The year 2025 is special as we celebrate the 100th anniversary of our Canadian Shrine Hospital. Health care has changed over the years, and we rarely keep children in the hospital for extended periods of time anymore. That being said, we can no longer say that we have 22 hospitals, because we now have only 12. What we can say is that we have over 125 locations where we are providing health care service to our kids. Those locations are hospitals, clinics, outreach centers, and affiliations with other children's hospitals. One of locations is the new Rare Bone Disease Clinic at the London Heath Sciences Children's Hospital in London. We are providing specialized Shrine health care services to more kids in more places and closer to home. We still maintain 12 hospitals for the more complex cases and in locations where there is a large demand for our level of care. Our Canadian Shrine Hospital in Montreal is one of those locations. As we celebrate the centennial of our Canadian Shrine Hospital, I remind you that this location is the flagship orthopaedic hospital of the entire Shrine system, providing not only amazing care, but is also home to an extensive research team, and a partner with McGill University to provide education for future doctors. Centennial recognition will kick off with a celebration launch taking place on February 18th, that date representing the date of our first patient visit. The hospital will continue celebrations on May 17th with an open house, and on October 4th with a fundraising gala.

At our installation on January 4th, I outlined to the members present that we need to look at our home. Do Rameses Shriners need a home? I believe that the answer is yes, but I also believe that our home at 124 Queens Plate is more than our current membership can afford. I have initiated a strategic planning committee, with a mandate

The study will look at demographics, geography, and membership growth potential as part of its work to determine the best financially sustainable alternative for Rameses Shriners. A busy year is forthcoming and Peggy and I look forward to sharing time with all of you. Wishing everyone the best for our Shrine year. See you soon and stay safe!



Strategic Planning Committee By Noble Tom Lundy

This is the first report of the newly appointed Strategic Planning Committee.

At Rameses Shriners Installation of Officers on January 4th, 2025, Ill. Potentate John Neil, in his acceptance speech, outlined the key costs of keeping our building. He focused on Property Taxes, Condo Fees, and Insurance, as follows:

- 1. Property taxes of \$62,000 are expected to rise to \$68,000 in 2025 (+9.5%)
- 2. Insurance at \$32,000 is expected to rise to \$33,000 in 2025 (+3%)
- 3. Condo Fees of \$58,000 are expected to rise to \$82,000 (+\$2,000/month)
 - a. Special assessment (not budgeted) of \$125,000 spread over 2024 & 2025.

We estimate that these three line items will account for \$250,000 in our 2025 Rameses Temple Shrine Club Expense Budget.

Ill. Sir John also announced the appointment of a Strategic Planning Committee to develop a financially sustainable solution for Rameses Temple:

Chair: Noble Tom Lundy, High Priest & Prophet
Deputy Chair: Noble Michael Webb, Assistant Rabban
Consultant, Real Estate: Noble Jeff Laceby, Tecumseh Shrine Club

To this Steering Team, we added two ad hoc members from Laceby Real Estate:

- Noble Mike Laceby, Board Member, Montreal Hospital
- Bro. Ross Pollock, Junior Deacon, Sunnylea Lodge No. 510

We need to clear the air around the stigma of Binder Fees. It is NOT a cash cow for the organizing Shrine Club. The binder fee was designed for and used for the cost of the parade. There is a significant cost in planning, organizing, and holding a parade on City/Town streets. We experience fees for insurance, city lawyers, city permits, and city workers on overtime, street closures, barricades, security, and police expenditures. Just to get a street closure permit, organizers require all three levels of First Responders approval. It would be nearly impossible to collect a fee from all parade participants, so the only mechanism we have is to add the binder/registration fee to the 2025 registration website, remember the binder fee pays the cost to hold a community parade for all to enjoy.
