


Director John Hindle and Lady Susan and their committee have organized a very special day for our Special Ladies Sunday, 28 May.



Potentate picks up the cheque



Honoring and Remembering Imperial Sir Jack Jones February 8, 1932 - April 27, 2017

MPERIAL SIR JACK H. JONES worked tirelessly over the past 37 years to support and serve the fraternity at the national level. He served Shriners International as Imperial Recorder for 36 years, Executive Vice President for five, Imperial Potentate for one, and received countless accolades and honours, including the Imperial Potentate's Award of Merit, which is the highest honor in the fraternity. Jack was also known as one of the most dedicated and genuine people to work alongside – a reputation he has earned by leading the fraternity with grace and pride.

Imperial Sir Jack Jones was initially elected Imperial Recorder in 1979, and served in that position, or as Imperial Potentate, until

During much of his time as Imperial Recorder, he also served as Director of Membership Development. Imperial Sir Jack Jones also served as Chairman of the Masonic Relations and DeMolay Committees during the majority of this time.

During his time as Imperial Potentate, Imperial Sir Jones focused on bringing people together, developing modern membership solutions and realizing and recognizing the fraternity's global impact and its potential. Jones' theme for the year was "Unity Wins." Imperial Sir Jack Jones did not permit his confinement to a wheelchair to confine his spirit or his travels. He was a frequent speaker at Masonic events throughout the world and was a well-known and well-respected Masonic leader.


While serving Shriners International, Jones also met many high-profile figures, including the Queen of England and President Ronald Reagan, who he had the privilege of personally making an honorary member of the fraternity. While serving as Imperial Potentate, Jones also had the pleasure of meeting the world's oldest man and 113-year-old Shriner, Walter Breuning.



"Imperial Sir Jack Jones has been a fixture on the boards of Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children for decades," said Imperial Potentate Chris Smith. "With the passing of Jack Jones, all Masons and all Shriners have experienced a great loss. He was a truly great Shriner, an example to all."

Obituary

JONES, Jack H. 85, of Seminole, FL passed away April 27, 2017. He was born in Dalton, GA and was a resident of Florida for 48 years. While serving with the Air Force, Mr. Jones attended the University of Southern Mississippi and the University of Tampa, where he majored in business administration. During the 2016 Imperial Session, Mr. Jones was re-elected Imperial Recorder of Shriners International, a position he held for 36 years. As Imperial Recorder, he served on the Board of Directors for Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children. He also served as Imperial Potentate of Shriners International in 2009-2010, and as the Executive Vice President of Shriners International from 2010 to 2015. He is a recipient of several Masonic awards, including the Benjamin Franklin Medal from the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania; the Henry Price Medal from the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts; the Andrew Jackson Medal from the Grand Lodge of Tennessee; and The Distinguished Service Award from the Grand Lodge of New York (posthumously). He is an emeritus member of the DeMolay International Supreme Council and a recipient of the DeMolay Grand Cross and DeMolay Legion of Honour. He was elected honourary Grand Master of DeMolay International in 2009. In 2006, he was presented the Imperial Potentate's Award of Merit, which is the highest honour in the Shriners fraternity. He is a recipient of the Knights Templar Grand Cross, and is a 33rd degree Scottish Rite Mason Inspector General Honorary, and recipient of the Grand Cross of Honour, awarded by the Scottish Rite Supreme Council of Freemasonry, Southern Jurisdiction. Mr. Jones Masonic affiliations include Egypt Shriners, Hillsborough Lodge #25, F. & A.M., Tampa York Rite, Tampa Scottish Rite, Red Cross of Constantine, Order of Quetzalcoatl, Royal Order of Jesters and National Sojourners. He is survived by two sons, Steve Jones (Susan), and Brian Jones; four grandchildren, Jerod, Jessica, Valerie, and Ryan, and one great-grandchild, Owen.



It warms my heart to see how we as Shriners support our Shrine family and keep our Honoured Ladies special.







The Importance of Lawn Mower Safety

Shriners Hospitals Wants Kids to Stay Safe

Shriners Hospitals for Children® is committed to helping keep kids safe, and injury-free.

Although they may seem like a common household tool, lawn mowers are one of the most dangerous items in our homes. Thousands of people are hurt while using lawnmowers each year – these injuries can include deep cuts; loss of fingers, toes, and even limbs; burns and broken bones. However, many lawn mower-related injuries can be prevented by following some safety guidelines.

Lawnmower Usage Safety Tips

Keep Children Safe

- Children under 6 years of age should be kept indoors during mowing.
- Make sure children are a safe distance away from the area you plan to mow because rocks and debris often can shoot out while the lawn mower is running.
- Keep a close eye on children when a lawn mower is in use. Make sure they do not run into the mower's path.
- Never allow children to play with the mower, even when it is turned off. A lawn mower is not a toy.
- Children should be at least 12 years old before operating a walk-behind lawn mower and at least 16 years old to operate a riding mower.
- Never allow children or any other passengers on a riding lawn mower because of the potential for falling under the mower and sustaining serious injuries.

Weather and Terrain

- Do not cut grass when it's wet because it can cause your feet to lose traction and slide.
- Do not use a mower on hills or slopes, to avoid having it tip over and cause injury.

Prior to Mowing

- Read your mower's instruction manual and familiarize yourself with the product prior to use.
- Use a mower with a control that stops it from moving forward if the handle is released.
- Clear your lawn of items such as nails, sticks, rocks, toys, sports entertainment, dog bones, wire and equipment parts, so the debris does not cause damage or hurt anyone.

During Usage

- Wear close-fitting long pants and long-sleeved shirts, eye protection and heavy gloves.
- Do not wear sandals or be barefoot. Wear sturdy shoes with good traction.
- Do not wear jewelry.
- Always fill and start lawn mowers outdoors.
- Never fill the tank with gasoline when the lawn mower is on or hot.
- Do not remove safety devices or guards on switches.
- Never reach underneath a mower because the blade remains engaged even when it is shut off.
- Do not mow in reverse unless absolutely necessary.
- To remove debris from mower use a stick or broom handle, not your hands.
- Always shut off the engine before leaving the mower unattended.
- Stay away from the engine cowling, as it can become very hot and burn unprotected flesh.
- Wait for blades to stop completely before crossing gravel roads, unclogging the chute, or removing the grass catcher.
