President and "Boss Hawg" for the upcoming year. With the success of last year's events this year should also be a hit.


The new executive is working hard, planning events and activities for 2015.





pilot at the Erie Hospital and opened some exciting possibilities for two new Shrine children.



The award is presented to an individual 55 years and older, who has demonstrated outstanding commitment to community involvement.

Charles Rycroft has spent most of his life giving to others and he's not stopping anytime soon. In fact, the 90-year-old Whitby resident is still so involved in his community that to attend a ceremony held recently in recognition of local volunteers, he had to skip one of his regular commitments.

Noble Charles Rycroft's passion for volunteering began when he was a 10-year-old Boy Scout during the Great Depression. He would spend his Saturday mornings helping refurbish toys to provide Christmas gifts for needy children.

At the age of 16, he joined the military and went on to serve in Europe and Japan during the Second World War. Other roles he's taken on throughout his life include president of the Ontario Regiment, an active member of All Saints' Anglican Church, president of the Rotary Club of Whitby, president of the Whitby YMCA, and director of the Whitby Chamber of Commerce, among countless others.

In 2012, Noble Charles Rycroft and his late wife, Eleanor, were both recipients of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal for exemplary service to their community.

Noble Charles also served as a trustee of Trafalgar Castle for 14 years, served on the Whitby District High School board for three years and was President of both the Whitby YMCA and the Whitby Rotary Club. As well as being involved with the Whitby Chamber of Commerce, the Royal Canadian Legion and the County Town Singers.

A lifelong member of All Saint's Anglican Church, Noble Charles taught Sunday school for more than 10 years, served as church warden for three, was treasurer and planner for a new church hall and was President of the Men's Club whose first charter was to re-establish Scouting in Whitby.

While involved with Rotary, Noble Charles was instrumental in saving the Whitby Lawn Bowling Club from bankruptcy and played a key role in the construction of the Green Street Seniors' Housing Complex where his mother became one of the first residents.

As chairman of the Rotary's Disabled Children's committee, he organized a successful transportation program, using 52 Rotarian drivers, to drive children to special programs in Oshawa.

More than 50 years later, those same children, now adults often express their thanks and gratitude. It was programs like this and his ongoing commitment to Rotary.



that he received the highest honour available to Rotarians, the Paul Harris Fellowship along with numerous other honours and awards recognizing his many years of service including his time as President of the Ontario Regiment Association and as a 62-year member of the Masons.

Always putting others before himself, in 1957 as the beneficiary of the David T. Campbell Educational Fund bequest, Noble Charles used the funds through his work with the Masons, resulting in 400 young men continuing their educational pursuits.

Noble Charles has not only served his community well but also his country. At the age of 16, he enlisted in the militia and became a Staff Sergeant instructing in the many aspects of soldiering.

In 1943, he moved into active service with the Ontario Regiment serving in both Europe and Japan during the Second World War and for that, and many more reasons, we are truly grateful.

# **Membership news**

ello Nobles, the last time I was Membership Chairman for Rameses Shriners was in 1999 so I am looking for a lot of help this year.

In January the Membership Committee has started working, and as of January 14, 2015, we have 172 members that have not paid their dues for 2014. Current outstanding dues for 2015 is 907 of our 3,140 members. We need everyone asking "Have you received your dues card for 2015?" and the Ambassadors to help in locating members who are behind in dues, as you can see we will drop below 3,000 members in just the Nobles that owe dues, not counting deaths and demits.

What also troubles me is the fact that the Shrine in Ontario only has what I call market share (meaning total Masons), approximately 14% of that membership. As we can only take from this pool, we must address this by actively reaching out to those Masons with correct information. The average percentage of Masons joining the Shrine in North America is 24%, and it ranges to as high as 80% in North Dakota, if we are able to increase to close to the average, then we would double what we are today.

As we have many active Shrine Masons we need to be more open with information to the Lodges and their members as this is the only place we can recruit new members. If we were trying to operate a business with this type of market share, we would disappear. Please help the Divan turn this around.

For those who are planning on attending the Seminar at Rameses in March, let us talk and come up with ideas on how all of us can make a difference in membership at Rameses Shriners.
