



Isn't it great to be a Shriner . . . it's Feztastic!

I have the magic formula for success - and what is success?

here's a story about John F. Kennedy, the late President of the United States. As he was touring NASA and its operations, during the tour he walked by a man with cleaning supplies. JFK paused and asked him what he did at NASA. The janitor responded that he was "helping put a man on the moon". He was a successful man.

What would we say about Shriners International? Does it have this magic formula for success? Is the Shrine built to last? Will it transition from good to great and if so, how?

As we become comfortable and settled into our new home at 124 Queen's Plate Drive, or work into our new Webfez Temple Membership System, which is still a work in progress.

The uniqueness of Shriners International is that it relies on people to develop people to have fun with a purpose.

Remember "YOU" are the magic ingredient in Shriners International success and as Mother Theresa said "if you can't feed 100 people, feed one" and as I say, if we can't each bring in 100 new Nobles, be passionate, be persistent, go out and sell yourself and the Shrine to bring in one.

I love the Shrine and believe "Failure is not an Option". I often read articles about high profile leaders and how they would apply or relate their strategies, ideas or formulas to Shrine International.

I like to look at best practices of successful individuals, volunteers or new volunteers.

As I read articles, no entrepreneur sells himself quite like Sir Richard Branson, founder of the Virgin Group, a conglomerate of more than 400 companies including Virgin Atlantic Airways. He provides valuable lessons for the business world and aspiring leaders and says why business people can't speak simply, free of jargon and confusing concepts.

He doesn't speak for other people but dyslexia shaped his and Virgin's communication style. Branson said from the beginning, Virgin used clear ordinary language and if he could quickly understand a campaign concept, it was good to go. If something can't be explained off the back of an envelope, it's rubbish. He says too many business professionals underestimate the power of simplicity in pitching their stories, ideas or presenting their products.

An early Google investor once said if an entrepreneur cannot explain his product or idea in fewer than 10 words, an investor loses interest clearly.

Branson values simplicity as well and said he once pitched a business plan that fit on a beermat. This idea was for low-cost Domestic Airline in Australia to take on Quantas and Ansett Airlines, that "beermat" pitch became Virgin Blue, now Virgin Australia.

Although that is Richard Branson's style, it may capture imagination with bold and inspiring visions. I am not recommending or suggesting we use beermats and envelopes for suggestions and ideas. If we can encourage change to help empower Nobles, to realize their dreams through fun and fellowship of Shrine Masons.

We may not help put a man on the moon, or bring in 100 new Nobles, but we could make a difference in the lives of our members and children in Shriners Hospitals.

Whatever it takes or how we make it happen, what the world needs now is more Shrine Masons.

Let us all work together in harmony, have a vision to keep the red fez smiling.

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
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Remembering Illustrious Sir Hugh Pancoast PP
