"The Call" of Shriners International

was asked by several Nobles; "what is this Call" and what is its purpose? This "Call" basically is the document issued by the Imperial Council prior to the Imperial Council Session in the summer period.

It includes the names of Imperial Officers, their rank and responsibilities, the names of the Captain of the Guards, the Imperial Marshal's Aides and the Officers responsible for the various departments i.e. Insurance, Membership, Fraternal Relations etc.

There is also a section devoted to the Shriners Hospital for Children, who the Officers are, and their function.

All these things are important issues to the Shriner, however, the main function of the "The Call" is to record the items that are on the agenda for approval or rejection by the Temple representatives.

Question? What is a representative and what is his function?

The important item to the Nobles is who is the representative and how does he get to be a representative? The Imperial Council By-law, Article 3-20, 3.5 Elected Representatives states that each Temple is entitled to one Elected Representative or 2 if its membership exceeds 300 or 3 if membership exceeds 600 or 4 if its membership exceeds 1,000. For this purpose, the membership of a Temple is determined as of December 31st. Immediately preceding its annual meeting, a Temple is entitled to no more than 4 Elected Representatives.

Rameses has 4 Elected representatives and myself as all Past Imperial Officers are representatives *ad vitam*. It has been customary to have the top four positions on the Divan be Representatives to Imperial Council Sessions for Rameses Shriners. Any Noble can be nominated and elected as a Representative by the membership.

In "The Call" there is a list of items the Imperial Officers, or a Temple wishes to have accepted as part of the Shrine Organization. It could be a change in operating procedures, a change in Temple boundaries or a change in membership procedure.

The items for approval are presented to the Assembly of Representatives.

If the item is moved and receives a seconder, the question is put to a vote of the Representatives for acceptance or rejection. If the motion is approved, the item is accepted and included in the Imperial Council By-Laws and is law.

A quorum of Representatives consists of 150 Representatives, at least 85 of whom are members of different Temples.

One must mention there was a \$15 per capita tax increase. This fifteen-dollar increase will hopefully provide a long-term solution to ensure the Shrine's future, in addition to inflation, also impacting the Shrine situation. MEMBERSHIP!

It is no secret that the loss of Shrine membership continues to pose a challenge to our great fraternity. If the representatives had voted against a tax increase, most of the services that the Imperial Council provides would have been limited or likely cancelled. This would severely disrupt the entire infrastructure of our fraternity.

These services include financial services and seminars such as Assistant Rabbans, Oriental Guides, Membership and including the modernization of our Educational program with several more seminars and support for the Annual Imperial Council Session. It was deemed a necessity for leadership training and technology to modernize and to accommodate Nobles paying his dues, we are looking at setting up alternate payment methods, payment plans or an automatic withdraw system online or credit card payment and most of all, personal contact.

TREASURER'S REPORT

obles, for those of you who did not make the trip to the Houston Imperial Session, I would like to try and let you know what happened.

The Colorado reps voted to retain the Oversight Committee. This is the Committee which looks at all of the finances and transactions of the Shriners Hospitals and now has NO Imperial Officers on it.

The Shriners Hospital statement showed a net decrease in assets from operating and other activities of approximately \$83,000,000.

On the fraternal side the Iowa Corporation which runs Shriners International incurred a loss of \$1,302,000. After much discussion, both for and against the motion, the first item on the call to raise the Per Capita Tax by \$15 passed.

ats off to Belleville on a very successful Spring Ceremonial! Congratulations to Director General Noble Clarence Stevenson, his committee, all the members and their Ladies who made this event memorable.

The Imperial Session in Houston, Texas was very busy with many items to be dealt with, one being Imperial Sir Dale Stauss being elected Chairman of the Board defeating Imperial Sir Doug Maxwell.

Another item on the agenda was the Tampa Per Capita Assessment. The last two years there has been a debate on increasing the per capita assessment, each year it was voted down. This year it was voted for an increase from \$15 to \$30, starting January 2016. This will increase our annual dues at Rameses to \$135 per year. The last time there was a per capita increase was in 2004.

Many of our Nobles and Ladies visiting Houston took time to tour the Shrine Hospital. This was a very informative tour that was given to us by the Hospital Administrator, Cathy Moniaci. The original hospital opened in 1920 as the Arabia Temple Cripple Children's Clinic and has since moved to the current location in 1996. The new location has eight floors and every aspect of care that a child could need. Everything from surgery rooms, orthotics, radiology, occupational, physical and speech therapy, rehab pools, motion analysis lab, outpatient clinic, school room and play areas just to name a few. The Houston Shrine Hospital also has 4 apartments in house to provide for patients and families as needed.

If you ever have the opportunity to visit Shrine Hospitals, please do so. The professional and personal care that is given to these children in need, by the doctors and staff is number one. If you know of a child that should be in Shrine care, do not hesitate to start the process.

As the Divan and their Ladies and many of Rameses Shriners were in Houston, the Circus was going for 12 days in Markham. Many thanks to Circus Director Rik Kubiak and family, Barb and Karen, our Temple soloist Ted McClenny, Bob Jones, all the

Congratulations to Imperial Sir Ed Stoltz who was elected as the Imperial Outer Guard.

Imperial Sir Dale Stauss narrowly defeated Imperial Sir Doug Maxwell as President and Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the hospital by 13 votes (over 950 votes).

At the pageant, Imperial First Lady Lisa Gantt announced her Project "In Dreams I Walk". The proceeds of her Project will go to Osteogenesis Imperfecta research. The First Lady also introduced Carter Brown an O.I. Patient who is being treated at our Shriners Hospital for Children - Canada in Montreal. What a great Patient Ambassador for the Shrine. He, in my opinion, stole the show at the pageant.



What is an "Emeritus" designation?

ave you ever wondered what the heck "Emeritus" means and how you receive that designation?

You have probably seen it on some Fezzes and heard the word spoken.

It is hard enough for a lot of us just to pronounce it even if we don't know what it means.

So I pulled out Mr. Webster and looked it up. Emeritus: First you say it "E merit us".

The key is the word "merit" contained in the middle. This means a person is made "emeritus" based on their merit.

Now I know what the word means. How do you achieve this title as a Shriner?

I called an Old Friend and Noble and this is what I learned. "Emeritus" is an honorary title conferred to a Noble in recognition of the value of their continued contribution, participation and mentoring as well as their

long and valued association with the Shrine.

There are two ways a Noble may achieve the Emeritus Designation.

Rameses Rules are that the person must hold the office or position for at least seven (7) years and then the Potentate can make the appointment, however he must first get full approval from his Elected Divan, then it is presented to the membership at a Stated Meeting where it must receive their unanimous approval before proceeding with the appointment.

OR

If a Noble has served Ten (10) consecutive years (amended in 2013 from 15 years) in an office or position he is automatically granted "Emeritus Status" which has to be approved by The Imperial Bylaws.

So now you know that an Emeritus Noble is a well-deserved honour which these Nobles have worked hard to achieve.





Shriners Hospitals for Children® has a long history of developing and improving available treatments for OI, and there is now more hope for these children and families than ever before. Still, research takes time, and the treatments are quite costly.

Over time, First Lady Lisa Gantt has become increasingly aware of the impact of OI on children and families, and is determined to make a difference. Her program, *In Dreams I Walk*, will provide additional funds to support Shriners Hospitals for Children's efforts in the treatment and research of OI.
