by Joe and Shaindel Korman. They had very successful businesses however, no children.

Under his new name of Harry Korman, the former boy soldier helped run those enterprises, played music with the likes of Ronnie Hawkins and Levon Helm, palled around with hockey great Dave Keon, married at age 32 to wife Doreen and started a family.

Harry was a member of Brant Lodge #663, Murton Lodge of Perfection and Moore Consistory. He crossed the hot sands in 1978 to become a Rameses Shriner.

In the eulogy he delivered at Harry's funeral, grandnephew Davis Halporn grasped for the meaning of a life filled with such extremes of tragedy and happiness.

"How can we explain this"? "That our Harry came out of that black hole not bitter and hardened, but hopeful, tender and kind. That was his spark and the tragedies of his youth simply could not put it out"

For Chaskel Bernstein/Julius Rupp/Harry Korman, the fact he survived at all could only be explained by the Yiddish word, "bashert" - Fate!!

"It was strictly bashert that I survived," He said at the end of his recorded interview. "It was just meant to be".

Yes, under that Fez, we may never know or appreciate the true heroes in our midst and the hardships they have faced, but needless to say, their numbers are many and they do indeed make us all very proud to be a Shriner.

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
