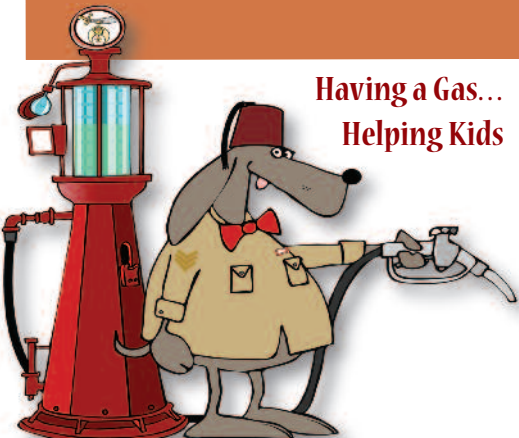

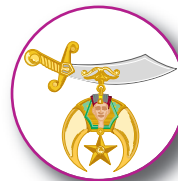

"Shriners International has adopted the fez as the exclusive type of head covering to be worn by all Nobles". "The fez is not a display case or bulletin board". "Not more than two pins or clasps, without supplemental embellishments, may be used to secure the tassel in place". It is advisable that Temples adopt a procedure whereby all fezzes are ordered with the help of the Recorder's office. This will assure the purchase of proper fezzes, as many Nobles are unaware of the legal restrictions.

"A Shrine pin should be worn on the left lapel of a suit coat or jacket. Every Noble is encouraged to wear a Shrine pin when so attired."

All members of the Divan, appointed and elected, Ambassadors, and Club Executives should only be wearing one Potentate's Pin and that is of the present Potentate. Your Jacket is not a billboard. Additional pins such as Club or Unit pins especially on Shrine Walkouts or Club Jackets should be very limited, as executive members; all Nobles look to you for their guidance.

The definition of Potentate from the dictionary is "one who has the power and position to rule; a monarch." As such, within the Shrine, the

position of Potentate is one of respect and at no time should there be any disrespect to that position. It should always be honoured.

There is one gift that you can give to others this year that has the potential to treat the recipient to a little cash all year long - a Shriners cash calendar.

Port Colborne-Welland and District Shrine Club is selling the calendars, along with its traditional fruit cake, shortbread cookies and truffles, as part of its annual holiday fundraiser.

All money collected goes directly into programs funded by the Club which help child burn victims receive specialized treatments and orthopaedic surgeries. Families are also given support in areas such as transportation and travel expenses.

"Shriners look after children regardless of race, colour, creed or religion. Expenses are paid by the Shriners," says Shriner Ralph Tyler.

With the calendar there are 365 chances to win.

"We do a draw every day of the year and names go right back into the draw so, really, people could win more than once," says Shriner Sharon Noiles.

Daily cash prizes are \$25, but on Fridays the prize jumps to \$50 and the last day of the month the Shriners give away \$200.

"So, even if someone wins once they have gotten back the money they put in to buy the calendar," says Noiles.

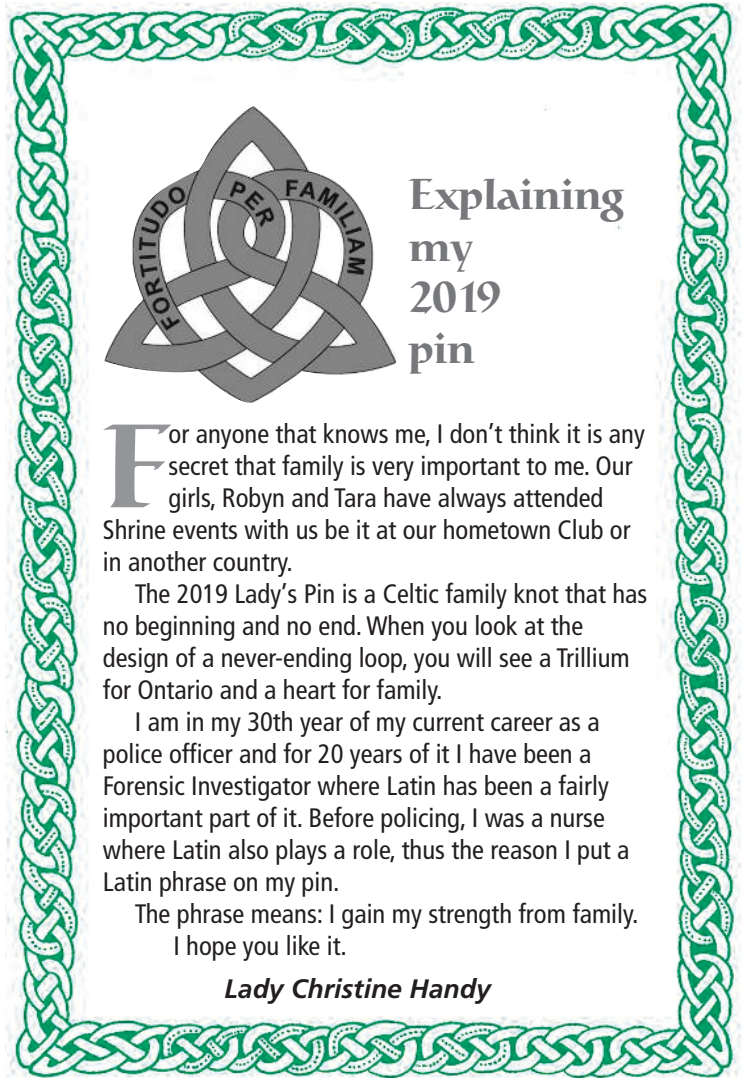

Explaining my 2019 pin

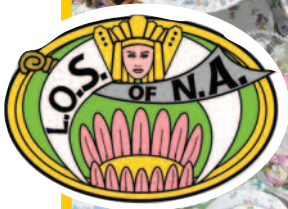

We must commend our Club and Corporation Executive for not letting a little fire stand in the way of hampering our historic Christmas festivities. Our December Christmas Dinner meeting was held at the fashionable Moose Hall and very well attended. Those attending included our Potentate, Illustrious Sir Thomas Woodrow and First Lady Linda as well as approximately 13 of our Special Ladies. 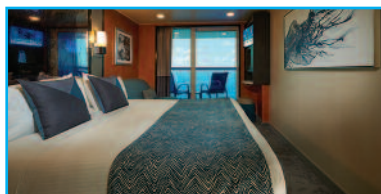
