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Recorder's Message

Welcome back Nobles to the Fall session of Rameses Shrine activity. The summer weather was a bit of a dud for most people and there is no doubt that this is a summer we will all remember and mostly without affection.

The good news, that I'm sure you are all aware of, is that we have purchased our new home and the address is 124-126 Queens Plate Drive, Toronto. That's very close to the Woodbine Race Track and Casino and it faces onto Highway 27. It's easy to get to from the 401 exit on to Islington North to Rexdale Boulevard, West on Rexdale Boulevard to Queens Plate. It is approximately 12 kilometers west of our present location and for those of us who live on the east side of town, we can add, on a good traffic day, 10-15 minutes to our journey. I live in Pickering and I'm not concerned by a few more minutes of travel.

I personally looked at dozens of potential locations and your Divan put conditional offers on three of them, however in all three, the zoning condition on them was not to our advantage and we withdrew our offers. This property meets our zoning requirements and has been checked out by our real estate broker and our lawyer.

We are scheduled to take possession of our new headquarters on September 30th, however, this may be moved forward to September 25th to accommodate both the seller and us, the buyer.

We are presently working with our architect on the interior layout and that will likely take until the end of October. Once we approve the new layout, the architect will submit the plans for a building permit. This will probably take another four to six weeks to get approved, however, it may be that wait time has improved over the years.

The architect will then submit the approved plans to the

three reliable and financially sound contractors who will submit their quotation and completion date to the architect in a sealed envelope. These envelopes will be opened in the boardroom with all members of the Divan present. These quotations will be reviewed and the contract awarded. We will advise all our members at that time and work will commence immediately. I am being asked by many of our Shriners when we intend to move in and regrettably I cannot answer that question at this time,

however be advised that as soon as a completion date is established you will be advised; we will not move until all the work has been completed and my best guess is that we will still be at Keele Street for the month of January 2014. In the meantime, all our regular annual functions will take place at Keele Street including the Fall Ceremonial, the Carol Service on December 15th and it is very possible that out Annual Divan Election to be held on January 11th, 2014 will also be at Keele Street but be assured, I will keep you all posted on any and all changes as they are made. If you don't hear from me, it's business as usual.

Naturally we hope that all our Nobles will be pleased with our choice but I'm under no illusions that it will please everyone.

We hope to be able to have our Fall Ceremonial, The Special Ladies, Carol Service and Thanksgiving Dinner possibly at Queens Plate however we will likely take the Potentate's Ball to the local hotel. Those of us who been Shriners for over 40 years will well remember when the highlight of the year was the Potentate's Ball held year after year at the Royal York Hotel.

This November issue of Papyrus shows the list of Election and Installation dates on page 22. Be advised that if the day and date are not suitable to your Club or Unit, call me with your preferred date and I will try very hard to comply with your request. The Divan Noble who will conduct your election will be in contact with you promptly so that he can set up his visitation schedule.

The Scottish Rite has moved out of Keele Street and things are fairly quiet here in the evening. Let me repeat for the benefit of our local Clubs and Units who use Keele Street, you need to dispose of all your old equipment now while we have the time. Please note you will have minimal space at the new location and I respectfully ask that you only keep that which you use regularly. We will move it for you at the appropriate time but heavy boxes and equipment will not be handled so please Nobles, start sorting it out now. We will dump it for you. Note if you require certain items for the Fall Ceremonial, it's OK to keep it here but let us know what to dump so that we don't throw out an item or piece of equipment you still want to use. Thanks Nobles for your co-operation.

Be advised that Illustrious Sir Fred Clarke has completed nine years as your Representative to the Canadian Hospital in Montreal and Imperial Bylaws state that his time is up. Nine years is the limit set for this very important commitment and Illustrious Sir Fred has served with dedication and next time you see Illustrious Sir Fred, it wouldn't hurt to thank him for his service to Rameses and the kids he so obviously cares for. You have served us well Illustrious Sir Fred and on behalf of all Rameses Nobles, I thank you most sincerely for a job well done.

I look forward to spending time with you all as the year winds down and don't forget that your questions are important to me so don't hesitate to pick up the phone or email me with your question or request and I'll respond by return mail.

My thanks to all Nobles for your support in 2013 and I trust you will continue to support Rameses as you have in the past. My thanks to all of you for just being Shriners.

mperial representatives of Shriners International voted to make a change to its articles of incorporation regarding membership at the 139th Imperial Session. The prerequisite requiring that members of Shriners International are first members of Freemasonry (Masons) in good standing has been amended to exclude the requirement for the state of Arkansas.

This legislation was brought forth by the two Shrine Temples in Arkansas following the Arkansas Grand Lodge edict last November that would no longer allow anyone to remain an Arkansas Mason AND an Arkansas Shriner. Shriners International has always had a Masonic prerequisite and regrets that the actions of the Arkansas Grand Lodge made the passage of this legislation necessary to preserve the existence of the two Shrine Temples in Arkansas.

Shriners International is committed to maintaining open lines of communication with the Grand Lodge of Arkansas to encourage amicable relationships for current and future Masons and Shriners. This change does not affect other Shriners across the country, and the organization remains a fraternity based on fun, fellowship and the Masonic principles of brotherly love, relief and truth.

Shriners International's primary focus continues to be its philanthropic mission to support Shriners Hospitals for Children, a world-renowned health care system with 22 facilities in the United States, Canada and Mexico.



When Gene arrived he would grab an extinguisher and run up to the first door see my extinguisher and Fez than went to claim another door. When he came out of the tent and looked around he would see me with a silly grin on my face.

It was a pleasure having Gene as a friend and working with him at the circus. I would often see him walking along with a smile on his face and when he spotted me he would suddenly do a funny little dance. This past year there was a smile but his steps were slower his voice softer and there was no funny little dance but when I asked Gene if everything was alright he would say "I have a sore back". This year I think was the first time Gene missed a circus in 36 years - he missed one day. Noble Gene Davis passed away suddenly on August 18th, 2013. Gene, we will all miss you.




"Show me the bubbles!"





livia has cerebral palsy, which affects her mobility. She was originally diagnosed at Shriners Hospitals for Children, Chicago, but since moving to South Carolina, she has been cared for by the Shriners Hospital in Greenville, S.C.

Olivia has benefited from Shriners Hospitals' expertise in treating the orthopaedic effects of cerebral palsy and in movement analysis. In the movement analysis laboratories, available at 12 Shriners Hospitals facilities, high-speed cameras, reflective markers, force platforms and muscle sensors combine to record and measure how a child with a mobility impairment is moving. A team of medical professionals can then determine the best treatment plan to help the child improve. After reviewing the data from Olivia's analysis, her team recommended surgery to lengthen her heel cords and hamstrings. After surgery at age 6 and rehabilitative therapy, Olivia, now 10, has a perfect walking gait and can run, dance, jump on a trampoline, ride a bicycle and keep up with her peers.
