

During the Election and Installation weekend I was asked a number of questions with regard to protocol, some of which could be called unwritten rules but others are part of Shrine Protocol from Shriners International. It was suggested that I share a couple of these items so here are a couple of excerpts and suggestions. "Shriners International has adopted the fez as the exclusive type of head covering to be worn by all Nobles". "The fez is not a display case or bulletin board". "Not more than two pins or clasps, without supplemental embellishments, may be used to secure the tassel in place". It is advisable that Temples adopt a procedure whereby all fezzes are ordered with the help of the Recorder's office. This will assure the purchase of proper fezzes, as many Nobles are unaware of the legal restrictions.

"A Shrine pin should be worn on the left lapel of a suit coat or jacket. Every Noble is encouraged to wear a Shrine pin when so attired."

All members of the Divan, appointed and elected, Ambassadors, and Club Executives should only be wearing one Potentate's Pin and that is of the present Potentate. Your Jacket is not a billboard. Additional pins such as Club or Unit pins especially on Shrine Walkouts or Club Jackets should be very limited, as executive members; all Nobles look to you for their guidance.

The definition of Potentate from the dictionary is "one who has the power and position to rule; a monarch." As such, within the Shrine, the position of Potentate is one of respect and at no time should there be any disrespect to that position. It should always be honoured.

spectators most shouting welcome. I can hardly wait for next year to attend with a bigger crew and Misty.


November elections went off without a hitch, no hanging chad, no recounts, no Russian interference, or Mountie investigations; all possibly due to the long arm of the law

We are able to use the Club bar room on a limited basis but are unable to host any meetings during the reconstruction process. Our Corporation Management is unable to provide an exact date for the reopening, mostly due to ongoing negotiations with our insurance company and other necessary approvals but in all likelihood, it may extend to the end of February or early March without some much-needed divine intervention.

We must commend our Club and Corporation Executive for not letting a little fire stand in the way of hampering our historic Christmas festivities. Our December Christmas Dinner meeting was held at the fashionable Moose Hall and very well attended. Those attending included our Potentate, Illustrious Sir Thomas Woodrow and First Lady Linda as well as approximately 13 of our Special Ladies. Noble Matt. Thank you for your dedication and hard work. Your






memory will live on in our hearts and minds for a long time.


