



Shawn has been a Shriner since 1996 when he and his stepfather (Doug Ewles, Ramoca Shriners) walked the hot sands in Peterborough together.




MPPs it was another of our several successful fundraisers instituted in the last couple of years. Any ideas for another, let the Prez know so we can top up the Club coffers.



# **Belleville Firefighters donation**

n Wednesday, 28 September 2016, at their first fall General Dinner Meeting, a generous donation cheque in the amount of \$5,000 was presented by the Chief of the Belleville Shrine Club Firefighters Unit, Noble Lloyd Kellett, to Noble John Neil, Board Director with the Montreal Shriners Hospital for Children.

The Belleville Shrine Club was a very active and growing Club in the 1970s and 1980s with well over 200 members. A group of members proposed an alternate option of joining the Club's Camel Herders Unit to take part in parades. They formed the Belleville Shrine Firefighters Unit in 1984.

The members of the new Unit bought a 1949 Bickle-Seagrave Ladder Fire Truck from the City of Belleville and started fundraising and parading with the Club's Camel Herder Unit.



In the early years of the Unit funds were raised by hosting an annual Rodeo. This worked well for a few years providing sufficient funds to pay the expenses of operating a fire truck and also donating funds towards our Shrine Hospital Transportation Fund. The Rodeo business wore thin,

and the Unit moved to working bingos at the local bingo hall on Pinnacle Street. This proved to be a very lucrative fundraiser in the late 1980s and 1990s.

The fire truck was in need of some very extensive repair work in the early 1990s and the Unit members decided a complete rebuild of the truck was warranted. The truck was completely dismantled at Central Taxi Garage under the direction of Noble Grant Devolin in the winter of '93-'94. The frame was sandblasted and painted, as well as all body panels and ladders. A brand new GM engine and automatic transmission was installed with new wheels, tires, and suspension parts.

The new 1949 fire truck made its debut at the Belleville Shrine Ceremonial Parade in June of 1994. The Firefighter Unit continued to do well with the bingos and was able to donate many thousands of dollars to the Shrine Hospital Transportation Fund over the years.

A move to the new Bingo Hall on Highway 62 followed the closing

of the Pinnacle Street facility. Bingo revenue started to fall off for a number of reasons in the new millennium, but still provided sufficient funds to keep the Unit afloat and provide funding for the kids.



The local Bingo Hall on highway 62 closed last year, and the Unit was left without a source of funding. The Unit membership had shrunk to only a few members and they were not in a position to chase alternate fundraising activities.

The Unit members decided to close the Unit and sell the fire truck. On the dissolving of the Unit, all remaining reserve funds were donated to the Canadian Shrine Hospital.



Building Fund (\$5,000), and to the Belleville Shrine Club (\$3,471.86). The Fire Truck is still for sale if anyone is interested!

Shriners have operated a paediatric orthopaedic hospital in Montreal since 1925.

The Hospital on Cedar Street served the children well for many years, but was showing signs of age and not large enough to meet the current needs of serving our children.

A new Hospital was proposed, as part of the new McGill University Hospital Complex on Decarie Blvd. in Montreal. Approvals were received, plans were drawn, and a new Hospital was under construction in 2013. The new Hospital is approximately two and a half times as large as the older facility, designed for children, built to the most current standards and fitted with the most advanced medical equipment. The construction budget was \$130 million.

The new Hospital opened on October 5th, 2015. An aggressive capital campaign to raise the required dollars was started in 2012 and was closed in May 2016. The target was met. The Belleville Firefighters Unit contribution was part of the Rameses Shrine commitment to this project.

The Canadian Shrine Hospital in Montreal is one of 22 Shrine funded and operated children's hospitals across North America. The Canadian Shrine hospital in Montreal is a bilingual, acute care centre providing paediatric orthopaedic ultraspecialized treatment for complex disorders such as osteogenesis imperfecta (brittle bone disease), severe spinal and limb anomalies, reconstructive surgery and rehabilitation.

This donation of \$5,000 from the Belleville Shrine Club Firefighters Unit was well received showing the mandated commitment of the Nobles of the Shrine Club to continue to find ways of helping support their Shrine Hospitals, especially in Canada.

and accomplishments of our great fraternity, a section available for temples, clubs and units to provide interesting photos and captions, and a section for nobles to submit a picture and a brief narrative, as well as directory listings by nobles along with their temple. There will also be a section listing nobles by city and state. A percentage of the proceeds generated by the directory will be provided to Shriners International to augment available support for nobles and temples.

A significant benefit of the membership directory to all nobles is the ability to cost-effectively verify and update their member data. 


